"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions,

as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the conditions prescribed by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 20th day of December, 1927, in regard to the payment of extra pay to the bakery staffs of Your Majesty's Ships fitted with bakeries, when employed in making bread for issue to other of Your Majesty's Ships not so fitted, require revision in order to provide for payment, in certain types of vessels with bakeries of small capacity, of extra pay when the quantity of bread baked for other ships equals or exceeds 60 lbs.:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the payment of extra pay at the following rates to the bakery staffs of Ships fitted with bakeries, when so employed :—

"Subject nevertheless to the conditions that payment of extra pay at these rates is not to be made to more than four ratings per diem in any ship; that payment is not to be made for quantities of less than 120 lbs. of bread produced in capital ships and large aircraft carriers, or less than 60 lbs. in Cruisers and small aircraft carriers and below; and that payment at the higher rate is to be allowed to only one Chief Petty Officer Cook or Petty Officer Cook even though more than one rating of these grades is employed.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

2. The words "Fiji Royal Gazette" in the definition of the term "Gazette" in the last line of Article 2 of the Pacific (Fugitive Criminals Surrender) Order in Council, 1914, are hereby deleted and the following words are substituted therefor:

"1.—(1) His Majesty may by Order in Council, for the purpose of giving effect to any convention for facilitating the international circulation of motor cars, provide—

(a) for the grant and authentication of any travelling passes, certificates, or authorities which may be of use to persons resident in the United Kingdom when temporarily taking their motor cars abroad, or to drivers when proceeding abroad for the purpose of driving motor cars."

And whereas a Convention on the taxation of foreign motor vehicles (hereinafter referred to as "the Convention") was concluded at Geneva on the 30th day of March, 1931, between the following countries, that is to say:—Belgium, Great Britain and Northern Ireland, Denmark, Danzig, Italy, Luxemburg, The Netherlands, Poland, Switzerland and Czechoslovakia:

And whereas His Majesty has ratified the Convention and the Secretary-General of the League of Nations has received ratifications of or accessions to the Convention by four other Members of the League of Nations or non-member States:

And whereas Article 3 and Article 14 of the Convention are in the terms set out in the Schedule to this Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Article 1.—This Order may be cited as “The Motor Vehicles (International Circulation) Order, 1933”.

Article 2.—The Minister of Transport shall be the competent authority referred to in Article 3 of the Convention and he is hereby empowered to issue fiscal permits within the meaning of that Article in respect of any motor vehicle registered in any part of the United Kingdom under the provisions of the Roads Act, 1920 (10 and 11 G. 5. c. 72).

Article 3.—There shall be chargeable on the issue of an International Fiscal Permit a fee of 7s. 6d.

Article 4.—The Minister of Transport may, subject to such conditions as he thinks fit, authorise by Order one or more Associations to perform all or any of the duties specified in Article 2 hereof, and may at any time revoke all or any part of such authorisation.

Article 3.—In order to claim the benefit of the exemptions provided in the preceding articles, the vehicle must be furnished with a fiscal permit drawn up in the form set out in the Annex to the present Convention and issued by the competent authority of the territory of registration or by some organisation designated for the purpose by that authority.

The permit shall be presented for endorsement at the frontier Customs offices on arrival in and departure from the territories of the High Contracting Party concerned.

Article 14.—The present Convention shall come into force six months after the receipt by the Secretary-General of the League of Nations of ratifications or accessions on behalf of five Members of the League of Nations or non-member States. No ratification or accession to which any conditions are attached in accordance with the preceding article shall count for this purpose until those conditions are fulfilled.

(b) between persons of whom one is subject to the jurisdiction of some one of such Powers as His Majesty being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made may by Order in Council declare to be parties to the said Convention and of whom the other is subject to the jurisdiction of some other of the Powers aforesaid; and

(c) in one of such territories as His Majesty being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made may by Order in Council declare to be territories to which the said Convention applies:

And whereas His Majesty is one of the Powers declared by Order in Council to be a party to the said Convention:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Act and by other powers enabling Him in that behalf is pleased to declare and it is hereby declared as follows:—

1. The territory of the Leeward Islands (Antigua, Dominica, Montserrat, St. Christopher, Nevis and Virgin Islands) is a territory to which the said Convention applies.

2. This Order may be cited as the Arbitration Foreign Awards No. 1 Order, 1933, and shall come into force on the 7th day of February, 1933.

“Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Honington and Sapiston duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and

Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Honington and Sapiston are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend William Henry Illingworth under the authority of a Dispensation:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said William Henry Illingworth (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Honington and the said Benefice of Sapiston shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Honington with Sapiston' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Henry Illingworth if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Honington and Sapiston shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Honington and Sapiston shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Honington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union, the Patron of the said Benefice of Sapiston shall have the first turn and the Patron of the said Benefice of Honington shall have the second and the third turns.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said

Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend George, Bishop

of Chichester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Pyecombe and Newtimber duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Chichester and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Chichester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Chichester embodies certain modifications thereof:

“And whereas the said Benefice of Newtimber is now full, the Reverend Guy Talbot Ritherdon being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Pyecombe is at present vacant:

“Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said George, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Guy Talbot Ritherdon (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“1. That the said Benefice of Pyecombe and the said Benefice of Newtimber shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Newtimber with Pyecombe’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Guy Talbot Ritherdon if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Newtimber shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“3. That upon the said union taking effect and pending the provision of a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice near the Parish Church of Pyecombe the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Newtimber shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Pyecombe and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the purpose of providing a new Parsonage House for the United Benefice as aforesaid and pending the application of such net proceeds to the purpose aforesaid, interest thereon shall be payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as

follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Pyecombe having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Newtimber having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“5. That upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice that is to say a sum of £5,000 Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock being part of a larger sum of such Stock at present held by the Governors of Queen Anne’s Bounty for the benefit of the said Benefice of Pyecombe shall be excepted out of the union and shall be held by the said Governors as to a sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. of such Stock for the benefit of the Benefice of Brighton, Saint Wilfrid, in the said Diocese of Chichester, and as to a sum of £1,666 13s. 4d. of such Stock for the benefit of the Benefice of Moulsecombe, Saint Andrew, in the said Diocese of Chichester.

“Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Chichester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby

And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Maidstone, and the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Maidstone, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Maidstone, and of the said New Parish of Saint Philip, Maidstone, which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme had been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices had been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections were so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Oxford was duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report as to the rearrangement of the said Benefices of Ardley with Fewcott and Stoke Lyne and the Benefice of Bucknell, situate in the said County and Diocese of Oxford, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Oxford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices of Ardley with Fewcott and Stoke Lyne and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Oxford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this

Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices of Ardley with Fewcott and Stoke Lyne which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Oxford embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Ardley with Fewcott and Stoke Lyne are now full, the Reverend James Edward Revington being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ardley with Fewcott and the Reverend Cecil Spencer being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Lyne:

"And whereas the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stoke Lyne, in right of his Vicarage, is alternate Patron of the said Benefice of Ardley with Fewcott:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Ardley with Fewcott and the said Benefice of Stoke Lyne shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Ardley, Fewcott and Stoke Lyne' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the other of the said two Benefices; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of that one of the said two Benefices which shall last be avoided after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend St. Clair George Alfred, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone, and the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone, in the County of Dorset and in the Diocese of Salisbury, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Parkstone, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of Saint Osmund, Parkstone, upon the north partly by the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Heatherlands, and partly by the New Parish

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published

in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

a further part of the said Benefice of Ipsley, all of which Benefices are situate in the Diocese of Worcester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Ernest, Bishop of Worcester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to hold an Inquiry concerning the said three Benefices of Redditch, Saint George; Ipsley; and Redditch, Saint Stephen, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Worcester and therein recommended the unions (1) of a part of the said Benefice of Ipsley to the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and (2) of a further part of the said Benefice of Ipsley to the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen, and the terms for effecting such unions and the said Bishop of Worcester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices of Redditch, Saint George; Ipsley; and Redditch, Saint Stephen; are now full, the Reverend Hubert Joseph Medd Hall being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, the Reverend Herbert Joseph Newton being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ipsley, and the Reverend Leonard Bradley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur, now Bishop of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consents of the said Hubert Joseph Medd Hall and Leonard Bradley (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and a part of the said Benefice of Ipsley, lying within the area of the Urban District of Redditch (all which part is particularly described in the First Schedule annexed to this Scheme) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Redditch, Saint George' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint George).

"2. That the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen, and a further part of the said Benefice of Ipsley, lying within the area of the Urban District of Redditch (all which part is particularly described in the Second Schedule annexed to this Scheme) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen).

"3. That the Church of the Parish of Redditch, Saint George, shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish of Redditch, Saint George, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Redditch, Saint George, shall (until revised or altered by proper

authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Redditch, Saint Stephen, shall be the Parish Church of the United Benefice and Parish of Redditch, Saint Stephen, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Redditch, Saint Stephen, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

"5. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Ipsley shall be vacant, then the said unions shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Ipsley shall be full then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Ipsley and in either case (a) the said Hubert Joseph Medd Hall if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and (b) the said Leonard Bradley if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen.

"6. That upon the said unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen.

"7. That after the said unions have taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and (b) the Patronage of the United Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen.

"8. That upon the unions taking effect all the Tithe rentcharges and all other the endowments other than glebe belonging to the said Benefice of Ipsley or which may hereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever after be chargeable in favour of the Incumbents for the time being of the said two United Benefices of Redditch, Saint George, and Redditch, Saint Stephen, respectively with the annual sums or yearly rentcharges hereinafter mentioned that is to say (1) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £75 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and (2) a clear annual sum or yearly rentcharge of £75 in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said United Benefice of Redditch, Saint Stephen; the same annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be as from the date of the said unions taking effect due and payable to the Incumbents of the said United Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, and Redditch, Saint Stephen, respectively, and the said annual sums or yearly rentcharges to be apportionable in each case between any outgoing Incumbent of either of the said United Benefices of Redditch, Saint George, and Redditch, Saint Stephen, or his representatives on

the one hand and his successor in the same Incumbency on the other hand and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour they are charged as aforesaid by equal half yearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in every year and for the recovery of the said yearly rentcharges in each case the Incumbents of the said United Benefices of Redditch, Saint George, and Redditch, Saint Stephen, and their successors shall have and be entitled to all the powers and remedies provided by Sections 121 and 122 of the Law of Property Act, 1925, in respect of rentcharges to which those Sections apply. Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Ipsley shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey and annex to the said United Benefices of Redditch, Saint George, and Redditch, Saint Stephen, or either of them, any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Ipsley which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Worcester for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for both or either of the said yearly rentcharges hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then in any case in which such equivalent provision shall have been made the corresponding annual sum or yearly rentcharge shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and be no longer payable. And provided further that if at the date when the unions shall take effect the revenues of the said Benefice of Ipsley shall be charged with a pension in favour of the said Herbert Joseph Newton then if and so long as the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ipsley shall be liable for the payment of any such pension amounting to £150 per annum or more the said two yearly rentcharges shall not become payable and if and so long as such Incumbent shall be liable for the payment of any such pension amounting to less than £150 per annum the said yearly rentcharges shall be reduced proportionately so that during such period the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ipsley shall not in respect of any such pension and in respect of the said two yearly rentcharges be liable for the payment of a total sum of more than £150 per annum or the amount of the pension if larger than £150.

"All that part of the said Benefice of Ipsley which lies within the area of the Urban District of Redditch and is situate to the east and north east of an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Benefice of Redditch, Saint George, from the said Benefice of Ipsley at the junction of Ipsley Street within Millsbro Road, and extending thence south eastwards along the

middle of Millsbro Road for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to its south eastern end and extending thence first south eastwards and then eastwards along the middle of the foot-path leading from the south eastern end of Millsbro Road to Holloway Lane for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the western side of Holloway Lane at a point just north of the Lodge Cottage of Ipsley Lodge and extending thence first eastwards to and then south eastwards along the middle of Holloway Lane for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to the southern boundary of the Urban District of Redditch, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured yellow.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objections, have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Worcester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

union shall forthwith take effect and the said Jack Leslie Sowden if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Worlington and Freckenham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Worlington and Freckenham shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Worlington shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice but in the event of the said Jack Leslie Sowden becoming the first Incumbent of the United Benefice as hereinbefore recommended and proposed then during the period of his Incumbency the said Jack Leslie Sowden shall be permitted to reside in the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Freckenham and so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect or after the avoidance of the United Benefice by the said Jack Leslie Sowden if he shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice as aforesaid the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Freckenham and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Worlington having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Freckenham having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS FOR THE NORMAL RECRUITMENT BY OPEN COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF PROBATIONARY ASSISTANT ENGINEERS (MALE) IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

N.B.—These regulations are liable to alteration from time to time. It is anticipated that competitions, when required, will normally be held annually in the spring of the year.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 20 and must not have attained the age of 25 on the 1st March of the year in which the competition is held.

In reckoning age for this purpose a candidate may deduct any time, up to a maximum of two years, which he has spent in an approved engineering works; and candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

Assistant Traffic Superintendents in the Post Office who are otherwise eligible, or who after three years' approved service in the Traffic Branch receive a nomination by the Engineer-in-Chief, may be granted an extension of age in respect of the period of their employment on traffic work in the Post Office, up to a maximum of five years, inclusive of any extension claimed for time spent in an approved engineering works.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a

natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent, cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Applications for admission to a competition for these appointments must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint; an application cannot be recorded until a competition has been announced.

5. The Civil Service Commissioners will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancies which it may be desired to fill on any one occasion.

6. In order to be eligible for appointment a candidate must normally either have passed an examination qualifying for an honours degree in engineering or possess qualifications equivalent in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners, or in the case of a man serving in the Post Office must have a nomination from the Postmaster-General. Exceptionally a candidate may be admitted who has passed an examination qualifying him for an honours degree and possesses high qualifications of a suitable character in physics. All candidates other than those nominated are expected to have taken a full course at an institution of university rank. Higher National Certificates will not be regarded as equivalent to degrees.

A candidate who is in the last year of his degree course and is taking his final examination in the summer of the year in which the competition is held may be admitted to compete; but such a candidate will not be eligible for an appointment unless at his final examination in the summer of the year in which the competition is held he attains the standard of an honours degree, and no steps will be taken for his appointment until the result of that examination is known.

7. When the list of applications in respect of a competition has been closed, the credentials of all the candidates will be examined by the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if they so desire, invite the assistance of officers of the General Post Office; and those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications. The decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Board will be constituted by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the authorities

of the General Post Office, who will be represented on the Board.

8. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Postmaster-General.

9. A fee of 5s. will be required from every candidate applying for admission to a competition; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £4 15s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £5, will be required from every candidate selected for appointment, before the issue of the certificate of qualification for appointment.

10. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons unacquainted with their work will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, in the Forces, or otherwise.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice of a competition to be held under the foregoing Regulations.

The number of appointments to be made on the result of this competition will be not less than 3, provided so many candidates are recommended by the Selection Board as fully qualified.

No person will be considered from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 16th March, 1933, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

The date on which the Selection Board will meet (probably about Easter, 1933) will depend upon the number of applications received.
