WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the

Admiralty, dated the 6th day of November, 1929 (N.P. (1) 2607/29), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas under the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924, provision was made subject to certain conditions and restrictions for the increase of certain pensions granted before the 4th day of August, 1914, and, subject to certain further limitations, for the increase of similar pensions granted subsequently to that date to certain pensioners therein referred to:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of August, 1920, the 8th day of December, 1924, and the 25th day of June, 1925, to sanction certain Regulations regarding the increase of pensions to certain pensioners therein specified under conditions

corresponding generally to those laid down in the Pensions (Increase) Acts, 1920 and 1924:

"And whereas under the aforesaid Regulations the expression 'married person' is defined as including 'a widower or widow with one or more children under 16 years of age dependent on him or her,' and the terms 'child' and 'children' are defined as including 'a step-child or step-children of the pensioner':

"And whereas we are of opinion that the terms 'child' and 'children' for the purpose of the Pensions Increase Regulations should include 'children adopted under the provisions of the Adoption of Children Act, 1926':

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the amendment of the aforesaid Regulations accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Merchant Shipping (Equivalent Provisions) Act, 1925 (15 and 16 Geo. 5, c. 37) that where His Majesty is satisfied that (a) ships of a foreign country are required by the law of that country to comply with any provisions which are substantially the same as or equally effective with any provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts which apply to foreign ships while they are within a port of the United Kingdom; and (b) that country has made or has undertaken to make provisions for the exemption of British ships, while they are within a port of that country, from the corresponding requirements of the law of that country, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that any such provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts as aforesaid shall not apply to any ship of that country within a port of the United Kingdom if it is proved that the ship complies with the corresponding provision of the law of that country applicable to that ship:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that Italian ships are required by the law of that country to comply with provisions which are substantially the same as or equally effective with those in the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to the survey and general equipment

of passenger steamers and with such of the provisions of the Act and of the Regulations made thereunder concerning emigrant ships as relate to survey; equipments; number of, and accommodation for, passengers; provisions, water and medical stores; dangerous goods and carriage of cattle; medical officer, staff and crew; and regulations as to steerage passengers which apply to foreign ships while they are within a port in the United Kingdom and that that country has made provision for the exemption of British ships while they are within a port of that country from the corresponding requirements of the law of that country:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts relating to passenger steamers and emigrant ships as aforesaid shall not apply to any Italian ship within a port in the United Kingdom if it is proved that the ship complies with the corresponding provisions of the law of that country applicable to that ship.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Passenger Steamers and Emigrant Ships) Italian Ships Order, 1929.

**WHEREAS** the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of July, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields and the Benefice of Endell Street, Christ Church, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Saint Giles in the Fields and Endell Street, Christ Church, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields is now full, the Reverend Wilfred Harold Davies being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Endell Street, Christ Church, is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Wilfred Harold Davies has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Endell Street, Christ Church, now belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields and the said Benefice of Endell Street, Christ Church, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of ‘The Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields’ (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice).

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Giles in the Fields shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Saint Giles in the Fields shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Wilfred Harold Davies if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in Christ Church, Endell Street, shall be transferred to the Church of Saint Giles in the Fields but the marriage registers in duplicate current at Christ Church, Endell Street, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect Christ Church, Endell Street, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which such Church shall be built, and towards the endowment of such Church and District.

(c) That the font, communion table, sacramental plate, bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of Christ Church, Endell Street, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any articles not so transferred shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be transferred to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles that shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of Christ Church, Endell Street, as aforesaid.

" 6. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Giles in the Fields.

" 7. That upon the union taking effect the endowment fund now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Endell Street, Christ Church, shall be divided and apportioned as follows that is to say (a) a portion of such fund sufficient to produce an income of £50 per annum shall be held and accumulated by the said Governors for and towards the endowment of the hereinbefore mentioned proposed new Church and District and (b) the remainder of such fund shall be held by the said Governors for the benefit of the United Benefice but the income arising therefrom shall be applicable only towards the cost of providing clerical or lay assistance for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of Christ Church, Endell Street, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of Christ Church, Endell Street, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both House of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and

further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of November, 1929, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Archbishop's Residence belonging to the See of Canterbury which is situate in the County of Surrey and is known as Lambeth Palace:

“Whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Archbishop's Residence known as Lambeth Palace, and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

“And whereas the said Archbishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £550 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance

of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Archbishopric of Canterbury:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (testified by his having affixed his signature and Archiepiscopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Archbishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £550 and that as a security for the same the said Archbishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by Deed for a term of 25 years or until the said sum of £550 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Archbishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one twentieth part of the said principal sum of £550 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale; and that such mortgage Deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Cosmo Gordon, now Archbishop of Canterbury, as every succeeding Archbishop of Canterbury, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £550 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be

bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Archiepiscopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Wigan, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 24th day of March, 1871, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, a separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the Parish of All Saints, Wigan, in the said County of Lancaster, and at that time in the Diocese of Chester, but now in the said Diocese of Liverpool, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Andrew, Wigan':

"And whereas the said District of Saint Andrew, Wigan, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Wigan, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that, from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Wigan, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of All Saints, Wigan, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Wigan.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Schemes for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Worstead with the Benefice of Dilham (being part of the United Benefice of Dilham with Honing), and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Crostwight with the Benefice of Honing (being the remaining part of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions of the said Benefices of (1) Worstead and Dilham and (2) Crostwight and Honing duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Worstead and Crostwight are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend Charles William Kershaw, under the authority of a Dispensation and the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing is now vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent

of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Worstead and the part of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing which consists of the said Benefice of Dilham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Worstead with Dilham' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That the said Benefice of Crostwight and the part of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing which consists of the said Benefice of Honing shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"3. That with the consent of the said Charles William Kershaw (testified by his signing this Scheme), the said unions shall take effect upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme and the said Charles William Kershaw if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Worstead or of the said Benefices of Worstead and Crostwight shall cease to be Incumbent of such Benefice or Benefices and shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Worstead with Dilham.

"4. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Worstead shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Worstead with Dilham; (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Crostwight shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight; and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as

to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as to two-thirds of such net proceeds for the benefit of the United Benefice of Worstead with Dilham and as to the remaining one-third of such net proceeds for the benefit of the United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight.

" 5. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Worstead with Dilham from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to such United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing shall have the first turn and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Worstead shall have the second and the third turns.

" 6. That after the said unions have taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patron of the said Benefice of Crostwight and the Patron of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing alternately, the Patron of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Crostwight having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" 7. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) a portion of the endowment and property of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing namely all those Tithe Rent charges commuted at £163 6s. 9d. arising within the Parish of Dilham and now or formerly payable to the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing together with all capital sums of money, stocks, securities and other property being or representing the produce of any sale, redemption or other conversion of any of such Tithe Rent charges and also all Glebe land situate within the Parish of Honing and at present belonging to the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Worstead with Dilham and (b) all other the endowment and property of the said United Benefice of Dilham with Honing shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Honing with Crostwight.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, and of the New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth, both in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 27th day of November, 1875, and published in the London Gazette on the 7th day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate in the Parish of Bishopwearmouth, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council bearing date the 12th day of December, 1904, and published in the London Gazette on the 13th day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named 'The District of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth':

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, and of the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth, and (secondly) all that portion of the

said Parish of Bishopwearmouth, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

*"The First Schedule.*

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, and to be restored to the Parish of Bishopwearmouth, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, which is bounded upon the northwest and upon the west by the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, at a point in the middle of Tunstall Road opposite to the western end of the wall or fence which divides the house and premises known as Bishopwearmouth Rectory from the house and premises known as Number 1, Creswell Villas, and extending thence eastward to and along such wall or fence for a distance in all of 2½ chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of the roadway leading northward into Tunstall Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of such roadway for a distance in all of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tunstall Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bishopwearmouth, from the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth.

"All that portion of the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth, which is bounded upon the north by the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth, from the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth, at the junction of Mount Road with the road called Etrick Grove, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Etrick Grove for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence forming the northern boundary of Barnes Park, and extending thence north eastward to and along such fence for a distance in all of 28 chains

or thereabouts to its eastern end, and continuing thence north eastward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Barnes Park Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of Barnes Park Road for a distance of 4¼ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Mount Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Bishopwearmouth from the said New Parish of Saint Gabriel, Bishopwearmouth."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Theodoré, Bishop of Winchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Ashe and Deane duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Winchester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Winchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Ashe and Deane are now full, the Reverend Leighton Brooke Barnett being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ashe and the Reverend Arthur James William Howell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Deane:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Theodoré, Bishop of Winchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ashe and the said Benefice of Deane shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ashe with Deane' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Deane shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ashe and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as to one moiety thereof for the benefit of the Benefice of Hordle situate in the said Diocese of Winchester and as to the other moiety of such net proceeds for the benefit of the Benefice of Milford on Sea, situate in the same Diocese of Winchester.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Ashe having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Deane having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"5. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges Glebe lands and all other the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the three Benefices of Hedge End, Saint John the Evangelist; Southampton, Saint Peter; and Southampton, Saint Paul, all in the said Diocese of Winchester with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned, that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Hedge End, Saint John the Evangelist; (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £50 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Southampton, Saint Peter, and (3) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £70 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Southampton, Saint Paul; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Hedge End, Saint John the Evangelist; Southampton, Saint Peter, and Southampton, Saint Paul, respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any

Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any Deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex to the said Benefices of Hedge End, Saint John the Evangelist; Southampton, Saint Peter, and Southampton, Saint Paul, or any of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Winchester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for all or any of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in every case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

(2) To provide for the payment by the Board to the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire of the sum of £2,000 to be expended on the reconstruction and repair of the road from Slaidburn to Bentham which passes to the west of the Stocks reservoir, and to empower the Board to borrow that sum.

(3) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the district of the Board as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;
