DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920-1925.
WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY.

(CHARLES CECIL DUTTON.)

Whereas Charles Cecil Dutton, of 105, Main Street, Addingham, Ilkley, in the County of York West Riding, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of offences against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said Charles Cecil Dutton cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain, and in pursuance of the 65-33589

powers conferred on me by No. 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by No. 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Charles Cecil Dutton the authority granted by the said Regulations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons to be in possession of and supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, to manufacture any extract or tincture of Indian hemp, any preparation, and to carry on the business of retailing, dispensing or compounding the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies.

### UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACTS, 1920 TO 1929.

References to the High Court of Justice under Section 10 (1) (proviso ii) of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920.

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of her intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following questions that have arisen in applications made to her for her decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely whether the employment of persons in the following circumstances is or is not employment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920:-

Employment by a hospital as stoker. Employment by H.M. Office of Works as "engineering attendant."

Under the Rules of the Supreme Court, Order LV B. Rule 28, any person who claims to be interested in or affected by the decisions to be given in the above mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The cases have been set down in the High Court, and will be heard in the near future.

### MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

RATING: DEMAND NOTE (LONDON).

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Health, after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, to make regulations, entitled the Form of Demand Note (London) Rules, 1930, for prescribing the form of demand note for a general rate made by a rating authority in London.

And that on account of urgency the Minister of Health, under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, has made Regulations, entitled the Form of Demand Note (London) Rules, 1930, to come into force immediately as provisional regulations, to continue in force until regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that
