WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 29th day of March, 1932 (C.W. 2159/32), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is

enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, Your Majesty was pleased to sanction, *inter alia*, revised rates of Command Money for Officers in command of Your Majesty's ships and shore establishments and to authorise the payment of Entertaining Allowance to Officers appointed in command:

"And whereas we consider that the Engineer Captain appointed in command of the Mechanical Training Establishment at Chatham should receive Command Money and Entertaining Allowance:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the payment to this Officer, with effect from the 1st day of January, 1932, of Command Money and Entertaining Allowance at the daily rates of 7s. and 5s. respectively.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Orders in Council dated the 11th day of October, 1921, the 4th day of November, 1925, and the 1st day of June, 1926, Telegraphist Air Gunners in Your Majesty's Navy receive allowances of 1s. a day during preliminary training and 2s. a day continuously thereafter while detailed for air duties:

"And whereas we consider that the allowance to fully qualified Telegraphist Air Gunners should be paid during foreign service leave to the ratings who have performed the duties abroad:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of Telegraphist Air Gunners' allowance to qualified ratings accordingly.

"And whereas we consider that Constables of the Royal Marine Police should receive a special allowance when in charge of the petrol engines of motor boats employed on police patrol, in view of the special nature of the duties performed:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to approve with effect from the 29th day of February, 1932, of an allowance of sixpence a day being paid to Constables of the Royal Marine Police while allocated for duty in charge of the petrol engines of motor boats employed on police patrol work.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty,

Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of March, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, partly out of the Parish of Saint Catherine, Gloucester, partly out of the Parish of Barnwood, partly out of the Parish of Churchdown, partly out of the Parish of Down Hatherley, partly out of the Parish of Twigworth, and partly out of the Extra Parochial place called or known as Wotton Vill, all in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester:—

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode Gloucester, the said Parish of Saint Catherine, Gloucester, the said Parish of Barnwood, the said Parish of Churchdown, the said Parish of Down Hatherley, and the said Parish of Twigworth are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Saint Catherine, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Barnwood, of the said Parish of Churchdown, of the said Parish of Down Hatherley, of the said Parish of Twigworth, and of the said extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill, which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

“And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

“And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“And whereas a plot of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been

conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the site for a permanent Church for such District, and there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £1,400 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

“And whereas the said plot of land has been conveyed and the said capital sum of £1,400 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“And whereas the contributors of the purchase money for the said plot of land and of the said capital sum of £1,400 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Gloucester as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Saint Catherine, Gloucester, of the said Parish of Barnwood, of the said Parish of Churchdown, of the said Parish of Down Hatherley, of the said Parish of Twigworth, and of the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Wotton Saint Mary Without.’

“And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester, and his successors for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions

of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament..

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Wotton Saint Mary Without, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Saint Mary de Lode, Gloucester, of the Parish of Saint Catherine, Gloucester, of the Parish of Barnwood, of the Parish of Churchdown, of the Parish of Down Hatherley, of the Parish of Twigworth, and of the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill, which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing at the centre of the bridge which carries Innsworth Road across Hatherley Brook where the boundaries of the Civil Parish of Churchdown, of the Civil Parish of Down Hatherley, and of the Civil Parish of Wotton Saint Mary Without, all meet, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the boundary of the said Civil Parish of Wotton Saint Mary Without (thereby following in one part the middle of Hatherley Brook, in another part the middle of Horsbere Brook, in another part the middle of Longford Lane, and in another part the middle of Wotton Brook) for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles or thereabouts to the centre of Cole Bridge, which carries Cheltenham Road across Wotton Brook, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Cheltenham Road, for a distance of 25 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 214 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the said Civil Parish of Wotton Saint Mary Without published in the year 1923 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 214A upon the said maps, and extending thence first southward to such fence and then first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 214 and the close numbered 218 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 214A and the closes numbered 195 and 193 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 24 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 218 from the said close numbered 193 reaches the north eastern side of Lonsdale Road, and extending thence first south westward to and then south eastward along the middle of Lonsdale Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Elmbridge Road, and extending thence north eastward along the middle of Elmbridge Road for a distance of $12\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Sisson Road, and extending thence south eastward along the middle of Sisson Road for a distance of $15\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its eastern end at the gateway forming the entrance to Sisson's Engineering Works and extending thence first north eastward and then south eastward along the fences forming the western and northern boundaries of the premises attached to the said Engineering Works for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence forming the northern boundary of such premises reaches the fence forming the north western boundary of the Bristol and Birmingham Line of the London,

Midland and Scottish Railway, and extending thence first south eastward to and then north eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance in all of 1 mile and 3 chains or thereabouts to the centre of Witcombe Bridge, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the roadway leading under Witcombe Bridge and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $1\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream which runs north westward into Hatherley Brook, and extending thence first northward and then north westward along the middle of such stream for a distance of 70 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Hucclecote from the said Civil Parish of Wotton Saint Mary Without, and extending thence first north eastward and then in various directions along the boundary of the said Civil Parish of Wotton Saint Mary Without for a distance of $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Innsworth Road across Hatherley Brook, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Gloucester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of February, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Stuston and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Thrandeston, both of which Benefices are

situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Stuston and Thrandeston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report, but with the assent of the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Stuston and Thrandeston are now full, being held together in plurality by the Reverend Frederick Hemsworth King Edwin under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Frederick Hemsworth King Edwin (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Stuston and the said Benefice of Thrandeston shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Thrandeston with Stuston' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Frederick Hemsworth King Edwin if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Stuston and Thrandeston shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Stuston and Thrandeston shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect and until such time as a more suitable house of residence shall have been provided in a central situation the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of

Stuston shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Thrandeston and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be applied by us towards the cost of providing a suitable house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice as aforesaid.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patron of the said Benefice of Stuston shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Thrandeston shall have the second and the third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased

hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of February, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bishop's Castle, situate in the County of Salop, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Mainstone, situate partly in the said County of Salop and partly in the County of Montgomery, and both in the Diocese of Hereford:

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bishop's Castle and Mainstone duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Hereford embodies certain modifications thereof:

“And whereas both of the said Benefices of Bishop's Castle and Mainstone are now full, the Reverend Canon Harold John Smith being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle and the Reverend William Edmund Glenn being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mainstone:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do

humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle and the said Benefice of Mainstone shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Bishop's Castle with Mainstone’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Mainstone only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle and the then Incumbent of Mainstone shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Mainstone and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Mainstone if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle shall have been instituted to Bishop's Castle subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Mainstone and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mainstone shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“4. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the Tithe Rent Charge and other endowments of the said Benefice of Mainstone shall be charged with a sum of £300 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate as aforesaid which said fund of £300 per annum shall subject to the proviso hereinafter contained be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid and the said charge of £300 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to hold the same for the purpose of meeting the expenses of providing for the services of a Curate provided that if and so long only as the Bishop of Hereford shall from time to time be satisfied that it is not reasonably practicable for the Incumbent to obtain the services of a Curate

the said fund shall be available for payment for occasional clerical or lay assistance employed with the approval of the Bishop.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Bishop's Castle shall have the first and the third turns and the Patron of the said Benefice of Mainstone shall have the second turn.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.
