WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of September, 1932 (N. 3294/32), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is 65-33871

enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service authorise the grant of Hard-Lying Money to Officers and men serving in certain vessels:

"And whereas the admissibility to payment and the rates of payment in particular vessels have been judged hitherto by the following standards:—

 (i) if the living and sleeping conditions are not superior to those in a Torpedo Boat on normal service—full rates are payable;

(ii) if the living and sleeping conditions are superior to those in a Torpedo Boat but are markedly inferior to those in a Destroyer on normal service—half rates are payable.

"And whereas Torpedo Boats are no longer in existence in the Royal Navy, and a satisfactory comparison with the conditions obtaining therein is now impracticable:

"And whereas we consider it necessary to establish a modern standard which would allow of direct comparison between the living and sleeping conditions in any vessel by the light

of that standard:

"And whereas we find that a suitable standard for comparison would be obtained by taking a Trawler as the type for full rates instead of a Torpedo Boat:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the adoption of the following new standards:

- (i) when the living and sleeping conditions are not superior to those experienced in a Trawler on normal service—full rates;
- (ii) when the living and sleeping conditions are superior to those experienced in a Trawler but are markedly inferior to those in a Destroyer on normal service—half

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 7th day of October, 1931, to sanction certain Regulations concerning the discontinuance of the grant of steps in rank to Officers of Your Majesty's Naval Service on or after retirement, and the retirement in their existing ranks of Captains, Engineer Captains or Captains (E), and Surgeon Captains whom it has been decided not to employ in higher ranks:

"And whereas we are now of opinion that the revised Regulations should not be applicable to Officers who were on the list of execu-

tive Captains at the date of that Order:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to provide that the said Regulations shall be applicable to Captains promoted to that rank after the 7th October, 1931, instead of to Captains of senior-

ity 1926 and below. "The Lords C Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in this proposal."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council bearing date the 7th February, 1927, to sanction certain changes in the titles, scales of pay and the system of promotion of Quartermasters, Royal Marines, including the promotion of Quartermasters (Lieutenant) to the rank of Captain on attaining eight years' seniority as

"And whereas, having regard to the age at which promotion to Quartermaster, Royal Marines, normally takes place and the relative rank of these Officers, and for certain administrative reasons, we consider it desirable that their advancement to the rank of Captain should take place after a shorter period than eight years, but that such earlier advancement in rank should not confer upon them or their widows, children or other dependent relatives, any pecuniary advantage, effective or noneffective, as compared with the existing system of promotion after eight years:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the regulations set forth in the annexed Schedule.

" The Lords Commissioners of Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals.

- "6. Pension and gratuity for the widow of a Quartermaster with less than 8 years' service since promotion to Lieutenant retired on or after the date of this Order to be at the rates applicable to the widows of Lieutenants R.M.
- "7. Nothing in these regulations shall be held to affect other Officers paid on the Quartermasters' scales, namely:—

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of August, 1932 (C.W. 5477/32), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1918, to sanction the grant, at our discretion, of Temporary Commissions as Acting Chaplains to Ministers of Religious Bodies, not in conformity with the Church of England, who rendered full time service in the Royal Navy during the period of the late war:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of October, 1922, to sanction the continuance of the grant of temporary commissions to such Ministers under the same conditions in time of peace, subject to their being designated 'Temporary Chap-lains' and not 'Acting Chaplains': "And whereas the Reverend John Grierson,

B.D., was granted a Temporary Commission as Acting Presbyterian Chaplain (now styled 'Temporary Presbyterian Chaplain') with seniority of the 2nd August, 1920 (subsequently adjusted to the 25th September, 1914, in respect of previous Army service), and served in Your Majesty's Naval Service until the 16th August, 1932, on which date he was placed on the retired list at his own request:

(1) Retired pay based on a standard rate of £300 a year to be granted to this officer, and to be awarded at the current rate of £267 a year as from the date of his retirement:

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of September, 1932 (C.W. 11575/31), in the words following,

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or [

other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 20th day of November, 1905, and the 7th day of February, 1921, certain powers were conferred upon us in the matter of the forfeiture, suspension and restoration of retired pay, pensions and other payments of the like including gratuities payable to nature, Officers, Commissioned Officers from Warrant rank, and Warrant Officers:

"And whereas by the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service similar powers are exercisable in respect of pensions payable to Petty Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers, Seamen, Marines and Boys

in such Service:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Officers and men in receipt of such retired pay, pensions, allowances, etc. who acquire foreign nationality and thereby become ineligible to render further service in time of war or emergency in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Forces (including the Reserve Forces) should be liable to forfeit such retired pay, pensions, allowances, etc.:

"And whereas we are of opinion that any pensions or allowances which might otherwise be payable to widows or other dependants of such Officers and men should also be liable to

forfeiture in the given circumstances:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that although possessing general powers in such matters as representing Your Majesty, we may be authorized at our discretion to exercise the powers conferred upon us by the aforesaid Orders in Council and Regulations in respect of any Officer, Petty Officer, Non-Commissioned Officer or man of the Naval and Marine Forces (including the Reserve Forces) who may acquire foreign nationality, and of their widows and other dependants who might otherwise be eligible for pensions or allowances.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in

these proposals."

HEREAS by section three of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, it is amongst other things provided that His Majesty may, if a representation is made to Him by the Treasury and the Secretary of State that it is desirable so to do, make an Order in Council directing that the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall be extended, subject to such modifications and to such conditions as may appear expedient to His Majesty, so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of that Act and forming part of the public debt of any territory specified in the Order which is under His Majesty's protection:

And whereas a representation has been made to His Majesty by the Treasury and the Secretary of State that it is desirable that an Order should be made directing that the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall, subject to the modifications for which provision is made by this Order, be extended so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of the said Act and forming part of the public debt of the Federated Malay States as if the Federated Malay States were a colony:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the said section three of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, shall, subject to the modifications set out in the next succeeding paragraph of this Order, be extended so as to apply to stock issued after the passing of the Colonial Development Act, 1929, and forming part of the public debt of the Federated Malay States as if the Federated Malay States were a colony.
- 2. For the purposes of section two of the Colonial Stock Act, 1900, the following conditions shall have effect in relation to stock to which the Colonial Stock Acts, 1877 to 1900, apply by virtue of this Order as if they had been prescribed by the Treasury under that section:—
 - (a) Provision must be made by legislation of the Federated Malay States for the payment out of the revenues of the Federated Malay States of any sums which may become payable to stockholders under any judgment, decree, rule or order of a court in the United Kingdom;
 - (b) The Treasury must be satisfied that adequate funds, as and when required, will be available in the United Kingdom to meet any such judgment, decree, rule or order;
 - (c) The Treasury must be satisfied that the Rulers of the Federated Malay States have entered into a treaty with His Majesty by which the Rulers agree that no legislation of the Federated Malay States affecting the stock shall be passed unless the concurrence of His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom has first been had and obtained thereto.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Colonial Stock Acts Extension (Federated Malay States) Order, 1932.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of July, 1932, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Sampford Arundel, in the County of Somerset, and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas by the Will dated the 21st day of October, 1930, of the late Reverend Charles Francis Long Sweet, of Broadleigh, Landscore Road, Teignmouth, in the County of Devon, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sampford Arundel was devised to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Wells (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Chapter'):

"And whereas Edith Maud Sweet, of Broadleigh, Teignmouth aforesaid, Widow, and Conrad Montague Walrond, of Hillcrest, Bridle Road, Eastcote, in the County of Middlesex, Esquire, are the Trustees of the said Will in whom but for the hereinbefore recited devise the said Advowson would now be vested, and the said Edith Maud Sweet and Conrad Montague Walrond are desirous with a view to the confirmation of the said devise that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sampford Arundel should be transferred to and be vested in the said Dean and Chapter and their successors:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are willing to accept such transfer and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one

of them is made necessary:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Sampford Arundel which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Sampford Arundel:

is to say, in the Parish of Sampford Arundel: "Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edith Maud Sweet and Conrad Montague Walrond (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and by way of confirmation of the hereinbefore recited devise by the Will of the said Charles Francis Long Sweet, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Sampford Arundel shall be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter and their successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Dean and Chapter and by their successors

for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Wolvey with Burton Hastings and Stretton Baskerville, to hold the same unto and to the use of the said Mervyn, Bishop of Coventry and his successors in fee simple:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part therof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.
