WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of November, 1929 (C.W. 10421/29), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, and other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Section VII of Schedule V to Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to make provision for the grant of Unemployed Pay to Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces of certain ranks when unemployed except at their own request or in consequence of misconduct:

"And whereas we may nevertheless from time to time desire to relegate an Officer to the unemployed list for reasons not amounting to misconduct, but of such a nature as to render the grant of Unemployed Pay unjustifiable:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to empower us, at our discretion, to discharge an Officer forthwith to half-pay, without an intervening period on Unemployed Pay, otherwise than on account of misconduct or at the Officer's own request.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of December, 1929 (C.W. 10132/29), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, to approve regulations for the grant of pensions and gratuities to the widows, and of allowances to the children and other dependent relatives, of deceased Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces and Coast Guard Service:

"And whereas, under the aforesaid regulations, the re-employment in a service capacity of an Officer in time of war or emergency after his removal from the Active List may confer upon his widow, in certain circumstances, the benefit of a pension at the ordinary rate for which she would not otherwise have been eligible, and if her husband held higher substantive rank during re-employment, may entitle her to the higher rate in respect of such rank:

"And whereas the children of such Officers may similarly be eligible for allowances to which they would not otherwise be entitled, or

for allowances at a higher rate:

"And whereas we consider that the reemployment of an Officer after his removal from the Active List in any future war or emergency should not confer any benefit on his widow and children, unless his death be attributable to the conditions of his service:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to provide that in the event of Retired Officers being re-employed in a service capacity in any future war or emergency, their widows and children shall not be eligible for pensions or allowances at the ordinary rate, unless the marriage shall have taken place before the date of the Officer's removal from the Active List, and that the eligibility of such widows and children for pensions or allowances, and the rate of pension or allowance to be awarded, shall be determined, in accordance with the rules laid down in the Schedule to Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1925, by the rank, service and seniority of the Officer on the Active List.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Section III of Schedule V to Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to sanction, inter alia, the grant of full pay at the rate of £2 a day to 1st Quartermasters of Your Majesty's Marine Force holding the rank of Lieutenant Colonel:

"And whereas we consider that Officers holding this rank should receive an increase of full pay on attaining three years' seniority as

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the grant of full pay at the standard rate of £2 4s. a day to Lieutenant Colonels (Quartermaster) of Your Majesty's Marine Force on attaining three years' seniority in the rank, this rate to be subject to revision at the same dates and in the same manner as the rates of full pay authorized by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS on the 20th day of January,
1914, an International Convention for
the safety of Life at Sea, and for purposes
incidental thereto, was duly entered into by
His Majesty and the other Signatory Powers
more especially referred to and set out in the
said Convention:

And whereas a Statute 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 50, intituled "An Act to make such amendments of the law relating to Merchant Shipping as are necessary or expedient to give effect to an International Convention for the safety of Life at Sea" (being the Convention above referred to) was passed on the 10th day of August, 1914, the short title of which is "The Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914":

And whereas by Section 29, Sub-section 5, of the said Act it was provided as follows:-

"This Act shall come into operation on

the 1st day of July, 1915:
"Provided that His Majesty may, by
Order in Council from time to time, postpone the coming into operation of this Act for such period, not exceeding on any occasion of postponement one year, as may be specified in the Order ":

And whereas by divers Orders in Council the coming into operation of the said Act has been from time to time postponed, and now stands postponed, by virtue of an Order in Council of the 20th day of November, 1928, until the 1st day of January, 1930:

And whereas His Majesty deems it expedient that the provisions of the said Act

should be further postponed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with
the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the aboverecited provision and all other powers Him thereunto enabling, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Convention) Act, 1914, shall be postponed from coming into operation until the 1st day of January, 1931.

WHEREAS by the Children Act, 1908 VV (8 E. 7. c. 67), it was, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council under the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840 (2 & 3 Vict. c. 71 and 3 & 4 Vict. c. 84), provide for the establishment of one or more reparate Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District, and for assigning as a division to each such Court such portion of that district as may be specified in the Order:

And whereas by the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the Police Courts thereto-fore established, and to order that a Police Magistrate or Magistrates shall attend regularly at any Police Court or Courts thereafter to be established, either daily or on such days or times as His Majesty, by the advice aforesaid, shall order:

And whereas by divers Orders in Council made under the said Acts such Police Court Divisions as to His Majesty from time to time

has seemed fit have been constituted within the Metropolitan Police District and the extent thereof defined respectively, and such divisions have been assigned to the Police Courts continued or established under the said

And whereas by the Juvenile Courts (Metropolis) Act, 1920, it was, amongst other things, enacted that an Order in Council made under the Children Act, 1908, for the establishment of Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District may, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Act, 1840, provide for such Courts being held elsewhere than in the buildings used as Metropolitan Police Courts, and for every such Court being constituted of a Police Magistrate nominated by the Secretary of State, and two Justices of the Peace for the County of London, of whom one shall be a woman, and both of whom shall be chosen from amongst a panel of such Justices nominated for the purpose by the Secretary of State:

His Majesty is pleased, therefore, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it

is hereby ordered accordingly, that-

(1) Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District shall be established as in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be held in the buildings mentioned in the first column of that Schedule; and divisions shall be assigned to them as described in the second column of the said Schedule.

(2) The said Juvenile Courts shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the said Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by a Secretary of State: provided that a Juvenile Court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision have been held on a day when the Metropolitan Police Courts are closed may be held on the preceding day, or if the preceding day is a Sunday, on the day following.

(3) Each Court shall be constituted of a Police Magistrate nominated by the Secretary of State and of two Justices of the Peace for the County of London, of whom one shall be a woman, and both of whom shall be chosen from amongst a panel of such Justices nominated for the purpose by the

Secretary of State. Provided that a Police Magistrate may sit alone in any case where he considers that it would be impracticable for the Court to he constituted in manner aforesaid, or that it would be inexpedient in the interests of justice to adjourn the business of the Court.

(4) The Justices who are to sit at the several sittings of the Courts aforesaid shall be chosen by the panel, or, if necessary, by the Police Magistrate, and in the case of the absence of the Police Magistrate through illness, leave, or other cause, his place shall be taken by another Police Magistrate, or by a barrister-at-law in practice for at least seven years appointed, or a Justice of the Peace approved, by the Secretary of State.

(5) The Order in Council made on the 26th

June, 1923, is hereby revoked.

This Order shall come into force on the 31st December, 1929.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction within the dominions of the Republic of China:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913 (53 & 54 Vict. c. 37, and 3 & 4 Geo. 5. c. 16), or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Article 227 of "The China Order in Council, 1925," is hereby repealed and the

following article shall be substituted therefor:—

"All fees, fines, penalties, and other sums of money which, under the provisions of this Order or any Regulations or Rules of Court, are stated or imposed in terms of British currency, shall, at the option of the Registrar, be paid either in British gold or in any silver dollar currency in use in China which may from time to time be specified by His Majesty's Minister at Peking, at a uniform rate of exchange, applicable to all such silver dollar currencies, which shall be fixed from time to time for this purpose by His Majesty's Minister in Peking but shall not exceed as a maximum the rate of two shillings for one silver dollar.

"For the purposes of the ascertainment of the value of any income for any purpose of qualification or of any limitation or security, in any case where this Order or any Rule or Regulation contains a reference to British currency, the rate of exchange of ten dollars to the pound sterling shall apply."

- 2. The present Order shall be cited as the China (Amendment) Order in Council, 1929, and shall take effect on the 1st of January, 1930.
- 3. Copies of the present Order shall be exhibited as soon as possible in the office of the Supreme Court for China and at each Provincial Consulate, but failure to comply with the provisions of the present article shall in no way affect the operation of the other provisions of this Order.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of July, 1929, in the words and figures follow-

ing, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Fisherton Delamere and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wylye and (2) an alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Fisherton Delamere and of the Parish of the Benefice of Stockton, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed our request by the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury, pur-suant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the rearrangement of the said three Benefices of Fisherton Delamere, Wylye and Stockton, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Salisbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Fisherton Delamere and Wylye and the transfer of a portion of the said Parish of Fisherton Delamere to the said Parish of Stockton and the terms for effecting such union and alteration of boundaries, and the said Bishop of Salisbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alteration of boundaries which said Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Wylye and Stockton are now full the Reverend

Edward Montagu Parken being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wylye and the Reverend Arthur Goodman being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockton, and the said Benefice of Fisherton Delamere is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Edward Montagu Parken has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Wylye with Fisherton Delamere if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to

"1. That the said Benefice of Fisherton Delamere and the said Benefice of Wylye shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of The United Benefice of Wylye with Fisherton Delamere' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Edward Montagu Parken if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wylye shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wylye shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Fisherton Delamere and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that so much of the net proceeds of such sale as we shall deem sufficient to produce an income of £57 per annum shall be appropriated and held and invested by us for the benefit of the United Benefice and any residue of such net proceeds shall be held and invested by us as to one moiety of such residue for the benefit of the United Benefice and as to the other moiety thereof for the benefit of the said Benefice of Stockton.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Wylye shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Fisherton Delamere shall have the second turn.

" 5. That with the consent of the said Arthur Goodman (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the union taking effect all that portion of the said Parish of Fisherton Delamere which lies to the south of the middle of the River Wylye shall be transferred and

annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the said Parish of Stockton.

"6. That upon the union taking effect all the Tithe Rentcharge, Glebe lands and all other endowments belonging to the said United Benefice or which may hereafter belong to the same United Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Stockton with the clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £100; the same annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be as from the date of the said union taking effect due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockton, and the said annual sum or yearly rentcharge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockton or his representatives on the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal half-yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharge the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stockton and his successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said Benefice of Stockton, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said United Benefice which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then such annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

and whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said: Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Salisbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.
