WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of *March*, 1928, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to declare what land within Northern Rhodesia should be Crown Land and Native Reserves respectively and to confirm certain alienations of land within Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas it was further declared that the expression "Native Reserves" should mean the lands set apart by the said Order (and described in the Schedule thereto) for the sole and exclusive use of the Natives of Northern Rhodesia and any lands which might thereafter be constituted Native Reserves by any Order in Council amending or adding to the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of *January*, 1929, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, was amended by the addition thereto of the several Native Reserves set out in the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

And whereas the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, and the Schedule thereto have been amended from time to time and in particular by an Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of *March*, 1931, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1931:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment Order in Council, 1933.

2. The Schedule to the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, as amended as aforesaid, is hereby further amended as follows:

(a) The description of the Ila-Tonga Reserve set out in Item XIII of the said Schedule is hereby cancelled and the following description substituted therefor:

XIII.—ILA-TONGA RESERVE.

Boundaries:—

Commencing at the confluence of the *Musa River* with the *Kafue River* the boundary follows the western boundary of the Northern Copper Company's mineral grant to the south-west corner beacon thereof, thence a line in a southerly direction to the north-west beacon of *Nanzela Mission Farm No. 207a*, including 2,000 acres on the western side of that line

surrounding the village of *Shezongo*, thence along the northern and eastern boundaries of *Nanzela Mission Farm* to its south-eastern beacon on the *Nanzela River*, thence a straight line in a southerly direction to *Dundumwense Hill*, thence a straight line in an easterly direction to *Siakaunda Hill*, thence in a south-easterly direction to the junction of the *Simakoya Stream* with the *Chechekwenkwe Stream*, thence up the *Chechekwenkwe Stream* to its source, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the source of the *Mbabala Stream*, thence down that stream to the south-west corner beacon of *Farm No. 35a*, thence along the west and north-west boundaries of that farm to the most westerly beacon of *Farm No. 36a*, thence along the north-west boundary of that farm to the most southerly beacon of *Farm No. 598*, thence along the western boundary of that farm to its most northerly beacon, thence along the south-west, north-west, and northern boundaries of *Farm No. 64a*, to its most easterly beacon, thence along the eastern boundary of *Farm No. 37a*, to the north-west corner beacon of *Farm No. 56a*, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the north-east corner beacon thereof, on the *Mahumba River*, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the most westerly beacon of *Farm No. 8a*, thence along the north-west boundary of that farm to the most westerly beacon of *Farm No. 256a*, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of *Farm No. 258a*, thence along the north-eastern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of *Farm No. 260a*, thence along the eastern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of *Farm No. 262a*, thence along the north-eastern boundary of that farm to the most northerly beacon of *Farm No. 7a*, thence along the northern boundary of *Farm No. 6a* to the north-western beacon of *Farm No. 267a*, thence along the northern boundary of that farm to the railway strip, thence northwards along the railway strip to the south-east corner beacon of *Farm No. 513* at *Monze Siding*, thence along the southern boundary of that farm to the south-west corner beacon thereof, thence along the southern boundary of *Farm No. 276a* to the north-east corner beacon of *Farm No. 512*, thence along the south-eastern and western boundaries of that farm to its most westerly beacon, thence West along the Southern boundary of *Farm No. 276a* to its most westerly beacon, thence along its western boundary to the most westerly beacon of *Farm No. 588*, thence along the western boundaries of *Farms Nos. 588* and *587* to the north-west corner beacon of *Farm No. 587*, thence in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the most westerly beacon of *Farm No. 543*, thence along the north-west boundary of that farm to the *Magoye River*, thence down the *Magoye River* in a northerly direction till it loses itself in the *Kafue Flats*, thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the *Kafue River* at a point 15 miles east of *Lochinvar Ranch*, thence in a westerly direction up the *Kafue River* to *Lochinvar Ranch*, thence along the eastern, southern and western boundaries of *Lochinvar Ranch* to the north-west corner beacon thereof, thence eastwards down the *Kafue River* for a distance of four miles, thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to a point 6 miles south-west of the

north-western beacon of Farm No. 570, thence north-westwards in a straight line to a point on the Chibila Stream one mile south of the crossing of the old Mumbwa-Namwala mail path, thence in a straight line north-westwards to Chalobeti Hill, thence in a straight line south-westwards to Chinenga Old Boma, thence in a straight line westwards to the confluence of the Mwendwa Stream with the Kafue River, thence down the Kafue River to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries defined above but excluded from the Reserve are:—

Farm No. 445a, Macha Mission, 3,003 acres in extent, situated on the Macha Stream.

Farm No. 184a, Mapanza Mission, 97 acres in extent, situated on the Munyeye River.

Farm No. 185a, Shakashina Mission, 22 acres in extent, situated on the Munyeye River.

Farm No. 192a, Kasenga Mission, 1,436 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River.

Farm No. 191a, Ibamba Ranch, 6,003 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River, and Farm No. 712, Ibamba Ranch Extension, 1,998 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River.

Namwala Township, 2,000 acres in extent, situated on the Kafue River.

Monze Aerodrome (provisional), 1,000 acres, unsurveyed.

(b) The following new Reserve is added to the said Schedule:

XVII.—LUBA RESERVE.

Boundaries:—

Starting at the confluence of the Mwendwa Stream with the Kafue River the boundary passes in a straight line eastwards to Chinenga Old Boma, thence in a straight line north-eastwards to Chalobeti Hill, thence in a straight line south-eastwards to a point on the Chibila Stream one mile south of the crossing of the old Mumbwa-Namwala mail path, thence in a straight line south-eastwards to a point 6 miles south-west of the north-western beacon of Farm No. 570, thence in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to a point on the Kafue River 4 miles east of the north-west corner beacon of Lochinvar Ranch, thence eastwards down the Kafue River to the north-east corner beacon of Lochinvar Ranch, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the junction of the Nangoma River with the Namwagu Lagoon, thence in an easterly direction along the Namwagu Lagoon to the south-west corner beacon of the Blue Lagoon Ranch, Farm No. 570, thence along the western boundary of that ranch to its north-west corner beacon, thence in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to Chalobeti Hill, thence in a straight line westwards to a point on the Nansenga River due east of Mwako Hill, thence in a northerly direction up the Nansenga River to its junction with the Kachereka Stream to its source, thence a straight line in a westerly direction to the junction of the Nangomba Stream with the Kafue River, thence down the Kafue River in a southerly direction to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries defined above but excluded from the Reserve is:—

Farm No. 557, Namantombwa Mission, 784 acres in extent, situated on the Nangoma River.

3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

4. This Order shall come into operation forthwith and shall be published in the Northern Rhodesia Gazette and the Governor or other Officer for the time being Administering the Government of the Territory of Northern Rhodesia shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary direction herein accordingly.

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Saint John the Evangelist, Broughton, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Broughton, is vested in Legh Algernon Clowes, of Norbury Hall, Ashbourne, in the County of Derby, Lord of the Manor of Broughton, John William Green, of Number 67, Wellington Street West, Higher Broughton, Manchester, in the said County of Lancaster, Builder, Walter Crookell, of Number 15, Howe Street, Higher Broughton, Manchester, aforesaid, Esquire, the

Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and Sidney Percy Bailey, of Number 96, Devonshire Street, Higher Broughton, Manchester, aforesaid, Commercial Traveller, as Trustees upon the trusts declared in a Statutory Declaration bearing date the 5th day of October, 1839, and the said Legh Algernon Clowes, John William Green, Walter Crookell, Guy, Bishop of Manchester and Sidney Percy Bailey are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Legh Algernon Clowes, John William Green, Walter Crookell, Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and Sidney Percy Bailey are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Broughton, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Manchester for the time being:

"And whereas the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, acting as such Bishop, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Broughton, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Broughton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consents of the said Legh Algernon Clowes, John William Green, Walter Crookell and Sidney Percy Bailey, being the persons whose consents are required together with that of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, as Patrons, by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist, Broughton, shall be transferred to the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 12th day of January, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Edlaston and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Osmaston by Ashbourne, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Derby:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Edmund, Bishop of Derby, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Edlaston and Osmaston by Ashbourne duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Derby and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Derby signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne is now full, the Reverend Horace Valentine Titmuss being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Edlaston is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edmund, Bishop of Derby (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme),

do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Edlaston and the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Osmaston with Edlaston' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Edlaston and the then Incumbent of Osmaston by Ashbourne shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Edlaston only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Edlaston shall have been instituted to Edlaston subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Edlaston before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Edlaston following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Osmaston by Ashbourne having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Edlaston having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make an alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Derby has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Derby.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Felsham and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Gedding, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Felsham and Gedding duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including the transfer of a detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gedding to the Parish of the said Benefice of Felsham, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas both of the said Benefices of Felsham and Gedding are now full, being held in plurality by the Reverend Canon Joseph Hind under the authority of a Dispensation:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Joseph Hind (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Felsham and the said Benefice of Gedding shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘ The United Benefice of Felsham with Gedding ’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Joseph Hind if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Felsham and Gedding shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents’ Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his

tenure of the said Benefices of Felsham and Gedding shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Felsham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gedding and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, that in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice after the union the Patrons of the said Benefice of Gedding shall have the first turn and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Felsham shall have the second and the third turns.

“ 5. That upon the union taking effect all that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Gedding which is comprised within the area of the Civil Parish of Felsham shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Felsham.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by Guy Aldous, Esquire, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 9th April, 1932:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee, having taken the said appeal into consideration reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be affirmed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 7th day of February, 1933, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

“Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, and the said Parish of West Derby are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, and of the said Parish of West Derby, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, and of the said Parish of West Derby which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of the Holy Spirit, Knotty Ash.’

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“The District of the Holy Spirit, Knotty Ash, comprising:—

“I. All that portion of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon part of the south west and upon the east by the New Parish of Roby, upon the north by the Parish
