“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Mirfield, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Wakefield :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Mirfield is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Joshua Lister Ingham, of Wighill Park, in the County of York, Esquire :

“ And whereas the said Joshua Lister Ingham is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Mirfield now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Wakefield for the time being :

“ And whereas the Right Reverend James Buchanan, now Bishop of Wakefield, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary, he, the said James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned :

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Mirfield which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Mirfield :

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Joshua Lister Ingham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the

whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Mirfield, now vested in him, the said Joshua Lister Ingham as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said James Buchanan, Bishop of Wakefield, and by his successors in the said Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of January, 1933, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for amending two Orders of Her said late Majesty in Council relating to the Prebend of Shipton-under-Wychwood, in the Cathedral Church of Salisbury :

“ Whereas, under the provisions of the said Act, an Order was made by Her said late Majesty in Council dated the 17th day of July, 1851, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of August following, setting forth and ratifying a Scheme prepared by us for vesting in us, for the purposes of the said Act, the property then forming the endowment of the said Prebend of Shipton-under-Wychwood, being a prebend permanently annexed to a professorship, namely the Professorship of Civil Law in the University of Oxford (now in the Patronage of Your Majesty and Your

Successors), and substituting for the same a money payment to the future holders thereof; and it was by the same Order in Council provided that all the lands, Tithes, and other hereditaments situate in the Parish of Shipton-under-Wychwood, in the County of Oxford, or in the Townships or Hamlets of Ascott-under-Wychwood, Ramsden, Leaffield, Milton, and Lyneham, in the same County, then belonging to the said Prebend (excepting any right of Ecclesiastical Patronage) should be transferred to and become vested in us, and that the net annual proceeds of the said lands, Tithes, and hereditaments should be carried in our books to the credit of a fund to be called the Shipton Fund to be held by us in trust to be applied as follows, that is to say; that there should, as a primary charge upon such fund, be paid by us thereout by equal half-yearly payments, on the 1st day of May and the 1st day of November in every year, to the Professor of Civil Law, in the University of Oxford, for the time being, the annual sum of one hundred pounds, and that the remainder of such fund in each year should be divided and distributed in the manner stated in the said Order:

"And whereas by a further Order of Her said late Majesty in Council dated the 28th day of July, 1856, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of August following, ratifying a Scheme prepared by us for amending the said Order in Council of the 17th day of July, 1851, it was directed that the provisions of such last mentioned Order relating to the manner of division and distribution of the remainder of the Shipton Fund (after providing for the above-mentioned annual payment of one hundred pounds to the Professor of Civil Law, in the University of Oxford) should be altered and amended so that such remainder should be divided into twenty-three equal parts and that there should be paid by us to the Vicar of Shipton-under-Wychwood for the time being three of such parts, to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the Chapelries or Districts of Ascott, Leaffield and Ramsden respectively, four of such parts and to the Incumbent or Perpetual Curate of the ecclesiastical District Church of Milton-cum-Lyneham eight of such parts:

"And whereas by a further Order of Her said late Majesty in Council dated the 16th day of July, 1895, and published in the London Gazette on the 23rd day of the same month a District Chapelry under the name of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Milton-under-Wychwood, was assigned to the aforementioned district Church of Milton-cum-Lyneham:

now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of the said Professorship of Civil Law in the University of Oxford (in testimony of which consent he, the said James Ramsay MacDonald has signed and sealed this Scheme), with the consent of Francis de Zulueta, D.C.L., the present holder of the said Professorship (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), with the consents of the Reverend Ernest Charles Freeman, the Reverend Arthur Harold James, the Reverend Caleb Nightingale, the Reverend Philip Edward Twamley, and the Reverend Norman Hayward, the present Incumbents respectively of the said Benefices of Shipton-under-Wychwood, Ascott, Leaffield, Ramsden, and Milton-under-Wychwood (in testimony of which consents they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Right Reverend Thomas, Bishop of Oxford, as the Patron in right of his See of each of the above-mentioned Benefices (in testimony of which consent he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that the said Orders in Council of the 17th day of July, 1851, and of the 28th day of July, 1856, shall be altered and amended so that as from the 1st day of November, 1930, the provisions thereof which relate to the Shipton Fund shall cease to have effect and that thenceforth the net annual proceeds of the lands, Tithes and hereditaments formerly belonging to the said Prebend of Shipton-under-Wychwood shall be carried to and form part of our Common Fund and that as from the said 1st day of November, 1930, there shall be charged upon, and payable by us out of our Common Fund (1) by equal half-yearly payments on the 1st day of May, and the 1st day of November, in every year to the Professor of Civil Law in the University of Oxford the annual sum of one hundred pounds, and (2) by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August, and the 1st day of November in every year to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shipton-under-Wychwood the annual sum of £126, to each of the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Ascott, Leaffield and Ramsden the annual sum of £168 and to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Milton-under-Wychwood the annual sum of £336.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

REPORT OF THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

PENCILS AND PENCIL STRIPS.

With reference to the notice which was published in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes of the 22nd July, 1932, regarding a reference made by the Board of Trade to the Standing Committee under the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, in respect of imported goods of the following descriptions:—

(a) pencils consisting of strips made wholly or partly of graphite, carbon, chalk, gypsum, talc, colours or dyestuffs, encased in wood, paper, or other materials, but not including propelling pencils;

(b) strips of the descriptions set out above including those for propelling and other mechanical pencils,

the Board of Trade hereby give notice, in accordance with the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section 7, that a Report has been made by the Committee in respect of the aforesaid descriptions of goods.

6. The superintendent registrars of the existing districts of Builth, Clun and Leominster shall respectively be the superintendent registrars of those districts as extended or constituted by this Order.

7. The registrar of the existing Clun sub-district of the Clun district shall be the registrar of that sub-district as extended by this Order.

8. The registrar of the existing Leintwardine sub-district of the Ludlow district shall be the registrar of the Leintwardine sub-district as constituted by this Order.

9. The registrar of the existing Treflis sub-district of the Builth district shall be the

registrar of the Builth sub-district as altered by this Order.

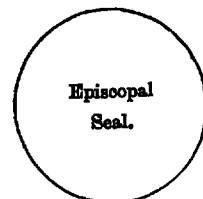
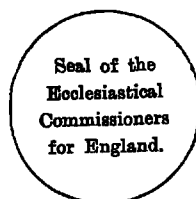
