The following Statute made by the University of Oxford, on the 23rd day of January, 1934, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

## UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON  
TUESDAY, 23RD JANUARY, 1934.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the Statutes of the University of Oxford in order to define more exactly the scope of the Hope Professorship of Zoology: Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:

1. In *Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. i. § 3, Schedule B (Statuta, ed. 1933, p. 60, l. 10)*, after the word "Zoology" add the word "(Entomology)".
2. *Ibid. § 4, Schedule (p. 63, l. 2)*, after the word "Zoology" add the word "(Entomology)".
3. *Ibid. Sect. II. E. § 14 (p. 89, l. 1)*, after the word "Zoology" add the word "(Entomology)".
4. *Ibid. (l. 2)*, after the word "Zoology" insert the word "(Entomology)".

5. *Ibid. (l. 3)*, delete the words "private instruction in Zoology, with special reference to the articulata" and substitute the words "instruction in Zoology (Entomology)".

6. *Ibid. (l. 6)*, delete the words "annulose animals" and substitute the word "arthropoda".

7. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. III. § 2, Schedule, Biological Sciences (Statuta, ed. 1933, p. 133)*, after the word "Zoology" in the second place where it occurs insert the word "(Entomology)".

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Thomas Thomas in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 21st September, 1933, there was an in-rush of water in the Brass Vein Slant of the Brynamman Colliery, Glamorgan. Thomas, a collier who was working underground at the time, assisted, at the risk of his own life, a youth who had lost his lamp and who was unable,
