The following Statute made by the Governing Body of King's College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 31st day of January, 1931, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

A STATUTE to alter a Statute made by the University of Cambridge Commissioners under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, on December 17, 1925, in relation to the King's College of our Lady and Saint Nicholas in Cambridge approved at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for the purpose held on November 25, 1930, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, submitted to the University and declared by Vice-Chancellor not to affect the University within the meaning of Section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and duly made at a further General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College held on January 31, 1931, by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas it appears to us the Provost and Scholars of the said College (being the Governing Body thereof) that it is expedient to alter the said Statute F as shown in the appended print:

Now, therefore, we the Provost and Scholars of the said College in exercise of the powers given us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend Statute F as in the appended print.

F.—SCHOLARSHIPS.

1. There shall be forty-eight Foundation Scholarships in the College, of which twenty-four shall be Eton Scholarships, and twenty-four shall be Open Scholarships. [A Foundation Scholarship to which the holder was elected before entering the College shall be called an Entrance Foundation Scholarship, and a Foundation Scholarship to which the holder was elected after entering the College shall be called a Senior Foundation Scholarship.] Foundation Scholarships held without emoluments under section 22 of this Statute, the Laurence Saunders Foundation Scholarship, and the Vintner Foundation Scholarship, and the Vintner Foundation Scholarship shall not be reckoned among the forty-eight. Additional Foundation Scholarships may be created at any time by vote of the Annual Congregation.

Paragraph 1-

Delete the words in brackets.

- 2. There shall be offered for competition in each year not less than six Eton Foundation Scholarships, of which not less than four shall be offered as Entrance Scholarships, and not less than six Open Foundation Scholarships. Subject to this provision the Council shall settle, in such manner as they think fit, what Foundation Scholarships, Minor Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be offered or awarded, subject to any regulations that may be made by Ordinance. All Entrance Scholarships (other than Eton Scholarships) and Open Exhibitions under this Statute shall be awarded upon the result of an open examination held for the purpose.
- 3. [A Scholarship or Exhibition to which the holder was elected before entering the College shall be tenable in the first instance for two years, but may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods; provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two years, the tenure being in each case reckoned from the first day of the term in which the holder begins residence.]

Delete paragraph 3 and substitute-

- "An Entrance Scholarship or Exhibition shall be tenable in the first instance for two years, reckoned from the first day of the term in which the holder begins residence. A Scholarship or Exhibition awarded after entrance shall be tenable in the first instance for one year."
- 4. [A Senior Foundation Scholarship shall be tenable until the holder completes four years from the 29th day of September next preceding the date of his beginning residence in the University. Such a Scholarship may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case exceed two and a half years.]

Delete paragraph 4 and substitute-

- "A Scholarship or Exhibition may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods; provided that the total period of tenure shall in no case extend beyond seven years in the case of a Scholarship and beyond four and a half years in the case of a Minor Scholarship or an Exhibition from the 25th day of March next preceding the date of the holder's beginning residence in the University."
- 5. [A Minor Scholarship or Exhibition to which the holder was elected after entering the College shall be tenable for one year. But such a Scholarship or Exhibition may be prolonged by the Council for a further period or further periods, provided that the total period of prolongation shall in no case go beyond the completion of four years from the 29th day of September next preceding the date of his beginning residence in the University.]

Delete paragraph 5 and substitute-

"A Scholarship or Exhibition shall be ipso facto vacated by the holder of it on his going out of residence, unless the condition of residence is expressly waived by the Council; but the holder of a Scholarship or Exhibition who vacates it under this section shall be eligible for re-election to it by the Council, subject to the same conditions as to tenure as before."

- 6. No Scholarship or Exhibition shall be tenable with another Scholarship or Exhibition in the College, or with a Fellowship in any College in the University, or, unless the Council otherwise determine, with any office or emolument in any other College in the University.
- 7. Every candidate for a Scholarship, not being already a member of the College, shall bring a satisfactory certificate of moral character.
- 8. The time and manner of examinations for Scholarships, and the day or days of election and admission thereto, shall from time to time be fixed by the Council.
- 9. The electors to Scholarships and Exhibitions awarded before entrance shall be the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, and two or more Fellows to be appointed annually by the Council, who may also appoint any examiners to assist the electors; and the electors to Scholarships and Exhibitions awarded after entrance shall be the members of the Council, unless the Governing Body determine otherwise by Ordinance.
- 10. The manner of electing to Scholarships and Exhibitions and all proceedings relating to the election shall be in the discretion of the electors; provided that no candidate shall be elected a Scholar without the concurrence of at least one half of the electors present, the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost, or in the absence of both the senior elector present, having a second or casting vote in case of an equality of votes; provided also that no person shall vote at an election to Entrance Scholarships who has not taken part in the examination for the same.
- 11. The electors shall not be bound to elect to a Scholarship or Exhibition any candidate whom they shall not consider of sufficient merit for election, and they shall have power to require from any candidate a declaration that he intends to devote himself to the studies of the University during the whole of the time preceding his admission to his first degree, or such other declaration as to his intention as they may think desirable.
- 12. Every candidate elected to a Scholarship shall be admitted a Scholar by the Provost, or in his absence the Vice-Provost. The emoluments of a Scholarship awarded before entrance shall begin when the Scholar begins residence, those of a Scholarship awarded after entrance from the time of his election, subject to any custom of reckoning from a quarter day. [provided that no holder of a Scholarship awarded before entrance shall, upon election to a Senior Scholarship, be required to be again admitted a Scholar.]

Paragraph 12— Delete the words in brackets.

- 13. The Council shall from time to time make such regulations as they shall think proper with respect to the residence and studies of Scholars; and any Scholar who shall fail to conform to such regulations, or shall not make reasonable progress in his studies, may be deprived by the Council of his Scholarship, or of the whole or part of the emoluments of the same.
- 14. Every Scholar shall proceed to his degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Laws, or to some equal degree at his regular time, except

with the approval of the Council, given for illness or other grave cause, and any Scholar failing so to proceed may be deprived of his Scholarship by the Council.

15. The Scholarships awarded before entrance shall be open only to candidates who have not commenced residence in the University, and who before the commencement of the month in which the examination begins have not attained the age of nineteen years, or such less age as may be determined by Ordinance. It shall however be open to the Council to offer one Scholarship in each year without age limit. Eton Entrance Scholarships or Exhibitions shall be open only to candidates who were members of Eton School, whether on the foundation or not, within three months of the commencement of the academical year in which the examination is held. The age limits of candidates for Exhibitions shall be in accordance with regulations made by authority of the Governing Body.

16. The Open [Senior] Foundation Scholarships shall be open to all resident members of the College who have not completed four years from the 29th day of September next preceding the date of their commencing residence in the University. The Eton [Senior] Foundation Scholarships shall be open, under the same conditions, to resident members of the College who have been educated at Eton School, whether on the foundation or not. Minor Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be awarded after entrance subject to such regulations as to eligibility and tenure as may be made from time to time by the Governing Body.

Paragraph 16-

Delete word in brackets (line 6) and insert after Scholarships "awarded after entrance."

17. Whenever any Foundation Scholarship offered for competition is not awarded the electors may elect a properly qualified candidate to a Minor Scholarship or Exhibition over and above those offered for competition at that time, in place of the Foundation Scholarship not awarded; and whenever a Minor Scholarship offered for competition is not awarded an additional Exhibition may similarly be awarded in its place; provided that an Open award be only replaced by an Open award and an Eton award by an Eton award.

18. The conditional emoluments of [an Entrance] Foundation Scholarship, or of a Senior Foundation Scholarship, shall be such sum not exceeding £70; the conditional emoluments of a Minor Scholarship shall be such sum not exceeding £45; and the total emoluments of an Exhibition shall be such sum not exceeding £40 as the Governing Body shall from time to time determine.

Paragraph 18-

Delete the words in brackets and substitute "a" in line 1.

19. The unconditional emoluments of a Scholar shall consist of rooms in College free during term and the Long Vacation or in lieu of free rooms, a sum not exceeding £10 a term during residence, plus the amount due to the College for rent during any period of the Long

Vacation during which he may be in residence. These unconditional allowances shall be made in respect of a maximum period of four years' residence.

20. The conditional emoluments of Scholars who have not been admitted, or are not qualified to be admitted to the title of a degree in the University and the whole of the emoluments of Exhibitioners shall be payable only if the pecuniary circumstances of the Scholar or Exhibitioner and his family are such as are held by the College to justify such payment. The award of such conditional emoluments and of the conditional emoluments of Scholars who have been admitted, or are qualified to be admitted, to the title of a degree in the University shall be in the hands of the Council, who may review the emoluments of all Scholarships and Exhibitions at any time taking into consideration any changes in the financial position of the holders. The Council however shall not take account, in fixing the emoluments of a scholar, of a University Scholarship specified by the University Intercollegiate Advisory Committee on Scholarships to be of particular distinction, or of University or College prizes.

21. When a Scholar or Exhibitioner (other than a holder of one of the Scholarships or Exhibitions provided under section 26 below) has waived under section 22 or is held not to be entitled to receive the full amount of the emoluments, the sum constituting the difference between the full amount and the amount paid to him shall be paid into a special fund to be called the Supplementary Scholarship Fund and shall be used towards covering the cost of the remissions and grants referred to in section 23 below, or in making grants to persons engaged in research, or otherwise for the furtherance of research. Provided ·that this payment shall not be made in the case of a Scholar or Exhibitioner who has completed four years from the 29th day of September next preceding the date of his beginning residence in the University, or has satisfied the conditions of paragraph 24 (ii) (b) below.

22. When a candidate for Scholarships or Exhibitions shall signify to the Provost that he does not wish to receive the emoluments of the same if elected thereto he may, if properly qualified, be elected to a Scholarship or Exhibition without emolument, which shall not be counted in the number of the Scholarships or Exhibitions provided for in the foregoing sections of this chapter. When an election of such a candidate has been made the amount of the emolument to which he would have been entitled if he had been elected otherwise than under the provisions of this section shall be paid into the Supplementary Scholarship Fund except as provided in section 26 below. holder of a Scholarship or Exhibition may resign the emolument of his Scholarship or Exhibition and hold a Scholarship or Exhibition without emolument, which shall not be counted in the number of Scholarships or Exhibitions provided for in this Statute.

23. It shall be open to the College by remissions of fees, to be charged against the Supplementary Scholarship Fund, and by grants from the same Fund, to give assistance in case of need to Scholars or Exhibitioners, beyond the maximum emoluments of their awards; but such assistance shall in no case be

given unless the Council is satisfied that every effort has been made to secure adequate assistance for the student from sources outside the University; and the pecuniary value of such assistance shall not be specified in any notice of competition for Scholarships or Exhibitions.

24.—(i) Save as hereinafter provided no payment of any emolument shall be made to any person in statu pupillari, not being a Fellow of the College, from the general revenues of the College or from any fund under the control of the College, unless it is held to be justified by his financial circumstances. In fixing any such payment heed shall be paid to any general principles that may be laid down by the University Intercollegiate Advisory Committee on Scholarships.

(ii) The following emoluments may be paid to persons in statu pupillari without regard to their financial circumstances:

(a) the Rooms Allowance of Scholars

hereinbefore mentioned;

(b) the emoluments of any Scholarship or Studentship held by a person who has been admitted or is qualified to be admitted to the title of a degree and who satisfies the Council that he intends to pursue a course of advanced study or research;

(c) the emolument of any Studentship held by any person who has been admitted as a Research Student in the University;

- as a Research Student in the University;
 (d) prizes awarded for success in any examination or competition of the College or University, provided that in the case of prizes not charged upon any trust or special fund in consequence of a gift for the purpose not more than £10 may be awarded in money to any person in respect of any one examination or competition;
- (e) emoluments payable out of any trust fund which by the direction of the donor, so long as his direction is legally binding on the College, or by regulations made for the time being by any legally competent authority other than the College, are required either expressly or by necessary implication to be paid without regard to financial circumstances, or if the application to them of the rule contained in the foregoing section is clearly incompatible with the objects of the trust.
- (f) Payments for services rendered, or payments made under Statute H.
- 25. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Statute, the Governing Body may from time to time make regulations reducing the periods of eligibility to Scholarships and of the tenure of Scholarships in the case of Research Students and Affiliated Students, and any other students who are under special regulations with regard to the period of residence required for a degree.
- 26. There shall be established the following Scholarships and Exhibitions endowed from Trust Funds:
 - (i) A Vintner Foundation Scholarship to be awarded for proficiency in Natural Science, of which the emoluments shall be paid from the net income of Dr. Vintner's legacy.

(ii) A Laurence Saunders Foundation Scholarship of which the emoluments shall be paid from the net income of the Laurence Saunders Scholarship Fund. (iii) Two Price Minor Scholarships of which the emoluments shall be paid from the net income of the Purefoy Price Day and Betham's Funds.

(iv) Three Fielder Exhibitions to be awarded for proficiency in Greek, of which the emoluments shall be paid from the net income of the Fielder Exhibition Fund.

These Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be awarded either at Entrance or as Senior awards on the same terms and conditions in all respects, including emoluments, as other Scholarships and Exhibitions. Except that emoluments withheld from the Scholar or Exhibitioner, under section 21 or 22, shall be added to the capital of the Trust Fund.

If the income of any of the above Funds is deficient, the number of the above awards may be reduced to correspond to the reduction in the available income, or Minor Scholarships may be awarded in lieu of Foundation Scholarships, or Exhibitions in lieu of Minor

Scholarships.

If the net income in any of the above funds exceeds the amounts paid in respect of the Scholars or Exhibitioners out of the fund, the excess may be added to the capital of the fund or may be used for the award of additional Scholarships or Exhibitions on the same terms and conditions as other similar awards.

The above provisions shall apply in lieu of the scheme sanctioned by the Court of Chancery on May 1, 1871, for the future application of the income arising from the Benefactions of Dr. Vintner, Mr. Purefoy, Dr. Price, Mr. Day and Mr. Betham, and notwithstanding the provisions of the Wills of the late Mrs. Catharine Norris and the late Mrs. Laura Mary Fielder.

27. Every person elected to a Scholarship or Exhibition before the day on which this Statute shall come into operation shall hold such Scholarship or Exhibition, and any other Scholarship or Exhibition to which he may be subsequently elected, for the same period and on the same conditions, and the emoluments of such Scholarships or Exhibitions shall be the same as if the Statute under which he was elected had continued in operation.

FACTORY AND WORKSHOP ACTS, 1901 to 1929.

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said David Davidson Watson to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
