GAS.

THE GAS FUND (CONTRIBUTION) ORDER, 1933, DATED JANUARY 9, 1933, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, C. 28).

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 7 of the Gas Regulation Act,

1920, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. The rate of contribution to the Gas Fund for the year 1933 shall be one shilling and one penny for each million cubic feet of gas sold during the year 1932.

2. Such contribution shall be paid on or before the 1st April, 1933, to the Board of Trade at Great George Street, London, S.W.1, by all Gas Undertakers with respect to whom an Order under the said Act shall have been made or to whom sub-section (3) of Section 7 of the said Act applies by virtue of any public general Act, Special Act, or Special Order.

3. Payment of the contribution shall be by cheque made payable to the "Board of Trade" and crossed "Bank of England".

4. This Order may be cited as the Gas Fund (Contribution) Order, 1933.
