DRAFT AND PROVISIONAL RULES, 1932.

SUPREME COURT, ENGLAND, FUNDS.

THE SUPREME COURT FUNDS (WAR LOAN) PROVISIONAL RULES, 1932, DATED JULY 8, 1932.

I, THE RIGHT HONOURABLE JOHN VISCOUNT SANKEY, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, with the concurrence of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and in pursuance of the powers contained in Section 146 of the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, propose to make the following Rules:—

1. Where the Court directs that the Accountant-General shall make a continuance application in respect of a holding of War Loan, and that the Solicitor applying for the direction shall receive commission in lieu of all or part of the costs of the application to the Court, the Accountant-General shall, when he has received commission in respect of the holding, pay over to the Solicitor the amount of commission so received, notwithstanding anything in the Supreme Court Funds Rules, 1927.

2. In these Rules:—

“War Loan” means Five per cent. War Loan, 1929-1947.

“Continuance Application” has the same meaning as in Part III of the Finance (No. 2) Act, 1931.

“Commission” means the Commission at the undermentioned rates authorised by the Treasury to be paid by the Bank of England to Bankers, Stockbrokers, and Solicitors, on continued holdings of War Loan, if the Forms of Request for continuance bear their stamps:—

If notified not later than the 31st July, 1932, 5s. per £100 nominal.

If notified after the 31st July, 1932, but not later than the 30th September, 1932, 2s. 6d. per £100 nominal.

3. These Rules may be cited as The Supreme Court Funds (War Loan) Rules, 1932.

And I, the said John Viscount Sankey, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, with the same concurrence as aforesaid, hereby certify that on account of urgency these Rules should come into immediate operation and hereby make the said Rules to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Rules.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

SECTION 7.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport, by virtue and in exercise of the powers given to him by Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and the Regulations from time to time made by him thereunder, after consulting the London and Home Counties Traffic Advisory Committee, has relaxed the restrictions and limitations imposed by the said Regulations upon the occasion of the Race Meeting to be held at Sandown Park on Friday, the 15th day of July, 1932, so that nothing in the said Regulations shall prevent the London General Omnibus Company Limited from making on that day after 12 noon in any of the streets or parts thereof between Kingston Station and Esher declared to be "restricted streets" by any Order made by the Minister of Transport under the aforesaid Section 7 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, and forming part of that approved route 20 journeys in each direction with their omnibuses plying for hire on that approved route in excess of the number of journeys which they may make in those streets or parts thereof under the said Regulations, provided that nothing herein contained shall be deemed to affect or derogate from the powers of the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis under the provisions of Section 52 of the Metropolitan Police Act, 1839, to give directions to constables for keeping order and for preventing any obstructions of the thoroughfares.

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport, after the expiry of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the aforesaid London Traffic Act, to make Regulations to have effect in the London Traffic Area in regard to "one-way" and "roundabout" schemes of traffic working at the undermentioned points:—

"One-way" schemes:—

New Southend Road, between Gallows Corner, Romford, and Haynes Park Road, Hornchurch.

Lower Richmond Road, Mortlake, between Mortlake Road and Marksbury Avenue.
