WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 11th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, and of the New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date

the 14th day of August, 1878, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate in the Parish of Beckenham, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the Diocese of Canterbury, but now in the said Diocese of Rochester, and the said District Chapelry was named ‘The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Beckenham’:

“And whereas the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Beckenham, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 25th day of June, 1924, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, part of the said Parish of Beckenham was constituted a separate District or New Parish for spiritual purposes and the same was named ‘The New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham’:

“And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End,

Beckenham, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin Linton, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, and of the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, and (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham:

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The First Schedule."

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, in the County of Kent, and in the Diocese of Rochester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, which is bounded upon the south west and upon the north west by the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north east and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, at the junction of Croydon Road with Groveland Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Groveland Road for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Broomfield Road, and extending thence south westward along the middle of Broomfield Road for a distance of 16 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Eden Park Avenue, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Eden Park Avenue for a

distance of 17½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham.

"The Second Schedule."

"The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, which is bounded upon the south west by the Parish of Addington, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, upon the south by the Parish of West Wickham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Canterbury, upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Rochester, upon the north and upon the northwest by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Beckenham, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, crosses the middle of Eden Park Avenue, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Eden Park Avenue for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stanhope Grove and extending thence southward along the middle of Stanhope Grove for a distance of 25½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Upper Elmers End Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Upper Elmers End Road for a distance of 3½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to where Shirley Stream diverges southward from such road, and extending thence southward to and along the middle of Shirley Stream for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Elmers End, Beckenham, from the said Parish of Addington."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 11th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Lawrence, Byker, situate within the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Anthony, Byker, in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker, of the New Parish (sometime District) of Byker, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne, both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker, of the said New Parish of Byker, and of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Lawrence, Byker, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold Ernest, Bishop of Newcastle, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, as well of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker, as of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Byker and of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker, of the said New Parish of Byker, and of the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which

portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Lawrence, Byker, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Lawrence, Byker.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Lawrence, Byker, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Anthony, Byker, of the New Parish (sometime District) of Byker, and of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne, all in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south by the New Parish of Saint James, Gateshead, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Gateshead, from the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne, at a point in the middle of the River Tyne opposite to the middle of the roadway leading past the eastern end of Burrell Road into St. Lawrence Road, and extending thence north eastward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of $9\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with St. Lawrence Road, and extending thence first northward to and then north eastward along the middle of the passage leading into Hawick Crescent for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hawick Crescent, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of the roadway on the eastern side of Hawick Crescent and of the roadway in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the junction of the last mentioned roadway with the roadway running between the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Hawick Crescent and the houses and premises situate on the southern side of Walker Road, and extending thence north eastward in a straight line for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Riverside Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway across Walker Road, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries St. Michael's Road across such line of railway, and extending thence eastward along the middle of St. Michael's Road (thereby following the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Newcastle upon Tyne, from the said New Parish of Byker) for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Commercial Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Commercial Road for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading along the backs of the houses and premises situate on the western side of Raby Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of the last mentioned roadway for a distance

of 3½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ayton Street, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Ayton Street for a distance of 21½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Clifford Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Clifford Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the roadway leading into Allendale Street, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of such roadway for a distance of 6 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Allendale Street, and extending thence southward along the middle of Allendale Street (thereby following in part the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Byker from the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker) for a distance in all of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Walker Road opposite to the northern end of the fence forming the eastern boundary of certain allotment gardens and extending thence southward to and along such fence for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence reaches the northern side of the roadway or footpath leading from the premises known as Bird's Nest into Gibb Street, and extending thence in a straight line due south (thereby crossing the said roadway or footpath and the said Riverside Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway) for a distance of 7¼ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Tyne upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anthony, Byker, from the said New Parish of Saint James, Gateshead."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 25th day of June, 1931, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme, under the 11th Section of that Measure, with

reference to the Order of Your Majesty in Council dated the 14th day of August, 1928, and published in the London Gazette upon the same day, for effecting the unions (a) of the Benefice of Bromyard and part of the Benefice of Avenbury, and (b) of the Benefice of Stoke Lacy and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Avenbury, all which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas by the said Order of Your Majesty in Council it was directed (a) that the said Benefice of Bromyard and a part of the said Benefice of Avenbury should be united under the style of 'The Benefice of Bromyard' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Bromyard) and (b) that the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Avenbury should be united under the style of 'The Benefice of Stoke Lacy' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy) and further that with the consent of the said Philip Austen Lushington (such consent being duly testified) the said unions should take effect upon the then next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices of Avenbury and Stoke Lacy which should last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council:

"And whereas on the day of the date of the said Order of Your Majesty in Council all of the said Benefices of Bromyard, Avenbury and Stoke Lacy were full, the Reverend Prebendary Philip Austen Lushington being Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bromyard, the Reverend Edward Henry Archer-Shepherd being Incumbent of the said Benefice of Avenbury, and the Reverend Prebendary Henry George Morgan being Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy:

"And whereas the said Philip Austen Lushington and the said Henry George Morgan are still Incumbents of the said Benefices of Bromyard and Stoke Lacy respectively but the said Benefice of Avenbury is now vacant:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be expedient that the event upon the happening of which the said unions would become effective as aforesaid should be altered as hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Philip Austen Lushington and the said Henry George Morgan are consenting to this Scheme:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Philip Austen Lushington and Henry George Morgan (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"That the provisions of the said Order in Council of the 14th day of August, 1928, in regard to the taking effect of the said unions shall be altered as follows, that is to say, the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this present Scheme, and the said Philip

Austen Lushington, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bromyard, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Bromyard and the said Henry George Morgan, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Lacy, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Stoke Lacy.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and

now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for the taking down and the sale of the site and materials of the Church of Saint Michael, situate within the Parish of the United Benefice of Manchester, Saint Paul, New Cross, with Saint Michael, and Saint Thomas, Redbank, in the County of Lancaster, and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas the said Church of Saint Michael was formerly the Parish Church of the Parish of Manchester, Saint Michael, and is now a Chapel of Ease to the Parish Church of the said Parish of Manchester, Saint Paul, New Cross, with Saint Michael, and Saint Thomas, Redbank:

"And whereas the said Church of Saint Michael is no longer required for the purposes of Divine Service:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England with the consent of the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is say:—

"1.—(a) That the said Church of Saint Michael shall be taken down and the site and materials thereof together with the ground annexed or belonging thereto (not being ground forming part of a Churchyard which has been used for burials) shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects and subject to such conditions as we shall deem expedient, provided always that such sale or disposal shall be subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

(b) That such articles of furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Michael as the Bishop of Manchester shall select shall be transferred to the Church of the said Parish of Manchester, Saint Paul, New Cross, with Saint Michael, and Saint Thomas, Redbank, or to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the said Diocese of Manchester which the Bishop may select: provided always that any articles which shall not be so transferred or appropriated except the font, communion table and sacramental plate, may be sold and the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Michael.

"2. That the net proceeds to arise from the sale or sales to be made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as aforesaid, after the payment thereof of all costs and expenses of or in relation to such sale or sales and to the carrying into effect of this Scheme shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"Provided always that this Scheme shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church, shall be obtained to the sale hereby proposed of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Michael and of any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided also that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending

and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Manchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both House of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Detention of animals moved out of Landing Place.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Animals (Landing from Ireland and Isle of Man) Order of 1931 cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from any port in Ireland which is mentioned in the First Schedule to the Animals (Landing from Ireland, Channel Islands, and Isle of Man) Order of 1923 as amended by any subsequent Order, except the port of Belfast, or shipped from the Isle of Man, may be landed after twelve o'clock midnight on the fourteenth day of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, at any landing place in Great Britain approved by the Minister as a landing place for imported animals, and may be moved from the landing place if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry and subject to the following conditions:—

(i) The animals shall be moved to the place of detention specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and slaughtered within a period of ten days after the date of their arrival thereat. Whilst so detained animals moved with a licence under this Order shall not be allowed to come into contact with any other animals.

(ii) Animals moved under this Order shall be moved by the nearest available route, and during such movement shall not be permitted to come in contact with animals not being moved under this Order.

Provided that this Article shall not be deemed to authorise the landing in Great Britain of any animal brought from County Down or the City of Belfast or from any other place in Northern Ireland or the Irish Free State situate within any premises or area subject for the time being to restrictions on the movement of animals imposed in connection with foot-and-mouth disease; nor authorise the movement of any animal contrary to the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 where the animal is landed at a landing place situate within a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area to which that Order for the time being applies.

(2) A copy of every licence granted under this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of detention specified in the Licence is situate, who shall take steps to enforce the conditions of the Licence.

Offences.

2. Any person committing, or aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission

of any breach of the provisions of this Order, or of the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, is liable, on summary conviction, to the penalties provided by the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1927.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

4. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND AND ISLE OF MAN) ORDER OF 1931 (No. 2).
