The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, power is conferred on His Majesty by Order in Council to declare that Part III of that Act shall apply to any drug of whatever kind in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in Section 8 (1) of the Act if it appears to Him that the drug is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that Di-hydro-morphinone and its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of Di-hydro-morphinone are productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by Section 8 (2) of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare and it is hereby declared that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall henceforth apply to Di-hydro-morphinone and its salts and any preparation, admixture, extract or other substance containing any proportion of Di-hydro-morphinone.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Harold Ernest, Lord Bishop of Newcastle, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

"We, the Right Reverend Harold Ernest, by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Newcastle, do in pursuance of an Act of Parliament of the 1st and 2nd years of the reign of Her late Gracious Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 106, hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

"1. There is in the County of Northumberland and Diocese of Newcastle the Vicarage of Horton the parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 10,177.

The net annual value of the Benefice of Horton is at present £384 and house.

The Patronage of the said Vicarage is vested in the Reverend Canon Obadiah Rhodes, M.A., Vicar of Woodhorn in the said Diocese, and the Reverend John Henry Bates, L.Th., is the present Vicar thereof.

"2. There is in the same County and Diocese the perpetual curacy and titular vicarage of Blyth St. Guthbert the parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 10,500.

The net annual value of the Benefice of Blyth St. Guthbert is at present £380 and house.

The Patronage of the said perpetual curacy and titular vicarage is vested in us the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Newcastle and the Reverend Arthur Tuson, L.Th., is the present Vicar thereof.

"3. There is also in the same County and Diocese the perpetual curacy and titular vicarage of Blyth St. Mary the parish whereof contains according to the last census a population of 15,500.

The net annual value of the Benefice of Blyth St. Mary is at present £410 and house.

The Patronage of the said perpetual curacy and titular vicarage is also vested in us the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Newcastle and the Reverend Charles Frederick Medd, M.A., is the present Vicar thereof.

"4. It appears to us that under the provisions of the said Act 1 and 2 Victoria, Chapter 106, and of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of the same reign, Chapter 49, the following alterations in the contents and boundaries of the above mentioned parishes may advantageously be made.

(a) The separation of a portion of the parish of Blyth St. Cuthbert and the annexation of the same to the parish of Horton.

(b) The separation of two portions of the parish of Blyth St. Mary and the annexation of the same to the parishes of Blyth St. Cuthbert and Horton respectively.

(c) The separation of a portion of the parish of Horton and the annexation of the same to the parish of Blyth St. Mary.

"5. Pursuant to the directions contained in the said 26th section of the said first mentioned Act of Parliament we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the several portions above referred to and the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations may be best effected and how the changes consequent thereupon in respect of Ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, Tithes, Tithe rentcharges and other ecclesiastical dues and payments and in respect of Patronage and the right to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested. And we do hereby submit the same to your Grace together with the consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents and in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith we request that your Grace will be pleased to certify the same and the consents aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"A. It is proposed to add to the parish of Horton that part of the parish of St. Cuthbert Blyth bounded by an imaginary line running from a point on the London and North Eastern Railway Blyth Branch about 30 chains south of the Mile Post immediately south of the Princess Louise Road Bridge and opposite to the middle of Twenty-first Avenue, along the middle of Twenty-first Avenue to its junction with Fourteenth Avenue, thence south along the middle of Fourteenth Avenue to its junction with Twenty-fourth Avenue, thence along the middle of Twenty-fourth Avenue to its junction with Plessey Road, thence in a

straight line to a point on the Parliamentary Boundary coincident with Meggie's Burn, 40 chains or thereabouts east of the Blyth and Tyne Railway, thence west and north along the Parliamentary and Urban District Boundary to the point at which the boundary reaches the road leading to Laverock Hall, and thence continuing in a straight line to the middle of Plessey Road, thence east along the Plessey Road to the London and North Eastern Railway Blyth and Tyne Branch, thence along Carr Street and a passage way at the back of houses on the north side of Plessey Road to the Blyth Branch of the same railway thence north along the railway to the point opposite Twenty-first Avenue shown on the plan hereto annexed marked 'A' and thereon coloured round with a red verge line.

"B. As the Boundary between the parishes of St. Cuthbert and St. Mary Blyth is at present represented by an imaginary line bearing no relation to fixed land marks it is proposed that such boundary shall hereafter be represented by a line drawn from the London and North Eastern Railway Bridge across Princess Louise Road, east along the middle of Princess Louise Road to its junction with Union Street, thence along Union Street to its junction with Waterloo Road thence west along Waterloo Road to its junction with Trotter Street, thence along Trotter Street, continuing in a straight line to the railway immediately adjacent to King Street, along the railway to the east, continuing in a straight line to the river shown on the said plan and thereon coloured round with a purple verge line.

"C. It is proposed that the southern and northern boundaries of the parishes of Blyth St. Mary and Horton respectively shall commence at a point in the middle of the railway (London and North Eastern Blyth Branch) in the centre of the bridge crossing Princess Louise Road, south west along the footpath, leading thence to Cowpen Colliery to the point at the north west corner of the colliery where the path turns north east to Red House, thence north east along the said footpath to and then skirting Red House on the north till it meets the footpath leading from New Delaval to Cowpen, thence north east along the said footpath to meet the present boundary on the west side of Cowpen Cemetery, also shown on the said plan and thereon coloured round with a green verge line, and that the new boundary between the parishes of Horton and Blyth St. Cuthbert, between the points marked 'B' and 'C' on the said plan shall be represented by an imaginary line drawn from the said London & North Eastern Railway Bridge across Princess Louise Road aforesaid and continuing in a south westerly direction along the middle of the said railway Blyth Branch till it meets the present boundary between the said two parishes.

"The Incumbent of the parish to which any such portion or portions of a parish shall be respectively annexed under the provisions of this Scheme shall have the exclusive charge of souls within the limits of such portion or portions of a parish.

"That the fees for marriages churchings and burials and other ecclesiastical dues and offerings arising from the said portion or portions

of a parish shall henceforth belong to the Incumbents of the Benefices to which such portion or portions of a parish shall be respectively annexed.

"That no alteration shall be made as to the Patronage or to any glebe land Tithe or Tithe rentcharge or other endowment of any of the Benefices affected by this Scheme.

"Given under our hand this twentieth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 8th February, 1855, directing the discontinuance of burials in certain places within the City of Canterbury, from the time specified in such Order:

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 8th February, 1855, was varied by Orders in Council of the 26th February, 1897, the 16th February, 1903, the 28th March, 1903, the 25th June, 1903, the 13th April, 1915, and the 6th February, 1925, so far as it affected burials in Canterbury Cathedral:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Orders in Council be further varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council of the 8th February, 1855, 26th February, 1897, 16th February, 1903, 28th March, 1903, 25th June, 1903, 13th April, 1915, and 6th February, 1925, in the grave now existing in the Cloisters of the said Cathedral in which the body of the late Archbishop Lord Davidson has been buried, the burial may be allowed, at her decease, of the body of his widow, subject to the condition that the coffin will be wholly and permanently embedded in and covered with a layer, or layers, of good cement concrete not less in any part than six inches in thickness.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACTS, 1920 TO 1925.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORITY

(JOHN JOSEPH COGHLAN).

Whereas John Joseph Coghlan, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., of 98, Station Road, New Barnet, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Acts:

And whereas the said John Joseph Coghlan cannot, in my opinion, properly be allowed to be in possession of or to supply any of the drugs or preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said John Joseph Coghlan, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and supply raw opium,

coca leaves and Indian Hemp and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said John Joseph Coghlan to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.

THE IMPORTATION OF RAW APPLES
ORDER OF 1930.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the above Order under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 to 1927.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the landing in England or Wales between the 7th July and the 15th November in each year of any raw apples grown in the United States of America unless each consignment is accompanied by a certificate in a specified form, signed by a duly authorised Inspector of the Federal Department of Agriculture.

The certificate prescribed must be delivered to the officer of Customs and Excise with the entry relating to the consignment.

Raw apples landed without the certificates prescribed in the Order must be destroyed at the expense of the importer unless they are re-exported or are disposed of in accordance with the terms of a licence issued by an Inspector of the Ministry.

An Inspector may enter any premises and open, examine and take samples of any raw

apples imported or suspected to have been imported from any country other than Scotland, Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man; any person wilfully obstructing or impeding an Inspector in the exercise of these powers, or failing to comply with the provisions relating to destruction or re-exportation, or with the terms of a licence is liable to a penalty of £10 or, in respect of a second or subsequent offence, to a penalty of £50.
