His Excellency Ali Fethi Bey, to present the letters of recall of his predecessor, His Excellency Mehmet Munir Bey, and his own letters of credence as Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary from the Turkish Republic.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Patrick Torley, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 8th September, 1933, at the United Steel Company's works at Workington, a man who was working in a bunker containing over 100 tons of iron ore was buried in ore up to his armpits, due to the ore slipping. His cries attracted Torley who was working in the vicinity. Torley summoned help, and went into the bunker and supported the buried man by placing his arms round him and standing with his back against a pile of ore. More help was forthcoming in about ten minutes; and Torley continued to support the man for a further period of forty minutes while the ore was being shovelled from around the buried man. At any time the ore might have shifted and buried both men.

#### WALLASEY CORPORATION TRAMWAYS (CESSER OF POWERS) ORDER, 1934.

WHEREAS the Wallasey Urban District Council were authorised by the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Act, 1899 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1899"), and the Wallasey Tramways and Improvements Act, 1909 (hereinafter referred to

as "the Act of 1909"), to construct and have constructed and opened for traffic certain tramways situate in the County Borough of Wallasey including the tramways described in the Schedule hereto and hereinafter referred to as "the abandoned tramways".

And whereas Part III of the Tramways Act, 1870, is incorporated with the Act of 1899 and the Act of 1909 and in the said Part III it is enacted by Section 41 *inter alia* as follows:—

"If at any time after the opening of any tramway in any district for traffic the promoters discontinue the working of such tramway, or of any part thereof, for the space of three calendar months (such discontinuance not being occasioned by circumstances beyond the control of such promoters, for which purpose the want of sufficient funds shall not be considered a circumstance beyond their control), and such discontinuance is proved to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade, the said Board, if they think fit, may by order declare that the powers of the promoters in respect of such tramway or the part thereof so discontinued shall, from the date of such order, be at an end, and thereupon the said powers of the promoters shall cease and determine, unless the same are purchased by the local authority in manner by this Act provided".

And whereas by virtue of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers and duties of the Board of Trade under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, have been transferred to the Minister of Transport.

And whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the County Borough of Wallasey (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") have applied to the Minister of Transport for an Order under the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, declaring that the powers of the Corporation (as successors to the Wallasey Urban District Council) in respect of the abandoned tramways shall be at an end and it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Minister of Transport that the working of the abandoned tramways has been discontinued for the space of three calendar months.

Now, therefore, the Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred on him by the said Section 41 of the Tramways Act, 1870, hereby orders and declares that the powers of the Corporation in respect of the abandoned tramways shall from the date of this Order be at an end.

This Order may be cited as the Wallasey Corporation Tramways (Cesser of Powers) Order, 1934.
