And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 15th day of November, 1933:—

“SCHEME FOR DETERMINING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE WARDS OF THE ROYAL BOROUGH OF KINGSTON-UPON-THAMES AND FOR APPORTIONING THE COUNCILLORS AMONG THE SAID WARDS IN PURSUANCE OF ORDER IN COUNCIL OF 26 JUNE 1933.

“I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

“*Hill Ward.*

“Commencing at a point in the centre of Queen Elizabeth Road immediately under the centre of the track of the Southern Railway (formerly Kingston Line of the London and South-Western Railway) thence northward along the centre of Queen Elizabeth Road to its junction with Canbury Park Road, thence westward along the centre of Canbury Park Road to its junction with Elm Road, thence northward along the centre of Elm Road to its junction with Shortlands Road, thence continuing northward along the centre of Shortlands Road to its junction with Cross Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Cross Road to its junction with Acre Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Acre Road to a point 135 feet south of the south-

east corner of the East Surrey Barracks, thence by a direct line northward to Latchmere Brook, thence continuing northward along the centre of Latchmere Brook to its junction with the boundary of the Borough, thence eastward, north-eastward, south-eastward, north-eastward, south-eastward, eastward and generally southward to the intersection of the Borough boundary with the track of the Southern Railway, thence north-westward and westward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Canbury Ward.

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the track of the Southern Railway at its intersection with the western boundary of the Borough, thence northward, north-westward, north-eastward, generally south-eastward, and eastward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with the western boundary of Hill Ward, thence southward, eastward and southward, following the western boundary of Hill Ward as hereinbefore defined to a point immediately over the centre of the track of the Southern Railway, thence westward along the centre of the track of the said Railway to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Norbiton Ward.

"Commencing at a point in the centre of the track of the Southern Railway at the junction of the Borough boundary with the southern boundary of Hill Ward, thence north-westward and westward, following the southern boundary of Hill Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with a point immediately over the centre of Queen Elizabeth Road, thence southward along the centre of Queen Elizabeth Road to its junction with London Road, thence eastward along the centre of London Road to its junction with Hawks Passage, thence southward along the centre of Hawks Passage to its junction with Fairfield Road, thence eastward along the centre of Fairfield Road to its junction with Tiffins School passage, thence southward along the centre of Tiffins School passage to its junction with Fairfield South, thence eastward along the centre of Fairfield South to its junction with Villiers Road, thence southward along the centre of Villiers Road to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence eastward, northward, and generally north-eastward, following the Borough boundary, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Town Ward.

"Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at its junction with the southern boundary of Canbury Ward, thence eastward following the southern boundary of Canbury Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the western boundary of Norbiton Ward, thence southward following the western boundary of Norbiton Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence generally south-westward, north-westward and northward following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

"Plan Delineating Boundaries.

"The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the Plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

"II.—APPORTIONMENT OF COUNCILLORS.

"The Councillors in office for each Ward as existing at the date of this Scheme shall be the Councillors for the Ward of the same name as altered by this Scheme.

"III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"1. If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs amongst the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been apportioned by this Scheme.

"2. If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at an election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to make such alteration or re-arrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election.

"I.—BOUNDARIES OF WARDS.

"*Drayton Ward.*

and northward along the centre of Midhurst Road, to its junction with Wyndham Road, thence north-eastward along the centre of Wyndham Road to its junction with Northcroft Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Northcroft Road to its junction with Bernard Avenue, thence north-eastward along the centre of Bernard Avenue to its junction with the western boundary of Manor Ward, thence southward, north-eastward and northward following the boundary of Manor Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the boundary of Grange Ward, thence north-eastward, south-eastward and north-eastward following the boundary of Grange Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough Boundary, thence south-eastward, south-westward, north-westward, south-westward, south-eastward, south-westward, north-westward, south-westward, north-westward and south-westward, following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Grosvenor Ward.

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Uxbridge Road at its junction with Grosvenor Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Grosvenor Road and continuing south-eastward along the centre of Seward Road to its junction with Elthorne Park Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Elthorne Park Road to its junction with Boston Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Boston Road to its junction with the boundary of Lammas Ward, thence north-eastward following the north-western boundary of Lammas Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the western boundary of Manor Ward, thence north-westward and northward following the western boundary of Manor Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the southern boundary of Drayton Ward in the centre of Uxbridge Road, thence westward following the southern boundary of Drayton Ward as hereinbefore defined and continuing westward along the centre of Uxbridge Road to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Hanwell South Ward.

" Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at its junction with the boundary of Lammas Ward in the centre of Boston Road, thence north-westward, north-eastward and north-westward, following the boundaries of Lammas Ward and Grosvenor Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction of the boundary of Grosvenor Ward with Uxbridge Road, thence westward along the centre of Uxbridge Road to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence generally southward, south-eastward and north-eastward following the Borough boundary to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Hanwell North Ward.

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Ruislip Road at its intersection with the western boundary of Drayton Ward, thence westward along the centre of Ruislip Road to the centre of the Bridge over the River Brent, thence generally southward along the centre of the River Brent to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence generally southward, eastward and southward following the

Borough boundary to its intersection with Uxbridge Road, thence eastward along the centre of Uxbridge Road to its junction with the western and southern boundaries of Drayton Ward, thence northward following the western boundary of Drayton Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Greenford South Ward.

" Commencing at a point in the centre of Western Avenue at its junction with the boundary of Mount Park Ward immediately over the centre of the River Brent, thence westward along the centre of Western Avenue to its junction with the old boundary between the parishes of Greenford and Northolt, thence southward following the said boundary to its junction with Ferrymead Avenue, thence eastward along the centre of Ferrymead Avenue to its junction with Eastmead Avenue, thence southward along the centre of Eastmead Avenue to its junction with Ruislip Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Ruislip Road to its junction with Allenby Road, thence southward along the centre of Allenby Road to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence southward and south-eastward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the western boundary of Hanwell North Ward, thence northward and eastward following the western and northern boundaries of Hanwell North Ward as hereinbefore defined to the junction of the boundary of Hanwell North Ward with the Western boundary of Drayton Ward, thence northward and generally eastward following the boundaries of Drayton Ward, Castlebar Ward and Mount Park Ward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Greenford North Ward.

" Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Brent at its junction with the northern and eastern boundaries of Greenford South Ward, thence generally eastward following the boundary of Mount Park Ward as hereinbefore defined to its junction with the Borough boundary, thence northward, westward, northward and generally north-westward following the Borough boundary to its junction with the old boundary between the parishes of Greenford and Northolt, thence south-westward following the said boundary to its junction with the northern boundary of Greenford South Ward, thence eastward following the northern boundary of Greenford South Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Northolt Ward.

" Commencing at a point on the Borough boundary at its junction with the northern and western boundaries of Greenford North Ward, thence north-westward, generally south-westward and generally south-eastward, following the Borough boundary to its junction with the western boundary of Greenford South Ward, thence generally north-eastward following the western boundaries of Greenford South Ward and Greenford North Ward as hereinbefore defined to the point of commencement aforesaid.

" Plan Delineating Boundaries.

" The boundaries of the Wards as above defined are delineated on the Plan annexed hereto, which forms part of the Scheme.

"In case of any discrepancy between the Wards as delineated on the plan and the textual description of the Wards as above set out, the textual description shall prevail.

"II.—APPORTIONMENT OF COUNCILLORS.

"The three Councillors respectively in office for each of the following Wards, namely, Drayton Ward, Castlebar Ward, Mount Park Ward, Grange Ward, Manor Ward, Lammas Ward, Grosvenor Ward, Hanwell South Ward and Hanwell North Ward, each as existing at the date of this Scheme, shall be the Councillors for the Ward of the same name as altered by this Scheme.

"The Councillors for Greenford South Ward shall be the three Councillors in office for Greenford Ward at the date of this Scheme.

"The Councillors for Greenford North Ward shall be three additional Councillors elected in accordance with this Scheme.

"The Councillors for Northolt Ward shall be the Councillor in office for that Ward at the date of this Scheme and two additional Councillors elected in accordance with this Scheme.

"III.—INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL AND SUPPLEMENTAL PROVISIONS.

"(1) (a) The election of the three additional Councillors for Greenford North Ward shall be held on Wednesday the 24th day of January, 1934, or such later date as may be fixed by the Secretary of State.

"(b) Subject to the provisions of this Scheme, the election shall be held in the same manner as elections to fill ordinary vacancies, provided that the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer at the election, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer an Alderman or a Councillor who is not registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

"(c) The Councillors elected in pursuance of this Scheme for Greenford North Ward shall come into office immediately after the election and shall go out of office as follows:—

(i) The Councillor who is elected by the smallest number of votes, on the 1st November, 1934;

(ii) The Councillor who is elected by the largest number of votes on the 2nd November, 1935;

(iii) The other Councillors on the 1st November, 1935.

"(d) If for any reason it is doubtful which of the Councillors elected in pursuance of this Scheme ought to retire in the year specified in paragraph (c), the question shall be determined at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election, by lot under the direction of the Mayor or the person presiding at that meeting.

"(2) The election of the additional Alderman made necessary by the election of the three additional Councillors for Greenford North Ward shall take place at the next meeting of the Council after the day of the election of the said three additional Councillors. The additional Alderman shall come into office immediately after the election, and shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Aldermen in the year 1935.

"(3) On the day of the election of the additional Alderman as above provided, the exist-

ing Aldermen and the said additional Alderman shall be respectively assigned by the Council as Returning Officers until the 9th day of November, 1934, at elections of Councillors for the several Wards of the Borough.

"(4) (a) On the ordinary day of election of Councillors in the year 1934, there shall be held an election of

(i) Eleven Councillors to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement of Councillors for each of the Wards, except Northolt Ward, due to go out of office in the year 1934.

(ii) Three Councillors for Northolt Ward, one to fill the vacancy caused by the retirement of the existing Councillor and two additional Councillors.

"(b) The Councillors to be elected in 1934 for Northolt Ward shall go out of office on the ordinary day of election of Councillors as follows: one in the year 1935, one in the year 1936 and one in the year 1937.

"The Councillor elected by the smallest number of votes shall go out of office in 1935, and the Councillor elected by the next smallest number of votes in the year 1936.

"(5) The additional Alderman to be elected for the Borough by reason of the election of the additional Councillors for Northolt Ward shall be elected on the 9th day of November, 1934. The Alderman so elected shall retire from office on the ordinary day of retirement of Aldermen in the year 1938.

"(6) If for any reason it is doubtful which of the additional Councillors or Aldermen, as the case may be, elected in pursuance of this Scheme, ought to retire in the year specified in this Scheme, the matter shall be determined by lot under the direction of the Mayor or other person presiding at the meeting, at the first or second meeting of the Council after the election of such additional Councillors or Aldermen.

"(7) In any Ward in which no existing Alderman is, in pursuance of this Scheme, assigned for the purpose of acting as Returning Officer at the election of Councillors, the Mayor shall be the Returning Officer, but he may appoint to act as Returning Officer another Alderman or Councillor not being a Councillor for that Ward and not being registered as a local government elector in respect of a qualification in that Ward.

"(8) If any vacancy exists at the date of the Order in Council approving this Scheme or thereafter occurs among the existing Councillors, an election to fill the vacancy shall be held for the Ward to which the Councillor whose death or retirement causes the vacancy has been appointed by this Scheme.

"(9) If the register of electors is not so framed as to show the local government electors entitled to vote at any election of Councillors of the Borough to be held for any of the Wards constituted by this Scheme, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk of the Borough to make such alteration or rearrangement of the register as may be necessary for the purpose of such election.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come:

GREETING!

Whereas His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual, bearing date the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine, institute and create a new medal to be styled the King's Police Medal:

And whereas the fifth and seventh clauses of the said Royal Warrant were amended by Warrants under Our Sign Manual bearing date respectively the third day of October, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen and the first day of October, one thousand nine hundred and thirty:

And whereas We are minded to make certain further amendments to the said Royal Warrant of the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine:

Now know ye that We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors abrogate the second, third, fifth and sixth clauses of the said Royal Warrant of the seventh day of July, one thousand nine hundred and nine, and the whole of the said Royal Warrant of the third day of October, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in lieu thereof We Ordain that the following clauses shall be substituted:

Secondly.—It is ordained that the King's Police Medal shall consist of a circular Medal of Silver with Our Effigy on the obverse, and shall bear on the reverse a design emblematic of Protection from danger and the words "For Gallantry" or "For Distinguished Service," as the case may be, and on the rim the name of the person to whom the Medal has been awarded.

Thirdly.—It is ordained that the Medal shall only be awarded to those of Our Faithful Subjects and others who, being members of a

recognised Police Force or of a properly organized Fire Brigade within Our Dominions or in Territories under Our Protection or Jurisdiction, have either performed acts of exceptional courage and skill or exhibited conspicuous devotion to duty; and that such award shall be made only on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department.

Fifthly.—It is ordained that each Medal shall be suspended from the left breast, and the riband, of an inch and three-eighths in width, shall be dark blue with a narrow silver stripe on either side and a similar silver stripe in the middle; and that in the case of awards for acts of exceptional courage each silver stripe of the riband shall contain a thin red line down the middle.

Sixthly.—It is ordained that any act of gallantry which is worthy of recognition by the award of the King's Police Medal, but is performed by one upon whom the Decoration has already been conferred, may, on a recommendation to Us by Our Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department, be recorded by a Bar attached to the riband by which the Medal is suspended. For every such additional act an additional Bar may be added and for each Bar awarded a small silver rose shall be added to the riband when worn alone.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1933.

The Minister of Health gives notice in pursuance of the above named Regulations that he hereby recognises for the purposes of items (a) and (c) of the Second Schedule to the Amendment Regulations, i.e.:—

- (a) A severed part of the carcase of an animal (including the head or any part thereof, and the whole carcase without the head, but not including any part of the carcase of a pig which has been salted, cured, pickled, dried or smoked or otherwise prepared in the manner in which bacon or ham is ordinarily prepared), from which no submaxillary, pre-scapular, pre-crural, superficial inguinal, supramammary, or popliteal gland has been taken out;

- (c) All edible parts of an animal other than (i) the head or other severed parts of the carcase, (ii) the intestines prepared in the form of sausage casings and (iii) meat which has before importation been made ready for human consumption in the form of a sausage or other prepared or manufactured article of food.

each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

The recognition applies only if the label is securely affixed to the meat, or to the package containing the meat, and if the label has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate.

The label hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from Southern Rhodesia is in substitution for the label of which particulars were given in the Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of 29th August, 1933.

(I) for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any house, building or other premises situate on or adjacent to the said roads, subject, in respect of London Street and Brigg Street to the additional restrictions referred to in paragraph "O" below.

(II) in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said roads, or the laying, alteration or repair in or near to the said roads of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

C. To prohibit the loading or unloading of heavy motor cars (as defined as aforesaid), motor cars with a seating capacity of more than seven persons exclusive of the driver, trailers with four or more wheels drawn by mechanical means, and horse drawn vehicles having an unladen weight of 15 cwt. or more in Brigg Street and London Street, Norwich, between the hours of 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. and between the hours of 3 p.m. and 5 p.m.

D. To prohibit the driving of all vehicles on the roads specified in Column 1 of Part II of the Schedule hereto otherwise than in the direction specified in the Second Column of that part of the said Schedule.
