THE SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES (EXEMPTION) No. 1 Order, 1931, dated 29th January, 1931, MADE BY THE TREASURY UNDER SECTION 10 OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 22).

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5. c. 22), that the Treasury may by Order exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5. c. 47), as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for such period as may be specified in the Order, any article in respect of which the Board of Trade are satisfied on a representation made by a consumer of that article that the article is not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of that article for the time being in the United Kingdom, and that there is no reasonable probability that the article will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

And whereas the Board of Trade are satisfied on representations made by consumers of

the articles specified in the Schedule to this Order that those articles are not made in any part of His Majesty's Dominions in quantities which are substantial having regard to the consumption of those articles for the time being in the United Kingdom and that there is no reasonable probability that those articles will within a reasonable period be made in His Majesty's Dominions in such substantial quantities:

Now therefore we, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in pursuance of the powers conferred on us by the said Section 10 of the Finance Act, 1926, and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf hereby order as follows:

- 1. Such of the articles mentioned in the Schedule to this Order as are not entered under the Customs Acts before the day of February 3rd, 1931, or which have not been removed from a bonded warehouse before that date, shall be exempt from the duty imposed by Section one of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, as amended by the Finance Act, 1926, for a period ending on the 31st day of December, 1931.
- 2. This Order may be cited as the Safe-guarding of Industries (Exemption) No. 1 Order, 1931.

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain) HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that they PROPOSE TO VARY the Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Workers set out in their Notices Q(30) and Q(33) dated 16th May, 1925 and 21st October, 1926, respectively.

pipes for ancillary purposes; to empower the Corporation to make regulations in regard to the construction and placing of pipes, etc., between mains and meters; to provide for the establishment of offices and show-rooms; to make provision as to charges for the supply of gas where the consumer has a separate supply; to relieve the Corporation from obligation to supply gas in such circumstances as may be defined in the Order; to make provision as to the mode of cutting off supplies of gas; to require anti-fluctuators to be used with gas engines; to require the provision of valves where high pressure air or other gas is used in connection with the supply of gas; to make provision as to the exemption of fittings let by the Corporation from distress or landlord's remedy for rent etc.; to empower the Corporation to refuse to supply gas to persons in debt for other premises; to provide for the payment of expenses in relation to the reconnection of a discontinued supply; to provide for the removal of fittings where a gas supply is discontinued; to empower the Corporation to enter premises to which a supply of gas is provided for the inspection of gas apparatus and for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of gas consumed; to require gas consumers to give notice to the Corporation before removing; to make provision in regard to notice of discontinuance of a supply of gas; to compel gas consumers to repair gas apparatus in cases of danger; to empower the Corporation to prevent the improper use of gas; to make provision as to the inspection and testing of meters; to prescribe the period of error in defective meters; to make provision as to the charge to be demanded by the Corporation in respect of gas supplied by means of prepayment meters; to enable the Corporation to levy and recover charges for special readings of meters; to require the Corporation to pay interest on money deposited as security for gas meter, etc.; to make provision as to the service of demand notes for amounts payable in respect of the supply of gas; to empower the Corporation to contract for the supply and purchase of gas in bulk; to authorise the Corporation to take licences for use of patents.

4. To empower the Corporation to borrow money for the costs of the Order and generally for the purposes of their gas undertaking, including the provision of working capital; to make provision in regard to the borrowing and re-borrowing and repayment of moneys so borrowed, and to enact other financial provisions, including provisions as to the formation, maintenance and application of sinking funds, and for regulating the application of the revenue derived from the gas undertaking of the Corporation.

5. To incorporate and apply with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871, the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 and 1929, the Public Health Act, 1875, the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925, and any Acts amending the same, and the Local Loans Act, 1875, and to repeal, alter, amend, or re-enact all or any of the provisions of the Abergavenny Improvement Act, 1860, and any other Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Corporation.

Any local or other public authority, company, or person desiring to bring before the
