“Whereas by the twentieth section of an Act passed in the twenty-ninth year of Her late Majesty's reign, Chapter 89, entitled ‘The Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865,’ it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Admiralty shall, from time to time continue to appoint such Officers, Clerks and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

“And whereas, owing to the retirement of the present Director of Greenwich Hospital on the 12th October, 1934, it is necessary to fix the salary to be attached to this post after that date:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise the scale of salary of the Director of Greenwich Hospital to be at the rate and on the scale of £1,000 to £1,200 a year rising by £50 a year as from the 13th October, 1934.”

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that the opportunity of advancement to Warrant Rank and to Commissioned Officer from

Warrant Rank should be extended to ratings of the Officers' Stewards' Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the ranks of Warrant Steward and Commissioned Steward being established under the following conditions:—

(1) The total establishment of Warrant Stewards and Commissioned Stewards to be fixed at three.

(2) Warrant Stewards to be eligible for promotion to Commissioned Steward at the discretion of the Admiralty on attaining ten years' seniority as Warrant Steward.

(3) The rates of pay, half pay, retired pay, widows' pensions and dependants' allowances to be at the rates applicable to Warrant Officers and Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank of the Non-Mechanical Branches and Warrant Stewards and Commissioned Stewards to conform in all respects to the regulations governing the conditions of service of corresponding Officers of the Non-Mechanical Branches.

(4) Commissioned Stewards to be eligible for a step in rank to Paymaster Lieutenant (O.S.) on retirement provided that they have satisfactory records and have served not less than three years as Commissioned Steward on the active list.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified Their concurrence in these proposals."

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 1st February, 1926, the Force consisting of officers and men of the Royal Navy employed under the Admiralty at Shore Wireless Telegraphy and Direction Finding Stations

"And whereas we are of opinion that the non-substantive pay then instituted for the Telegraphist Branch should be extended to the Shore Wireless Service and applied in the same manner and from the same date, viz., the 1st January, 1934:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment of non-substantive pay to the Shore Wireless Service accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provide for the award of the Naval Long Service and Good Conduct Medal and Gratuity to British and Maltese Non-Continuous Service Officers' Stewards and Cooks Second Class and above and Third Class with at least five years in higher ratings; and for the grant of that decoration (without Gratuity) to all other Non-Continuous Service Petty Officers and Men, except British and Maltese Officers' Stewards and Cooks Third Class without 5 years' service in higher ratings who are not eligible either for the Medal or Gratuity:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the Regulations above mentioned require amendment so as to secure greater uniformity in the conditions under which the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal and Gratuity are awarded:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to direct that all Non-Continuous Service Petty Officers and Men serving in Your Majesty's Naval Force on or after the first day of July, 1934, shall, provided they are qualified by length of service and character, be eligible for the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal, without Gratuity, subject to the proviso that British and Maltese Officers' Stewards and Cooks whose pensionable Naval service commenced prior to that date shall retain their eligibility to qualify for the Long Service and Good Conduct Medal Gratuity under the conditions and provisions at present in force.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals."

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section VI of the Fifth Schedule to Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date 22nd January, 1920, Your Majesty was graciously pleased to establish an allowance of two shillings and sixpence a day for Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders, Royal Navy, who had undergone a special course and qualified in war staff duties; the said allowance to be payable concurrently with full pay, except during service at the Admiralty, from the date of qualifying until the date of permanently ceasing to be employed as a specialist:

"And whereas by the said Order in Council, Your Majesty was also pleased to establish an

allowance of two shillings and sixpence a day for Lieutenants and Captains, Royal Marines, who had qualified in war staff duties and held appointments for such duties, ashore or afloat:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that provision should be made for the said allowance of two shillings and sixpence to be payable to officers of or below the rank or relative rank of Commander, R.N., when holding certain appointments, whether qualified in staff duties or not.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorise the said allowance in appointments in which we consider, and the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury agree, that payment is justified by the importance and the arduous nature of the duties.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

#### SCHEDULE.

##### CAMBRIDGESHIRE, ESSEX AND HERTFORDSHIRE.

All those parts of the Counties of Essex, Cambridge and Hertford lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding where any road, track or railway line is named as a boundary, such road, track or railway line:—

*On the North*, the London, Midland & Scottish Railway line from 1 mile east of Gamblingay Station eastwards to the point where it crosses the Trumpington—Great Shelford road, just south of Trumpington.

*On the East*, from this point along the Trumpington—Great Shelford—Sawston road to where it crosses the London & North Eastern Railway branch line from Cambridge and Great Shelford to Bartlow (just south of Stapleford); thence along this railway line to Bartlow; thence along this railway line from Bartlow through Saffron Walden to its junction with the London & North Eastern Railway line from Cambridge to Bishop's Stortford; thence along this railway line southwards through Bishop's Stortford to Sawbridgeworth Station; thence along the county boundary towards Hoddesdon.

*On the South*, along this boundary to the junction of the Lea and Stort Navigations; thence along the Lea Navigation for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to Rye House Railway Station; thence along the

railway line to Ware and Hertford, through Hertford to the junction of this line with the Enfield and Stevenage branch line of the London & North Eastern Railway system and southward along this line to the point where it crosses the River Lea; thence along the River Lea westwards.

*On the West*, along the River Lea to where it crosses the Hatfield—Welwyn road; thence along this road through Welwyn and Codicote to Hitchin; through Hitchin to the Railway Station; thence along the London & North Eastern Railway branch line to Baldock Station; thence along the Baldock—Biggleswade road to the point where at approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile from the village of Astwick the county boundary diverges from it in a north-easterly direction; thence along the county boundary northwards to the point where on the northern edge of Cockayne Hatley Wood and 1 mile due west of Hatley St. George it cuts a track leading to the Hatley St. George—Gamblingay road; thence along this track and across this road to the London, Midland & Scottish Railway line.

Which Area surrounded on all sides by a continuous red line is delineated on a map, signed by one of His Majesty's principal Secretaries of State, copies of which are deposited in the War Office and the Privy Council Office.

##### GLOUCESTERSHIRE AND NORTH WILTSHIRE.

All those parts of the Counties of Gloucester and Wilts lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding, where any road, track or railway line is named as a boundary, such road, track or railway line:—

*On the North*, north-eastwards from Knock-down village (1 mile east of Didmorton) along the road to Tetbury; through Tetbury towards Cirencester to the point where the road is joined by the road from Malmesbury 1 mile west of Kemble; thence southwards for approximately  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile along this road towards Malmesbury to the county boundary; thence along the county boundary generally eastwards until it crosses the Great Western Railway line approximately 1 mile north-west of Cricklade.

*On the East*, southwards along the said Great Western Railway line to  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile beyond Swindon Town Station; thence along the Swindon—Hungerford road to Chilton Foliat Church; thence due southwards for  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to the county boundary in Brickkiln Copse and along this boundary first westward and then generally southward until this boundary joins the Hungerford—Ludgershall Road 2 miles south of Hungerford; thence along this road southwards skirting Marten and Wexcombe villages to the point where the road, after joining the Marlborough—Ludgershall road 1 mile south of Collingbourne Ducis, joins the Ludgershall—Upavon road approximately 1 mile west of Ludgershall.

*On the South*, from this point along the War Department boundary generally westwards to Beggar's Knoll  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile south-east of Westbury; thence along the track and road leading to Westbury and the Westbury—Trowbridge road.

*On the West*, along the Westbury—Melksham road *via* Heywood and West Ashton through Melksham and along the Melksham—Bath road *via* Atworth and Box to a point one mile west of Box; thence northwards to and along the county boundary and along this boundary



generally northward to the Tetbury—Chipping Sodbury road at Knockdown (1 mile east of Didmarton).

*On the North*, due eastwards from the cross-roads three and a half miles due north of Langtoft and just south of Foundry Foxholes to the coast at a point between Gull Nook and North Cliff, Flamborough Head.

*On the East*, southwards from this point along the coast to a point opposite Kilnsea Village (3½ miles north of Spurn Head).

*On the South*, from this point along the road to Kilnsea; thence along the northern bank or limit of the River Humber to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of Kingston upon Hull; thence along the boundary of Kingston upon Hull, as it existed prior to April, 1930, first northwards to the vicinity of Somerden House, then generally westwards to the point where that boundary diverged from the Cottingham Road; thence along this road to Cottingham.

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto*), in the county of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto, in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

*Stirlingshire, Dunbartonshire and Perthshire.*—An Area comprising:—

*In the county of Stirling.*

The parish of Buchanan.

That part of the parish of Drymen that lies to the west of the public road which passes Balfunning House and which runs from the bridge over the Kelty Water at Wester Third to Drymen bridge over the River Endrick.

*In the county of Dunbarton.*

The premises known respectively as Ardleigh Farm and Doune Farm in the parish of Arrochar.

*In the county of Perth.*

That part of the parish of Aberfoyle (including the premises in the occupation of the Glasgow Corporation known as Stronachlachar Farm and the premises known as Frenich Farm) which lies to the south and west of a line drawn from the point where the eastern boundary of Stronachlachar Farm joins Loch Katrine along the eastern boundary of the said Stronachlachar Farm; thence along the eastern boundary of Frenich Farm; thence along the western shore of Loch Chon; thence along the River Chon; thence along the southern shore of Loch Ard; thence along the River Forth to the point where it crosses the parish boundary near Gartmore Station.

That part of the parish of Port of Menteith that lies to the west of the road that runs from Gartmore Station to the Bridge over the Kelty Water at Wester Third.

The movement of sheep out of the following areas is regulated by the Pennine Range (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934:—

*Area No. 1.*

So much of the counties of Westmorland and Lancashire and of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire and of the borough of Lancaster as lies within the following boundary, namely:—
