# PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from time to time seem necessary with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels, and other vessels, navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain Regulations and Rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 30th day of March, 1914, the 4th day of September, 1918, the 6th day of February, 1925, and the 29th day of March, 1926, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Portland:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such Rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.
- 2. The Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 30th day of March, 1914, as amended by the said Orders in Council dated the 4th day of September, 1918, the 6th day of February, 1925, and the 29th day of March, 1926, is hereby repealed.
- 3. The following Rules shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Port of Portland and shall be read and construed as the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council, dated the 30th day of March, 1914.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

#### RULES.

#### GENERAL.

Observance of "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea."

1. All vessels, when within the limits of the Dockyard Port, shall, except as is otherwise provided in Clauses 2, 3 and 4, carry such lights as are prescribed by the "Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea" made from time to time under the Merchant Shipping Act; and all vessels of every description shall also observe the steering and sailing rules set forth in such Regulations, except in so far as they are affected by the Regulations hereinafter contained.

#### Dredgers.

2. A Dredger when at work or in a position for working shall carry the following Lights and Signals, viz.:—

Lights between Sunset and Sunrise:-

- (a) Forward.—In the forward part of the dredger at a height of not less than 20 and not exceeding 40 feet above the hull, a white light in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile.
- (b) Amidships.—Three such white lights placed in a triangular form at least 8 feet apart, at right angles to the keel and with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be at least 10 feet higher than the forward light and to be also higher than, and clear of the framework, funnels, or other erections upon the dredger. If so moored or working as to make it necessary to prohibit the passage of vessels on one or both sides, a red

light or lights in a lantern so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light visible all round the horizon at a distance of at least one mile, is, or are, to be substituted for the lower light or lights of the triangle on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

(c) Aft.—One such white light at or near the stern of the dredger and at such a height that it shall not be less than 15 feet

lower than the forward light.

Signals between Sunrise and Sunset:—

Amidships.—Three black balls of not less than two feet in diameter placed in a triangular form at least eight feet apart, at right angles to the keel with the apex uppermost, the base of the triangle to be higher than and clear of the framework, funnels or any other erection upon the dredger. If so moored or working as to make it necessary to prohibit passage on one or both sides, a red flag or flags at least five feet in the hoist is, or are, to be

the triangle on the side or sides on which passage is prohibited.

Signal in Fog:-

In fog, mist, falling snow or heavy rain storms a dredger at work or in position for working shall at intervals of not more than one minute sound a gong rapidly for about five seconds.

# Lights for Small Boats.

- 3. Small fishing boats and all other boats of every description at anchor in any part of the Dockyard Port at night, shall exhibit a white light, visible all round at a distance of at least one mile.
- 4. Small fishing boats, and all other boats, sailing or rowing, in any part of the Dock-yard Port at night, shall have ready at hand a white light, and shall exhibit the same on approaching or being approached by any vessel or boat under way.

### Vessels entering the Harbour to have Priority.

5. When any vessel or vessels are about to enter from seaward any of the channels between the breakwaters, no vessel proceeding outward by the same channel shall enter the said channel until the before-mentioned vessel or vessels shall have passed in. Provided that this rule shall not apply when the outgoing vessel is showing either of the signals laid down in Rule 6, when it is the duty of all other vessels to keep out of her way and not to enter the channel. Nevertheless, an incoming vessel shall have priority of passage over an outgoing vessel if both are showing the same signal.

# Vessels to keep clear of H.M. Vessels or other vessels in charge of H.M. Officers.

6. When one of H.M. Vessels or other vessel in charge of H.M. Officers hoists the Red Ensign over M. Flag (International Code—Alphabetical) by day, or a red light by night at the foremast head, denoting that she is under way for the purpose of passing in or out of the harbour, all other vessels under way within the limits of the Dockyard Port shall keep out of the way of the said vessel, provided always that she shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed. When any

vessel is showing the signal denoting that she is under way for the purpose of passing in or out of the Harbour, all other of H.M. Ships present in the port shall as a general warning hoist the Pilot Jack by day, or by night show position lights (two white lights vertical 8 feet apart hoisted at the Peak, or, if no gaff, hoisted abreast the maintop in the middle line of the ship or on the Ensign Staff).

#### Regulations for Vessels crossing the Torpedo Range.

7. Whenever practice with torpedoes takes place a red flag will be hoisted at the firing point and on the 2,000 yards Range Target to warn vessels that practice is taking place within the areas referred to in Clause 18, of the First Schedule. Vessels having occasion to cross the range are to be guided by the positions of the red flag on the 2,000 yards Range Target. If hoisted right up this flag indicates that a torpedo is about to be fired and vessels are not to cross the range; if seen to be low on the flagstaff it shows that the range is clear and can be crossed at any position south of the 2,000 yards Range Target.

#### Marking of Wrecks.

- 8. Should a vessel sink or become a wreck in any part of the Dockyard Port so that an obstruction in a navigable fairway is caused, which in the opinion of the King's Harbour Master it is necessary to mark, such wreck shall be indicated in accordance with the Uniform system of Wreck-Marking off the coasts of the British Isles, as follows:
  - (1) Green shall be the colour for all purconnected  $\mathbf{with}$ Wreck-Marking, namely, for lights, buoys, balls, shapes, wreck-marking vessels, &c.
  - (2) Vessels and buoys shall have the word "WRECK" painted in white letters on their sides.
  - (3) Throughout these regulations the term "Starboard Hand" shall denote that side which would be on right hand of the mariner, either going with the mainstream of the flood or approaching a harbour, river, or estuary from seaward; the term "Port Hand" shall denote the left hand of the mariner in the same circumstances.
  - (4) Shapes and Characteristics of Wreckmarking Buoys.

When a wreck-marking buoy is used, it shall be of one of the following shapes, and (if a light is carried) it shall be lighted in one of the manners following to indicate to the mariner on which hand he should pass the buoy.

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port hand-

Shape.—Can.

Light.—If lighted, a Green Light giving two flashes.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand-

Shape.—Conical. Light.—If lighted, a Green Light giving three flashes.

(c) To be passed on either side— Shape.—Spherical.

Light.—If lighted, a Green Light giving one flash.

Wreck-Marking (5) Characteristics Vessels.

When a wreck-marking vessel is used, it shall carry the lights and shapes and give the sound signals following to indicate to the mariner on which hand he should pass the vessel:-

#### (1) Lights.

- (i) Between sunset and sunrise to carry the following lights:-
  - (a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand-

Two green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a crossyard, the lower light to be of a height not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand-

Three green lights in a vertical line not less than 6 feet apart from the end of a crossyard, the lowest light to be of a height not less than 9 feet above the hull.

(c) To be passed on either side—

Four green lights, two in a vertical line one over the other, not less than 6 feet apart, on each end of a crossyard with a horizontal distance between the lights at either end of the crossyard not less than 15 feet, and not exceeding 25 feet. The height of the two lower lights to be not less than 15 feet above the hull.

(ii) A wreck-marking vessel shall not carry the ordinary riding light for a vessel at anchor.

# (2) Shapes.

Between sunrise and sunset to carry green balls or shapes corresponding in number and arrangement to the green lights as detailed above.

# (3) Sound Signals.

A wreck-marking vessel during fog, mist, falling snow, or heavy rain-storms, whether by day or night, to ring a deeptoned bell at intervals of not more than 30 seconds as follows:-

(a) To be passed on the mariner's Port Hand—

Two strokes in succession.

(b) To be passed on the mariner's Starboard Hand-

Three strokes in succession.

(c) To be passed on either side— Four strokes in succession.

Harbour Channels—when to be kept clear.

9. When it is specially necessary to keep clear any of the channels between the breakwaters because a large number of His Majesty's Ships, or a very large vessel, or a Royal Yacht is entering or leaving the harbour, a red oblong flag with a white diagonal bar from the inner upper corner will be hoisted by day, or three red lights, vertical by night at the flagstaff at "A" Head. By day, while this flag is flying on the Northern arm of the flagstaff at "A" Head of the North-eastern breakwater, no vessel shall enter the North Ship Channel, and while the flag is flying on the Southern arm no vessel shall enter the East Ship Channel, and while it is flying at the masthead no vessel shall enter either channel. By night, while the three red vertical lights are showing at "A" Head no vessel shall enter either channel.

#### Signal Directing Vessels and Boats to Keep Out of the Way.

10. When any seagoing steam vessel, steam vessel towing, steam dredger or steam hopper within the limits of the Dockyard Port shall by reason of the crowded nature of the channel or anchorage or from any other cause find it unsafe or impracticable to keep out of the way of other vessels or boats, she shall signify the same by four short blasts of the steam whistle or syren blown in rapid succession, and all vessels and boats shall keep out of the way of the vessel making this signal; provided always that the latter shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed.

Note.—The Master of every merchant or other private vessel to which the rules in this Schedule relate, must observe and cause to be observed the provisions of these Rules as far as they relate to his vessel, and any such Master by his wilful default infringing or causing any infringement of any of the provisions of these rules is guilty of a misdemeanour.

# CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD.

St. James's Palace, S.W. 1, 27th March, 1931.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the Award of the Medal of the Military Division of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire to the undermentioned:—

#### For Gallantry,

362370 Leading Aircraftman Robert Ewing Douglas, Royal Air Force.

For conspicuous gallantry displayed in an attempt to save the lives of two fellow airmen at Kohat, India, on the 13th June, 1930.

An aeroplane proceeding on patrol with a crew of two and a load of live bombs stalled shortly after leaving the ground and crashed on the edge of the aerodrome, immediately bursting into flames.

Leading Aircraftman Douglas, who witnessed the crash, was the first to arrive on the scene of the accident and found the air gunner lying two yards from the wreckage, his clothes burn-These flames Douglas quenched ing badly. with a hand extinguisher, and, after disentangling part of the gun equipment from the injured man's person, dragged him clear of the machine with the assistance of another airman who had arrived on the scene, and, after subduing a renewed burst of flames in his clothing, got him on board the ambulance. He then turned his attention to the pilot in the burning machine and had approached to within twelve yards of the wreckage when the first of the bombs exploded. Realising then that there was no hope of the pilot being still alive, he started to get clear and was some yards away when a second bomb thirty exploded.

In advancing so close to the flames this nirman took a grave risk as he was fully aware that the aircraft contained live bombs of a powerful type.

# TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. - 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section.1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- 9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

#### Transhipment.

1. The transhipment at a port in Great Britain of animals brought from Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man, is hereby prohibited, unless such transhipment is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector or other Officer of the Ministry, and subject to such conditions if any as may be prescribed therein.

#### Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND, CHANNEL ISLANDS AND ISLE OF MAN) (AMENDMENT) ORDER OF 1931, and shall be read with the Animals (Landing from

Ireland, Channel Islands and Isle of Man) Order of 1923.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 9).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:-

Declaration of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be a Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

Contraction of Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area described in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 7).

2. So much of the Area described in the Schedule to this Order as is contained in the Area described in the Schedule to the Footand-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1931 (No. 7) shall be excluded from and cease to form part of the Infected Area described in the Schedule to that Order.

# Short Title.
