**W**HEREAS by subsection (1) of Section one of the Census Act, 1920, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of that Act, His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time direct that a Census shall be taken for Great Britain, and any Order so made may prescribe the date of such Census, the persons by whom and with respect to whom the returns for the purpose of such Census are to be made and the particulars to be stated in the returns:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of subsection (1) of Section one of the Census Act, 1920, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Census Order, 1931.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) In this Order "prescribed" means prescribed by regulations made under the Census Act, 1920.

2. A Census shall be taken on the 26th day of April, 1931 (hereinafter called "the Census day"), with respect to all persons in Great Britain who are alive at midnight ending that day.

3. The returns for the purpose of the Census shall be made with respect to the classes of persons mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule to this Order by the persons

specified opposite each such class in the second column of that Schedule:

Provided nevertheless that any person claiming in the prescribed manner to make a confidential return shall, subject to the prescribed conditions, be deemed to be the person by whom the return is to be made with respect to himself.

4. The returns shall state—

(a) in the case of all persons with respect to whom returns are to be made in England and Wales, the particulars specified in Part I of the Second Schedule to this Order;

(b) in the case of all persons with respect to whom returns are to be made in Scotland, the particulars specified in Part II of that Schedule; and

(c) in the case of all persons with respect to whom returns are to be made in Wales (including Monmouth), the additional particulars specified in Part III of that Schedule.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

*Persons with respect to whom Returns are to be made.*

1. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day in a dwelling, lodgings or rooms, separately occupied by any private household of which they are members, guests (including paying guests or boarders), or employees.

2. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of any hotel, club, boarding-house or common or other lodging-house.

3. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of any public or private hospital, sanatorium, convalescent or nursing home, workhouse, poor-house, infirmary, asylum, religious or charitable community, residential school or college, or residential institution of any other kind.

4. Persons belonging to the naval, military, or air forces of the Crown, and any other persons, present at midnight ending the Census day on any vessel or in any barracks, station, or other premises under naval, military, or air force discipline.

5. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on any ship, boat, barge, or other vessel in any inland waters or engaged in any coast-wise or fishing voyage, or lying moored or anchored in any place.

6. Persons present at midnight ending the Census day on the premises of any civil prison, lock-up or other place of detention.

7. Persons who, not having been enumerated elsewhere for the purpose of the Census, arrive at any of the places or premises above mentioned after midnight ending the Census day and before the returns in respect of persons present on or in such premises or places are required to be delivered up.

8. Persons not included among any of the classes of persons above mentioned.

*Persons by whom Returns are to be made.*

1. The head, or person for the time being acting as the head, of the household.

2. The manager or other person for the time being in charge of the premises.

3. The chief resident officer or other person for the time being in charge of the institution.

4. The officer or other person appointed for the purpose in pursuance of arrangements made by the Admiralty, Army Council, or Air Council.

5. The captain, master, or other person for the time being in charge of the vessel.

6. The governor or other person for the time being in charge of the premises.

7. The person specified above as the person by whom the returns are to be made with respect to the persons present at midnight ending the Census day on or in any of the premises or places above mentioned.

8. The person with respect to whom the return is to be made.

Whereas the Agricultural Wages Committee for the area comprising the administrative counties of Bedford and Huntingdon have, in pursuance of the above Act, duly cancelled the minimum and overtime rates of wages fixed by them and made effective by an Order of the Agricultural Wages Board dated 7th May, 1929, and have duly fixed minimum and overtime rates of wages for workers employed in agriculture for time work in that area and the said rates are set out in the Schedule to this Order. Now the Agricultural Wages Board, in pursuance of the said Act and for the purpose of carrying out the decision of the said Committee hereby cancel as from 28th March, 1931, the said Order of 7th May, 1929, and hereby Order that the provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall become effective from 29th March, 1931.

(a) All employment in excess of 5½ hours on a Saturday or on such other day (not being Sunday) in every week as may be agreed between the employer and the worker.

(b) All employment on a Sunday, Easter Monday, Whit Monday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(c) All employment in excess of 41 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the weeks in which Easter Monday and Whit Monday fall.

(d) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in summer.

(e) All employment in excess of 31 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day and Boxing Day fall.

(f) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are to be treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Saturday in October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

This Order shall continue in operation until 27th February, 1932.

(e) All employment in excess of 32 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day and Boxing Day fall.

(f) All employment in excess of 50 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

For the purpose of this Order employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on 19th April, 1931, and terminating on 3rd October, 1931, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.

This Order shall come into operation on 26th March, 1931, and continue in force until 26th March, 1932.

(e) All employment in excess of 39½ hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment) in the week in which Christmas Day falls.

(f) All employment in excess of 48 hours (excluding all hours which are treated as hours of overtime employment) in any other week in winter.

2. In the case of female workers:—

(a) All employment on Sunday.

(b) All employment in excess of 8 hours on any other day.

For the purpose of this Order, employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and ending on the Saturday before the first Sunday in November and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the remainder of the year.

The Worcestershire Agricultural Wages Committee in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the Agricultural Wages (Regulation) Act, 1924, and the Regulations made thereunder, do by this Order, vary as from 1st March, 1931, their Order of 22nd January, 1925, defining the benefits or advantages (not being benefits or advantages prohibited by law) which may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash for the purpose of the application of any minimum rate of wages fixed by the said Committee for the area comprising the administrative county of Worcester which for the purposes of the said Act, shall be deemed to include the city and county borough of Worcester; but to exclude the parishes of Alderminster, Shipston-on-Stour, Tidmington and Tredington which shall be deemed to be included in the administrative county of Warwick, and the parishes of Blockley, Cutsdean, Daylesford and Evenlode, which shall be deemed to be included in the administrative county of Gloucester so as to provide that such benefits or advantages and the values at which they are to be so reckoned shall be as follows:—

(a) Cottage, including any garden provided with the cottage, 3s. per week less any rent or rates which may be paid by the occupier.

The value set out above shall not apply to any cottage with regard to which the Agricultural Wages Committee on an application by or on behalf of the worker shall at any time

(1) certify that the cottage is defective by reason of inadequate accommodation, want of repair or sanitation (including water supply), and is of less value than a cottage which is free from such defects, and

(2) determine the amount by which the value of the cottage occupied is less than the value of such a defect-free cottage, and in that case the value at which the provision of the cottage may be reckoned as payment of wages in lieu of payment in cash shall not exceed 3s. per week, less the amount so determined by the Agricultural Wages Committee, and also less any rent and rates which may be paid by the occupier.

(b) New milk, skimmed milk and separated milk.—Current wholesale prices in the area of the Committee.

(c) Potatoes.—Current wholesale prices in the area of the Committee.
