cannot attain six years' seniority in that rank before reaching the age for compulsory retirement, but we consider that he is nevertheless deserving of promotion, and we desire to promote him accordingly:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the promotion of Mr. Carson to Chief Officer, Permanent Cruiser Service, with effect from the 13th day of April, 1933, notwithstanding that he has not completed the prescribed qualifying service as Senior Mate.

Admiralty, dated the 3rd day of May, 1933 (C.W. 3084/33), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 26th May, 1925, 7th May, 1928, and 8th August, 1932, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to sanction the payment of certain allowances to Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines of or below the rank of Lieutenant Commander and Captain respectively, while attached to Your Majesty's Royal Air Force for service with the Fleet Air Arm:

“And whereas it is now necessary to make provision for the payment of allowances to Commissioned Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines of the rank of Commander and Major respectively, while attached to Your Majesty's Royal Air Force for service with the Fleet Air Arm:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the regulations contained in the annexed Schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“SCHEDULE.

“1. Any Commander, R.N., or Major, R.M., holding an appointment appropriate to the rank of Squadron Leader or Wing Commander, R.A.F., ashore or afloat, to receive an allowance corresponding to any duty allowance (e.g., Command Pay), which would be given to a Squadron Leader or Wing Commander, R.A.F., in the same post.

“2. Except when in receipt of the above allowance, the sum of 3s. 6d. a day to be paid to Officers after promotion to Commander, R.N., or Major, R.M.—

(a) Continuously, when they are under definite and continuous liability to fly during periods of attachment to the Royal Air Force;

(b) On each day when an ascent is made as pilot to carry out practice flights, during periods of general service, payment to be limited to 12 days annually, except as provided in (c);

(c) If serving at the Admiralty, on each day when an ascent is made as pilot to carry out a practice flight, without limit to the number of days on which such flying is carried out.

“3. The above regulations to take effect from the 1st April, 1933.”

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date the 17th day of May, 1920, to approve payment under certain conditions of Tropical Allowance at the rate of 1s. 6d. a day to all Engine Room, Officers' and Ship's Cook ratings (including Maltese, but excluding native ratings):

“And whereas by Your Order in Council of the 13th day of October, 1920, Your Majesty sanctioned payment to ratings other than Engine Room, Officers' and Ship's Cook ratings, when continuously employed and doing a full day's duty under the conditions applicable to the ratings for whom payment was already authorized, and in respect of employment in the interiors of Submarines:

“And whereas by Your Order in Council of the 24th day of June, 1912, Your Majesty sanctioned payment of extra pay at increased rates for work in confined spaces in the tropics:

“And whereas we are of opinion that payment of tropical allowance should be further extended, and that payment for work in confined spaces in the tropics should be reduced when tropical allowance is paid concurrently:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following proposals, viz. :—

I. That tropical allowance be paid subject to our discretion to—

(i) Ratings employed as Switchboard Watchkeepers in “C,” “D” and “E” class Cruisers and H.M.S. Eagle.

(ii) The Ordnance Artificer, the rating qualified in Ordnance, and the Torpedo rating in the turrets of 8-inch gun Cruisers, when employed for a full day on refitting work.

(iii) The Blacksmith and Blacksmith's Mate in Ormonde class surveying ships, when employed in the blacksmith's shop situated in the after boiler uptake, when steam is raised in the after boiler.

(iv) Ratings regularly employed in compartments or spaces not covered by any prescribed definition in which conditions are unsatisfactory and comparable with those for which payment of the allowance is already authorized.

II. That extra pay for work in confined spaces in the tropics be restricted to the non-

tropical rate for ratings in receipt of tropical allowance concurrently.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And whereas by the Supreme Court of Judicature (Consolidation) Act, 1925 (hereinafter called the Consolidation Act) the said Supreme Court of Judicature Act, 1873, was repealed:

And whereas by Section 53 of the Consolidation Act it is enacted that His Majesty may from time to time by Order in Council on a report or recommendation made, with the concurrence of the Lord Chancellor, by the Council of the Judges of the Supreme Court

assembled in pursuance of the provisions of Part X of the Consolidation Act make, revoke or modify Orders regulating the Vacations to be observed by the High Court and the Court of Appeal and in the offices of the said Courts respectively:

And whereas at a Council of the Judges of the Supreme Court assembled in pursuance of the provisions of Part X of the Consolidation Act at the House of Lords on Monday, the 27th day of March, 1933, and continued by adjournment on Friday, the 31st day of March, 1933, it was resolved as follows:—

"The Judges of the Supreme Court in Council assembled recommend that an Order in Council be issued whereby the Long Vacation for the year 1933 be shortened so that the Michaelmas Sittings of 1933 shall commence on Monday, 2nd October."

And whereas the Lord Chancellor concurs in this recommendation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

(1) That the Michaelmas Sittings of the Court of Appeal and of the High Court of Justice shall in the year 1933 commence on the 2nd day of October and that the Long Vacation of the several Courts and offices of the Supreme Court shall for all purposes terminate on the 1st day of October in the same year.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Long Vacation (1933) Order, 1933.

**W**HEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1925, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order 1927, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1928, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 3) Order, 1930, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1932, and the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1932, amending the first-mentioned Order:

And whereas it is expedient that the first-mentioned Order as so amended (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it is necessary on account of the urgency of the matters dealt with by this

Order that this Order should come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (3) of Article nine of the principal Order:—

“(3) Whenever an aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland is carrying passengers for hire or reward—

(a) the owner of the aircraft shall cause to be exhibited and kept exhibited in a conspicuous place in the aircraft a legible notice stating whether and to what extent smoking is permitted in the aircraft; and

(b) no person shall smoke in the aircraft unless, or except in so far as, smoking is stated by the notice to be permitted.

No notice exhibited in an aircraft for the purpose of the foregoing provisions of this paragraph shall state that smoking is permitted therein unless, or except in so far as, smoking therein is authorised by the aircraft's certificate of airworthiness or by the permission in writing of the Secretary of State.

No person shall smoke in an aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland when it is not carrying passengers for hire or reward unless, or except in so far as, smoking therein is authorised by the aircraft's certificate of airworthiness or by the permission in writing of the Secretary of State.”

2. The following paragraph shall be inserted at the end of Article nine of the principal Order:—

“(5) Subject to the provisions of this paragraph, when an aircraft is flying within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, no person shall at any time be carried on the wings or undercarriage of the aircraft, or on or in any other part thereof which is not designed for the accommodation of the personnel or passengers, or on or in anything attached to the aircraft:

Provided that—

(a) nothing in this paragraph shall prevent a person having temporary access—

(i) to any part of the aircraft for the purpose of executing repairs to the aircraft or adjusting the machinery or equipment thereof or for the purpose of doing anything which may be necessary for the safety of the aircraft or persons or goods carried therein; or

(ii) to any part of the aircraft in which goods or stores are being carried and to which proper means of access is provided; and

(b) a person may be carried on or in any part of the aircraft, or anything attached thereto, with the permission in writing of the Secretary of State and subject to any conditions which may be attached to that permission.”

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) Order, 1933.

(2) This Order shall come in operation provisionally as from the date hereof in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Rules Publication Act, 1893.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of March, 1928, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, was pleased to declare what land within Northern Rhodesia should be Crown Land and Native Reserves respectively and to confirm certain alienations of land within Northern Rhodesia:

And whereas it was further declared that the expression “Native Reserves” should mean the lands set apart by the said Order (and described in the Schedule thereto) for the sole and exclusive use of the Natives of Northern Rhodesia and any lands which might thereafter be constituted Native Reserves by any Order in Council amending or adding to the said Order:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of January, 1929, and known as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928, was amended by the addition thereto of the several Native Reserves set out in the Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

And whereas the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, and the Schedule thereto have been amended from time to time:

And whereas in particular on the 18th day of January, 1930, the boundaries of the Reserve numbered I in the said Schedule to the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, were adjusted by the Governor of Northern Rhodesia in exercise of the power conferred on him by the Northern Rhodesia (Crown Lands and Native Reserves) Order in Council, 1928:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Schedule to the said Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Amendment (No. 2) Order in Council, 1933.

2. The Schedule to the Northern Rhodesia (Native Reserves) Supplemental Order in Council, 1929, as amended as aforesaid, is hereby further amended as follows:

(a) by the deletion of the description of the Lamba-Lima Reserve set out in Item I of the said Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following description:

I.—LAMBA-LIMA RESERVE.

Boundaries:—

Commencing at the south-west corner beacon of Chondwe Siding Reserve, the boundary

passes along the southern boundary of that Reserve to the railway strip, thence down the railway strip to the Kafulafuta River, thence down that river to the junction with the Luankuni River, thence up the Luankuni River to its source, thence in a westerly direction along the watershed between the Kafue and Lukanga Rivers to the source of the Ipumbu River and down that River to its confluence with the Kafue River, thence down the Kafue River to its confluence with the Luswishi River, thence up the Luswishi River to its junction with the Mininga River and thence in a straight line due west to the boundary of the Ndola Sub-District, thence northwards along the watershed of the Lunga and Luswishi Rivers to the source of the Luawona Stream and down that Stream to its confluence with the Luswishi River, thence down the Luswishi River to its junction with the Muchema River, thence up the Muchema River to its confluence with the Luambowo Stream and up the Luambowo Stream to its source, thence in a straight line in an easterly direction to the Chinemu Stream and down that Stream to the Lufwanyama River, thence down that River to its junction with the Katembula River, thence in a straight line due east to the source of the Kalulushi River and down that River to the Kafue River, thence down the Kafue River to the Mpata Gorge, thence in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the junction of the Luanshya Stream with the Kafuu River thence up the Kafuu River for about one mile to the western boundary of Farm No. 866 Roan Antelope Pumping Station site thence in a southerly direction along that boundary through beacon A 154 (which is the south-western beacon of the aforesaid Farm 866) to a point 440 yards from the Kafuu River thence in an easterly direction for a distance of one mile parallel more or less with the Kafuu River and about 440 yards therefrom thence in a northerly direction to the Kafuu River and up the Kafuu River to the "Big" Munkulungwe River, thence up the "Big" Munkulungwe River for four miles and from there in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries defined above but excluded from the Reserve:

Kafulafuta Mission (unsurveyed) 246 acres in extent, situated at the confluence of the Kafulafuta and Kafuu Rivers.

(b) by the deletion of the description of the Luano-Lala Reserve set out in Item V of the said Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following description:

#### V.—LUANO-LALA RESERVE.

##### *Boundaries:—*

Commencing at the confluence of the Mlembo River with the Lukasashi River, the boundary follows the Lukasashi River southwards to the north-east beacon of Farm No. 726, thence it follows the northern and western boundaries of that farm to the Lunsemfwa River, thence down the Lunsemfwa River to its confluence with the Luangwa River, thence in a westerly direction along the Muchinga escarpment to the Muchinga River at the point where it goes through the escarpment, thence in a straight line south-west to Changali Hill; thence in a straight line westwards to Kasokwe Hill; thence in a straight line north-west to beacon

No. V.11 the south-east corner beacon of Farm No. 695 Fig Trees; thence along the eastern boundary of that farm to beacon No. V.17; thence in a north-easterly direction along the eastern boundaries of the proposed farms marked D 372 and D 374 on the maps accompanying the report of the Agricultural Survey Commission of 1930 to the north-east corner of the latter farm; thence along the northern boundary of this farm to beacon No. V.91, the south-east corner beacon of Farm No. 696 Chipembi Mission, thence along the eastern and northern boundaries of that farm to the north-west corner beacon, thence a straight line in a westerly direction to the junction of the Kamano Stream with the Kalangwa River, thence a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the junction of the Muyama Stream with the Mwomboshi River, thence up the Muyama Stream to the southern side of the Chikonkomene Hills, thence a straight line due east to the Lombwa Stream, thence down the Lombwa Stream to the Mwomboshi River and then down the Mwomboshi River to its junction with the Mulungushi River and down the Mulungushi River to the Muchinga escarpment, thence along the Muchinga escarpment in an easterly direction to the north-western beacon of Farm No. 216a on the Mlenge River, thence along the western and southern boundaries of the farm to its south-eastern beacon on the Lunsemfwa River, thence up the Lunsemfwa River to the north-eastern beacon of the farm, thence along the Muchinga escarpment in an easterly direction to the source of the Fitete Stream, thence in a north-east and northerly direction through Namwami Hill along the watershed between the Mkushi River and the Chipawa, Tumbwe, and Kampoko Rivers to the old Government Station on the Mkushi River, thence up the Mkushi River to its junction with the Lesser Mkushi River, thence up the Lesser Mkushi River to its junction with Luanga River and then up the Luanga River to its source, thence a straight line to the source of the Amankanda Stream, thence down the Amankanda Stream to its junction with the Inambo River and then down the Inambo River to its junction with the Mlembo River and down the Mlembo River to the point of starting.

Included within the boundaries defined above but excluded from the Reserve:

Farm No. 217a, Formoshi, 2,060 acres in extent, situated on the Formoshi River.

Farm No. 94a, Chingombe, 1,004 acres in extent, situated on the Chingombe River.

Fiwila Mission (unsurveyed), 150 acres in extent, situated on the Fiwila Stream.

(c) by the deletion of the description of the Lenje Reserve set out in Item VI of the said Schedule and the substitution therefor of the following description:

#### VI.—LENJE RESERVE.

##### *Boundaries:—*

Commencing at the confluence of the Ipumbu River with the Kafue River, the boundary follows the Ipumbu River eastwards to its source, thence a straight line in a southerly direction to the source of the Musipashi River and down that river to its junction with the Lukanga River, thence up the Lukanga River in an easterly direction to its junction with the Kalenda Stream, thence up the Kalenda

Stream to its source, thence a straight line to Lupumba Hill, thence in a southerly direction along the watershed between the Mulungushi River and the Lukanga Swamp to the north-west corner beacon of Mr. J. Harrison Clark's farm (Permit of Occupation No. 516 being extension of Permit of Occupation No. 496), thence along the west boundary of Mr. Harrison Clark's farm to the Munga River, thence eastwards along the Munga River to the north-western beacon of Farm No. 135a, thence along the western boundary of that farm to the Broken Hill-Lusaka Road, and thence to a point to the south of and adjoining Chamunkula Pool in a straight line passing through the north-western end of the Mukamwanji Hills, thence in a straight line to the source of Kalola Stream; thence down the Kalola Stream to its confluence with the Kembe Stream; thence in an easterly direction through Tundwe Hill, Nkanda Hill and Chikombwe Hills to the source of the Karubwe River and down that river to the railway strip, thence southwards along the railway strip and the alternate square mile railway farms to the northern boundary of Farm No. 375a, thence along the north, west and south boundaries of that farm to the western boundary of the Railway Farm at Ngwerere Siding, thence along the western and southern boundaries of that farm to the railway strip, thence southwards along the railway strip and the alternate square mile railway farms to a point on the railway strip opposite the south-western beacon of Farm No. 441a Roma on the east side of the railway, thence in a straight line to the source of the Chunga River, thence westwards down the Chunga River to the elbow where it turns northwards near the junction of the Chitumbwe Stream, thence a straight line to the north-east corner beacon of Farm No. 190a on the Namayani Stream and down that Stream to the junction with the Mwembeshi River, thence down the Mwembeshi River to the junction with the Kabile Stream, thence up the Kabile Stream to its source, thence a straight line north-west to the source of the Lunjofwa River, thence north-west passing the sources of the Mafuta and Mundu Streams to the junction of the Mwapula Stream with the Musingashi River, thence a straight line to the source of the Kamwale Stream, thence a straight line to the Lukanga-Kafue confluence, thence northwards up the Kafue River to the junction of the Kasanga Stream, thence up the Kasanga Stream to its source on the Kafue-Lunga watershed; thence northwards along this watershed to a point due west of the Mininga-Luswishi confluence, thence in a straight line eastwards to the Mininga-Luswishi confluence; thence down the Luswishi River to its confluence with the Kafue River; thence up the Kafue River to the point of starting.

3. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council, may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

4. “ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Northfield and the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Northfield and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District one consecrated Church or Chapel known as the Church of Saint Michael and All Angels, Bartley Green, in use for the purposes of Divine Worship and it is intended that such Church or Chapel shall be used as a Chapel of Ease to the permanent Church which is to be erected within and for the said proposed District:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest William, Bishop of Birmingham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Northfield and of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Selly Oak, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Gabriel, Weoley Castle'.
