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The following Scheme for the adjustment of the property, rights, liabilities, &c., of the Urban District Council of Barnes and for other purposes, as settled by a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882":—

Whereas Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, provides that where a petition for a charter of Incorporation is referred to a Committee of the Lords of His Majesty's Privy Council, and it is proposed by the charter to extend the Municipal Corporations Acts to the Municipal Borough to be created by the charter, the Committee may settle a scheme for the adjustment of the powers, rights, privileges, franchises, duties, property and liabilities of any then existing local authority whose district comprises the whole or any part of the area of that Borough, either with or without any adjoining or other place, and also of any officer of that authority:

And whereas Sections 214 to 218 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and Section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1894, contain supplemental provisions as to schemes made under Section 213 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882:

And whereas Section 310 of the Public Health Act, 1875, provides that where a district under

the jurisdiction of an urban district council is constituted or included in a borough, all the powers, rights, duties, capacities, liabilities, obligations and property exercisable by, attaching to, or vested in, that council under the Public Health Act, 1875, or under any local Act for purposes the same as, or similar to, those of that Act, or under any general Act of Parliament within or for the benefit of such district, shall pass to and be exercisable by and vested in the council of such borough:

And whereas the Urban District of Barnes, in the Administrative County of Surrey, comprises the parishes of Barnes and Mortlake, and is an Urban District for the purposes of the Public Health Act, 1875, for which the Urban District Council (hereinafter called "The District Council") of Barnes are the Local Authority:

And whereas it is proposed by a charter of incorporation to create the Urban District of Barnes a Municipal Borough, to incorporate its inhabitants, and to extend to that Urban District and its inhabitants the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Acts:

And whereas by the Representation of the People Act, 1918, the Municipal Borough of Richmond and the Urban Districts of Barnes and Ham were constituted a Parliamentary Borough, and return one Member to serve in Parliament:

And whereas by virtue of a scheme made by the Board of Agriculture, and confirmed by the Metropolitan Commons (Barnes) Supple-

mental Act, 1898, Barnes Common was to be regulated and managed by the District Council:

And whereas by virtue of a scheme made by the Board of Agriculture, and confirmed by the Metropolitan Commons (East Sheen) Supplemental Act, 1898, East Sheen Common was to be regulated and managed by the District Council:

And whereas the District Council are authorised undertakers within the meaning and for the purposes of the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, and the London and Home Counties Electricity District Order, 1925:

And whereas the District Council on the 10th day of May, 1904, made a Scheme, under Section 17 of the Education Act, 1902, for the constitution of an Education Committee, which was approved by the Board of Education on the 12th day of May, 1904:

And whereas by a Scheme made the 6th day of December, 1901, by the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, the Urban District Council of Barnes became Trustees and Managers of the Mortlake Play Ground:

And whereas by a Resolution of the District Council passed on the 12th day of October, 1915, the powers, duties, property, debts and liabilities of the Mortlake Burial Board were, as from the 1st day of November, 1915, transferred to the District Council by virtue of Section 62 of the Local Government Act, 1894:

And whereas this Scheme has been referred for consideration to the Secretary of State, Ministers, and Government Departments to whom it is required to be referred by the enactments in that behalf:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Committee of Council have settled a Scheme containing the provisions herein, and do hereby direct, order and declare as follows:—

SHORT TITLE AND INTERPRETATION.

1.—(1) This Scheme may be cited as the Borough of Barnes Scheme, 1932.

(2) In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise requires:—

“The appointed day” means the day appointed for the first meeting of the Council of the Municipal Borough of Barnes;

“The Borough” means the Municipal Borough of Barnes;

“The Corporation” means the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough acting by the Council of the Borough;

“The District” means the existing Urban District of Barnes;

“The District Council” means the existing Urban District Council of Barnes;

“The Municipal Corporations Acts” means the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, and the Acts amending and extending that Act;

“Duties” includes responsibilities and obligations and any proceeding to which the District Council may be liable for the enforcement of any duty, or for punishing the breach of any duty;

“Liabilities” includes all debts and liabilities to which the District Council are or would, but for this Scheme, be liable,

whether accruing before, on or after the appointed day;

“Local Authority” means a Local Authority as defined in Section 3 of the Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

“Property” includes all property, real and personal, and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in, to and out of property, real and personal, including things in action, and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights, and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation, whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC., OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the Local Authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and, save as provided in this Article, the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the Council of a Borough containing, according to the census of 1881 or any later census, a population of 10,000 or upwards, except the powers conferred by the Education Acts, empowering the Corporation to prepare a Scheme and appoint a Committee for Elementary Education.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the Council of a Borough in relation to the appointment of a Watch Committee, a Police Force of Special Constables, or the levy of a Watch Rate under Part IX. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of Police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties, or be subject to the liabilities in relation to the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, or of the Weights and Measures Acts, 1878-1926; but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by, and be attached to, the County Council of the administrative County of Surrey, and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist, and, subject to the provisions of this Scheme, their powers and duties, including those under any Local Act, Provisional Order, or Order shall be transferred to, and attach to, the Corporation, and

the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by, or attach to, the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by, or attach to, the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property (not being property held on a Charitable trust) or liabilities which immediately before the appointed day are vested in, or attach to, the District Council shall on the appointed day, by virtue of this Scheme, be transferred to, vest in, and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired, or the liabilities incurred, in the execution of an Act of Parliament, the property and liabilities shall be held by, and be discharged by, the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the Council of a Borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall, by virtue of this Scheme, be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to the Corporation in respect of the Borough.

6. Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing, and for the payment of the interest thereon, shall, by virtue of this Scheme, be transferred to, and attach to, the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a Borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this Article applies shall, together with the interest to accrue due thereon, be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned, or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid, or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the

Corporation by this Article, or the powers of any person entitled under such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme, the power may continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the unrepealed provisions of:—

(a) The Local Act mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme, and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last-mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule), and

(b) Any other Local Act, Provisional Order duly confirmed, or Order having the force of an Act, and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such Local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present Session of Parliament), as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall apply and extend to the Borough, and any reference therein to the Urban District of Barnes and the Council thereof shall be deemed to refer to the Borough and the Corporation thereof.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any Local Act, Confirmation Act, or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall, in respect of all matters relating to, or affecting, any part of the District, enure to the benefit of the Corporation, and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10.—(1) The provisions of:—

(a) The Baths and Washhouses Acts, 1846 to 1925;

(b) The Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890;

(c) The Private Street Works Act, 1892;

(d) The Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899 to 1923;

(e) The Notification of Births Act, 1907;

(f) The Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922;

(g) The Public Health Act, 1925;

shall be in force within and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

(2) Such of the provisions of:—

(a) The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890;

(b) The Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907;

as shall have been adopted by the District Council, and shall be in force within the District immediately before the appointed day, shall be in force within and apply to the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

11.—(1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by, or attach to, the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by, or attach to, the Corporation.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a Town Council, acting as a Burial Board, shall extend to the Corporation acting as a Burial Board, and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon, and paid out of, the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

12.—(1) All Bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1921, which, under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Barnes Local Board or the Barnes Urban District Council in:—

(a) Any Bye-law, Regulation, Scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments, or scale of charges; or

(b) Any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or Local Authority, other than an Order relative to a charitable endowment, which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this Article applies to the Local Government District of Barnes or the Urban District of Barnes shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any Bye-laws made by the County Council of Surrey under Section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall, until the 1st day of January, 1935, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those Bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the Bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by Bye-laws made by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

14.—(1) In case any Officer of the District Council who was employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme, and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years, shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough, nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him, he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined having regard to the conditions and circumstances mentioned in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, and the compensation shall not exceed the limit therein mentioned.

Provided, nevertheless, that if any such Officer shall be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with, or

if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) Any compensation payable to any Officer shall be paid out of the General Rate Fund of the Borough, and the provisions of the said Schedule (except paragraph 11 thereof) shall apply, subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an Officer in connection with the preparation of the Jurors' Book or the Register of Electors, under the Representation of the People Acts, shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the Officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the Officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No Officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) For the purposes of this Article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this Article, the expression "Officer" includes a servant.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

15.—(1) The accounts of the District Council and of their Officers shall be made up to the appointed day, and shall be audited by the District Auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the District Auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

16.—(1) The District Council shall, by the levy of a rate, liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day, and all other sums then due to the District Council, may be recovered by the Corporation.

17.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate, or shall prejudicially affect or prevent, the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council, or any contract, deed, bond, agreement, or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors):

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action, or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or

against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if, instead of that Council (or their predecessors), the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

18. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary, or affect any power, right, interest, or jurisdiction in or over or in connection with any charitable endowment, except Mortlake Play Ground.

19. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

20. Notwithstanding the Incorporation of the Borough, and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into, or done before the appointed day by or with reference to the District Council shall be as good valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation as if the same had been made, done, entered into, or done by or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner, in all respects as if the Corporation, instead of the District Council, had been party or privy to the same, and had been named or referred to therein.

“Powers” includes rights, jurisdiction, capacities, privileges, franchises and immunities;

"Property" includes all property, real and personal, and all estates, interests, easements and rights (whether equitable or legal) in to and out of property, real and personal, including things in action and all franchises, rights of common and commonable rights and all charters, records, deeds, books and documents.

COMMENCEMENT.

2. This Scheme shall come into operation on the day of its confirmation whether by Order in Council or by Act of Parliament.

POWERS, ETC. OF CORPORATION UNDER PUBLIC GENERAL ACTS.

3.—(1) On the appointed day the Borough shall be placed under the jurisdiction of the Corporation as the local authority for the purposes of the Public Health Acts, 1875 to 1925, and save as provided in this article the Corporation shall have all the powers and duties conferred or imposed by any public general Act of Parliament on the council of a borough containing according to the census of 1881 or any later census a population of 10,000 or upwards.

(2) Nothing in this Scheme shall affect the provisions of the Rating and Valuation Act, 1925.

(3) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise the powers or be subject to the duties of the council of a borough in relation to the appointment of a watch committee, a police force of special constables, or the levy of a watch rate under Part IX. of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; and the Borough for the purposes of police shall continue to form part of the Metropolitan Police District.

(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (1) of this article the Corporation shall not exercise any of the powers or duties or be subject to the liabilities in relation to the execution of the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, but all the powers, duties and liabilities in respect of such matters shall be exercised by and be attached to the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex and the area of the Borough shall for all purposes of the Acts relating to the matters mentioned above form part of the County in like manner as if it were not a Borough.

DISSOLUTION, TRANSFER OF POWERS, ETC., OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

4.—(1) On the appointed day the District Council shall cease to exist and subject to the provisions of this Scheme their powers and duties including those under any local Act, Provisional Order or Order shall be transferred to and attach to the Corporation, and the Corporation shall be the successors of the District Council.

(2) All powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council for the benefit of the District shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough.

PROPERTY AND LIABILITIES OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

5. Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(1) All property (not being property held on a charitable trust) or liabilities, which

immediately before the appointed day are vested in or attach to the District Council shall on the appointed day by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to, vest in and attach to the Corporation, subject to all trusts affecting the same, and where the property was acquired or the liabilities incurred in the execution of an Act of Parliament the property and liabilities shall be held by and be discharged by the Corporation in accordance with such of the provisions of that Act as apply to the council of a borough.

(2) All property which immediately before the appointed day is vested in the District Council for the benefit of the District shall by virtue of this Scheme be held by the Corporation for the benefit of the Borough, and all liabilities which immediately before the appointed day attach to the District Council in respect of the District shall on the appointed day attach to them in respect of the Borough.

6. Any balance immediately before the appointed day to the credit or debit of any fund of the Urban District shall on the appointed day become a balance to the credit or debit of a corresponding fund to be opened for the Borough.

LOANS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme:—

(a) The liability for the repayment of so much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and for the payment of the interest thereon shall by virtue of this Scheme be transferred to and attach to the Corporation;

(b) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as immediately before the appointed day are owing and charged upon a fund or rate of that Council shall be charged upon that fund or rate of the Borough from which the expenses of the Council of a borough in the execution of the Act authorising the borrowing of the moneys are directed to be defrayed;

(c) So much of any moneys borrowed by the District Council as a Burial Board as immediately before the appointed day are owing shall by virtue of this Scheme be charged upon the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

(2) All borrowed moneys to which this Article applies shall together with the interest to accrue due thereon be repaid by the Corporation within the respective periods for which the loans in respect of which the said sums are owing were originally sanctioned or within which the same are otherwise required to be repaid or are made repayable.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice or affect any mortgage or other security which has been granted in respect of any borrowed moneys the liability for the repayment of which is transferred from the District Council to the Corporation by this Article or the powers of any person entitled under any such mortgage or other security to enforce the same as if this Scheme had not been confirmed, and where for any such purpose it is necessary to continue the exercise of a power which would have existed but for this Scheme the power may

continue to be exercised as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

LOCAL ACTS, PROVISIONAL ORDERS, ETC.

8.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme the unrepealed provisions of:—

(a) The local Acts mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme and the Confirmation Acts mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Scheme (so far as the last mentioned Acts relate to the Provisional Orders specified in that Schedule) and

(b) Any other local Act, Provisional Order duly confirmed, or Order having the force of an Act and affecting the District or the District Council (including any such local Act or Provisional Order passed or confirmed during the present session of Parliament)

as the same respectively are in force within the District immediately before the appointed day shall extend and apply to the Borough.

(2) Any reference in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Provisional Order or in any Order having the force of an Act:—

(a) To the Brentford or Chiswick Local Boards or the Brentford or Chiswick Urban District Councils or the Brentford and Chiswick Urban District Council shall be read as a reference to the Corporation; and

(b) To the Local Government District of Brentford or Chiswick or the Urban Districts of Brentford or Chiswick or the Urban District of Brentford and Chiswick shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

(3) Nothing in this Scheme shall alter the area for the supply of gas or electricity by any Company under any local Act or Provisional Order confirmed by Parliament or under any special Order made under the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, or the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928, or shall prejudice or affect the existing rights and powers of any such Company under any such Act or Order.

9. The provisions of any protective clause for the benefit of the District Council (or their predecessors) contained in any local Act, Confirmation Act or Order (by whomsoever obtained) shall in respect of all matters relating to or affecting any part of the District enure to the benefit of the Corporation and shall be construed as if a reference to the Corporation were substituted for any reference to the District Council (or their predecessors) as the case may be.

ADOPTIVE ACTS.

10.—(1) Such of the provisions of:—

(a) Baths and Wash-houses Acts, 1846-1925,

(b) Infectious Diseases (Prevention) Act, 1890,

(c) Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1890 (except part V),

(d) Museums and Gymnasiums Act, 1891 (for Museums only),

(e) Private Street Works Act, 1892,

(f) Small Dwellings Acquisition Acts, 1899-1923,

(g) Public Health Act, 1925,

(h) Public Libraries Acts, 1892-1919,

(i) Local Government and other Officers' Superannuation Act, 1922,

as shall have been adopted for the District immediately before the appointed day shall be in force and apply to the Borough as if the same had been adopted for the Borough.

BURIAL ACTS, 1852 TO 1906.

11.—(1) All the powers and duties which immediately before the appointed day are exercisable by or attach to the District Council under or by virtue of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, shall be exercisable by or attach to the Corporation in and for the Parishes of New Brentford and Chiswick.

(2) Such of the provisions of the Burial Acts, 1852 to 1906, as apply to a town council acting as a burial board shall extend to the Corporation acting as a burial board and the expenses of the Corporation in the execution of those Acts shall accordingly be chargeable upon and paid out of the general fund and general rate of the Borough.

BYE-LAWS, REGULATIONS, ORDERS, ETC.

12.—(1) All bye-laws made before the 1st January, 1922, which under the Ministry of Health Act, 1919, are subject to confirmation by the Minister of Health, whether made before or after the passing of that Act, shall cease to be in force within the Borough on the expiry of one year from the appointed day.

(2) Any reference to the Brentford or Chiswick Local Boards or the Brentford or Chiswick Urban District Councils or the Brentford and Chiswick Urban District Council in:—

(a) any bye-law, regulation, scheme, list of tolls, table of fees and payments or scale of charges; or

(b) any Order in Council or Order of a Government Department or local authority other than an Order relative to a charitable endowment;

which immediately before the appointed day is in force shall be read as a reference to the Corporation.

(3) Any reference in any document to which paragraph (2) of this article applies to the Local Government District of Brentford or Chiswick or the Urban Districts of Brentford or Chiswick or the Urban District of Brentford and Chiswick shall be read as a reference to the Borough.

13. Any bye-laws made by the County Council of Middlesex under section 16 of the Local Government Act, 1888, or under Section 11 of the Petroleum (Consolidation) Act, 1928, which immediately before the appointed day are in force within the District shall until the 1st day of January, 1935, apply to the Borough and be enforced by the Corporation as if those bye-laws had been made by the Corporation, but on that day shall cease to be in force within the Borough unless the bye-laws shall previously have been repealed or altered as respects the Borough by bye-laws made by the Corporation.

EDUCATION COMMITTEE.

14.—(1) The hereinbefore recited Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee of the District Council shall until duly revoked or altered continue in force and have effect subject to the provisions of the Agreement of the 30th July, 1928, between the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex of the one part and the Urban District Council of Brentford and Chiswick of the other part, as if references to the Corporation and the Borough were substituted for references to the Brentford and Chiswick Urban District Council and the Urban District of Brentford and Chiswick, and reference to the quarterly

meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November were substituted for the reference to the annual meeting of the District Council.

(2) The members of the Education Committee of the District Council who shall be in office immediately before the commencement of this Scheme shall be deemed to have been appointed by the Borough Council under the said Scheme for the constitution of the Education Committee and shall hold office until the quarterly meeting of the Council of the Borough on the 9th day of November, 1932.

15. The said recited school attendance bye-laws and bye-laws with respect to the employment of children and street trading by young persons made under the Education Acts in force in the Urban District at the commencement of this Scheme shall apply to the Borough until revoked or altered by the Corporation.

COMPENSATION CLAUSE.

16.—(1) In case any officer of the District Council who was employed by such Council immediately before the date of the confirmation of this Scheme and who shall have been employed by such Council for a period of not less than five years shall not be employed by the Council of the Borough nor offered by that Council a position in their employ of a similar character and of an equal value to that formerly held by him he shall be entitled to be paid compensation for the loss of his position, and the amount to be paid in each case shall be determined having regard to the conditions and circumstances mentioned in the Eighth Schedule to the Local Government Act, 1929, and the compensation shall not exceed the limit therein mentioned.

Provided nevertheless that if any such officer shall be so employed by the Corporation, he shall, if his services are dispensed with or if his salary is reduced by the Corporation within four years after the commencement of this Scheme, because his services are not required or his duties are diminished, and not on the ground of misconduct, be deemed, unless the contrary is shown, to have suffered a direct pecuniary loss in consequence of this Scheme.

(2) Any compensation payable to any officer shall be paid out of the General Rate Fund of the Borough and the provisions of the said Schedule (except paragraph 11 thereof) shall apply subject to the following and any other necessary modifications:—

(a) Any reference in that Schedule to "the Council" shall be construed as a reference to the Corporation, and

(b) Any reference in that Schedule to "the appointed day" shall be construed as a reference to the appointed day as defined in this Scheme.

(3) All fees or remuneration received and retained by an officer in connection with the preparation of the Jurors' Book or the Register of Electors under the Representation of the People Acts shall, subject to a reasonable deduction for any expenses incurred by the officer, be regarded as part of the emoluments of the officer for the purposes of compensation.

(4) No officer shall be entitled to receive both compensation under this Scheme for pecuniary loss and a superannuation or retiring allowance in respect of the same period of service and the same pecuniary loss.

(5) for the purposes of this article and of the provisions of the Eighth Schedule to the said Act of 1929 as applied by this article:—

(i) the expression "officer" includes a servant, and

(ii) a teacher employed in a public elementary school maintained but not provided by the District Council or the Corporation shall be deemed to be an officer employed by the District Council or the Corporation, and if his services are dispensed with by the direction or with the consent of the Corporation, he shall be deemed to be an officer whose services are dispensed with by the Corporation.

ACCOUNTS OF DISTRICT COUNCIL.

17.—(1) The Accounts of the District Council and of their committees and officers shall be made up to the appointed day and shall be audited by the district auditor in like manner and subject to the like incidents and consequences as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

(2) Any sum certified at the audit by the district auditor to be due from any person shall be paid to the Treasurer of the Borough.

SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS.

18.—(1) The District Council shall by the levy of a rate liquidate as far as practicable before the appointed day all their current debts and liabilities.

(2) All rates made by the District Council which are not collected immediately before the appointed day and all other sums then due to the District Council may be recovered by the Corporation.

19.—(1) Nothing in this Scheme shall cause to abate or shall prejudicially affect or prevent the continuance of any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council or any contract, deed, bond, agreement or other instrument (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors);

Provided that:—

(a) Any action, cause of action or proceeding which immediately before the appointed day is pending or existing by or against the District Council may be continued, prosecuted and enforced by or against the Corporation; and

(b) All contracts, deeds, bonds, agreements and other instruments (subsisting immediately before the appointed day) entered into or made by the District Council (or their predecessors) may be continued and enforced as fully and effectually as if instead of that Council (or their predecessors) the Corporation had been a party thereto.

(2) All legal proceedings pending immediately before the appointed day may be amended in such a manner as may be necessary or proper in consequence of this Scheme.

20. Nothing in this Scheme shall prejudice, vary or affect any power, right, interest or jurisdiction in or over or in connexion with any charitable endowment.

21. All contributions, orders and precepts made or issued before the appointed day shall be as valid in law as if this Scheme had not been confirmed.

22. Notwithstanding the incorporation of the Borough and the provisions of this Scheme, all assessments, orders, apportionments, notices, compositions, charges, acts, matters and things made, entered into or done before the appointed day by, or with reference to the District Council shall be as good, valid and effectual to all intents and purposes whatsoever for, against and with reference to the Corporation, as if the same had been made, done, entered into or done by, or with reference to the Corporation, instead of the District Council, and may be proceeded on, or enforced in the same manner in all respects as if the Corporation instead of the District Council had been party or privy to the same and had been named or referred to therein.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, on the 28th day of June, 1932, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen, commonly called Magdalen College in the University of Oxford duly made under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, at a Meeting of the Governing Body specially summoned for the purpose on the

sixth day of October one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty The King in Council.

PRELIMINARY.

This Statute is supplemental to the existing Statutes of the College that is to say the Statutes made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 and approved by His Majesty The King in Council on the 26th day of July 1926.

FELLOWSHIPS BY EXAMINATION.

STATUTE IV. 32.—The last sentence of this clause commencing with "No more than One Fellowship" and ending with "clause 5 of this Statute" shall be deleted.

PENSIONS.

STATUTE VIII. 3.—The following concluding words, namely, "unless such stipend exceed £150 per annum" shall be deleted.

DEMYSHIPS, SCHOLARSHIPS AND EXHIBITIONS.

STATUTE IX. 1.—This clause (IX. 1.) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:—

"There shall be founded and maintained within the College Senior Demysheips not exceeding six in number. The President and Fellows shall elect to the said Demysheips such persons, being Members of the University of Oxford, as shall have passed all the examinations required for the degree of Bachelor of Arts or of Bachelor of Civil Law or shall have taken the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy and shall satisfy the electors that they intend to enter upon a course of higher study with a view to taking Holy Orders or to following the profession of law, medicine, or engineering, or to engage in some study or occupation approved by the President and Fellows and that they may have difficulty in so doing without assistance. Any person who shall have been placed in the First Class in one or more of the Public Examinations of the University of Oxford or who shall have taken the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy may be elected to a Senior Demysheip without examination. Should the President and Fellows consider that any candidate who has not satisfied either of the above conditions has special claims to be considered, they shall have the power to arrange for the examination of such candidate, either orally or in writing or both orally and in writing, and if the examiners report that he is of sufficient merit for election, the President and Fellows may elect him to a Senior Demysheip."

STATUTE IX. 8.—In this clause (IX. 8) after the words "Junior Demysheip" shall be inserted the words "or Exhibition" and after the words "Junior Demy" the words "or Exhibitioner."

STATUTE IX. 18.—This clause (IX. 18) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following is hereby enacted:—

"The Tutorial Board shall have power after examination to elect candidates to Ex-

hibitions in the College. The fixed emolument of an Exhibition shall be £30 per annum. No candidate shall be ineligible for an Exhibition by reason of his age, but no Exhibitioner shall receive emoluments in excess of £30 per annum in respect of his Exhibition unless he shall satisfy the President or a deputy appointed by the President with the consent of the Tutorial Board that he is in need of support at the University. The holder of an Exhibition whether he receive emoluments or not shall have all the privileges of an Exhibitioner. Any emolument paid to an Exhibitioner shall be paid out of the Demysheip Fund and any emolument above £30 per annum shall be awarded by the Tutorial Board in the same manner as is provided in Clauses 12 (b) and 15 of this Statute for awarding discretionary emolument to a Junior Demy. No Exhibitioner shall receive in respect of his Exhibition a larger sum than £80 per annum. The tenure of an Exhibition shall be for such time as the Tutorial Board may determine, but shall in no case be prolonged beyond five years."

CHAPEL SERVICES.

STATUTE X. 2 AND 3.—These clauses (X. 2 and 3) are hereby repealed and in their stead the following are hereby enacted:—

"2. It shall be the duty of the Chaplains to perform Divine Service in the College Chapel at such times and in such manner as the President and Fellows shall from time to time appoint. One of the Chaplains shall perform the duties of and shall be called the Fellows' Chaplain."

"3. The President and Fellows shall assign to the two Chaplains such reasonable stipends as they may from time to time determine. The stipends of the two Chaplains taken together shall not exceed £400 per annum. If a Chaplain is also a Fellow of the College, his stipend as Chaplain shall be additional to any stipend or allowance to which he may be entitled as Fellow."

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.

STATUTE XI. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8.—The whole of these clauses are hereby repealed and in their stead the following are hereby enacted:—

STATUTE XI.

"SCHOOLS.

"1. So long as the College Schools in Oxford, Waynflete and Brackley are maintained, there shall be provided out of the Corporate Revenues of the College an annual sum not exceeding £2,750 to be devoted to the purposes of the three Schools.

2. The President and Fellows shall appoint such persons as they shall think fit as a standing Schools Committee by whom all questions relating to the government and management of the three schools shall be determined, except in so far as they are otherwise provided for under any other clause of this Statute.

SCHOOL IN OXFORD.

3. There shall be a Master and an Usher of the College School in Oxford. There shall be paid to the Master and the Usher, out of the contribution prescribed by clause 1 of this Statute, such stipends as the President

and Fellows may from time to time determine.

4. The Choristers of the College shall be admitted to the regular course of instruction in the School in Oxford.

5. The appointment and removal of the Master and of the Usher of the School in Oxford shall be vested in the President and Fellows.

6. The Master shall superintend the internal organisation, management, and discipline of the School in Oxford. The power of the Usher shall, in the absence of the Master, and subject to any By-law hereinafter mentioned, extend to all acts relating to the School which the Master being present is or at any time shall be enabled to perform.

7. It is lawful for the President and Fellows by By-laws from time to time to determine the powers and duties of the Master and the Usher of the School in Oxford as well as to fix the fees which shall be payable for instruction therein; and to make, alter, and revoke such regulations for its government and management as they shall think fit; subject nevertheless to the Statutes of the College in force for the time being, and to such right of appeal to the Visitor as is provided in Statute XIII., Clause 5, of these Statutes.

WAYNFLETE AND BRACKLEY.

8. The President and Fellows may from time to time make such regulations as they deem expedient for the management of the Schools of Waynflete and Brackley and the teaching to be given in them."

THE DISPOSAL OF REVENUE.

STATUTE XII. 2.—This clause (XII. 2) is hereby repealed and in its stead the following clauses are hereby enacted:—

"2a. There shall be paid each year to the Curators of the University Chest out of the Corporate Revenues of the College, the following amounts in respect of the six Professorships named in Statute IV, Clause 41, of these Statutes:

The Waynflete Professorship of Moral and Metaphysical Philosophy	£1,200

"2b. There shall also be paid each year to the Curators of the University Chest out of the Corporate Revenues of the College a sum equal to the contributions of ten per cent., payable by the University under the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities on the stipends of the six Professors named in the last preceding clause, including the contributions of ten per cent. payable

in respect of the Duty Allowances received by any of these Professors: provided that the amount payable by the College to the Curators of the University Chest under this clause shall not in any one year exceed £800. No payment made under this clause shall be reckoned towards the discharge of the contributions imposed upon the College by the University Statute concerning College Contributions for University purposes."

SUPPLEMENTAL AND TEMPORARY CLAUSES.

STATUTE XV. 10.—At the end of this clause (XV. 10) the following words shall be added:—

"No payment shall be made to the Curators of the University Chest under Statute XII., Clause 3, of these Statutes, in respect of any existing holder of a Professorial Fellowship who has not availed himself of the option to place himself under these Statutes."

Following clause 18 of this Statute (Statute XV.) the following new clause shall be added and it is hereby enacted as follows:—

"19. The stipends enjoyed by the existing Chaplains shall not be modified, without their consent, by any provision of these Statutes of 1932."

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANTS IN THE ROYAL SCOTTISH MUSEUM (UNDER THE SCOTTISH EDUCATION DEPARTMENT).

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. Competitions under these Regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held from time to time on the occurrence of vacancies.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of twenty-six and shall as a rule not exceed the age of thirty on the 1st January in the year in which the competition is held, but in special circumstances candidates above thirty or below twenty-six may be admitted with the approval of the Treasury and the Civil Service Commissioners. Candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or

was at the time of death a British subject. Provided that exception made be made—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The Scottish Education Department will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be made in the first instance to the Director of the Royal Scottish Museum, who, after examining the candidates' credentials and interviewing personally any or all of the candidates, will submit the names of such candidates as appear to have the requisite qualifications for the posts in question to the Vice-President of the Scottish Education Department for nomination. Candidates thus nominated shall be submitted to the Civil Service Commissioners who, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates.

6. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they have received such systematic education, general or technical, or general and technical together, as in the Commissioners' opinion fits them for the post. In

general, candidates should possess a University Degree or other equivalent qualifications. The Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination to test such education, or any part of it.

7. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board shall be nominated by the Commissioners in consultation with the authorities of the Department who shall be represented on the Selection Board. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidate's record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by any candidate as having direct knowledge of his or her work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at the interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the University, in the Forces, or otherwise.

10. If a Qualifying Examination is held each candidate subjected thereto will be required to pay a fee of £2. A candidate selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £8, towards which the fee paid at the Qualifying Examination (if any) will count, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.
