The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made the Import Duties (Exemptions) (No. 1) Order, 1934, adding the following goods to the First Schedule to the Import Duties Act, 1932:—

1. Imitation diamonds of a size and shape adapted for use in articles of jewellery or imitation jewellery made of glass backed with paint or metal, not set or mounted, and not strung.
2. Nickel mass, consisting substantially of nickel hydroxide and graphite.
3. Cadmium mass, consisting substantially of finely divided metallic cadmium and iron partially oxidised.
