The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend William, Lord Bishop of Exeter, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, in the following terms:—

"We William Lord Bishop of Exeter in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Devon and Diocese of Exeter the Benefice or Vicarage of Bickington the Parish whereof contains a population of 237 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 200 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Bickington is £264 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage of Ashburton the Parish whereof contains a population of 2,581 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 600 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Ashburton is £812 or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Benefice or Vicarage of Ilsington the Parish whereof contains a population of 1,135 persons or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for 200 persons.

"The net annual value of the Benefice of Ilsington is £471 or thereabouts.

"That it appears to us and we do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, a portion of the Parish of Ashburton (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with blue) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Bickington to which it is contiguous; also that a portion of the Parish of Ilsington (the boundaries of which are more particularly described in the Scheme annexed to this Representation and also delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed thereto and thereon edged with green) may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of Bickington to which it is contiguous.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Bickington are the Dean and Chapter of Exeter and the Reverend Arthur Robert Hutchison is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Ashburton are the Dean and Chapter of Exeter and the Reverend Edward Foley Ball is the Incumbent thereof.

"The Patrons of the Benefice of Ilsington are the Dean and Canons of Windsor and the Reverend George Herbert Newton is the Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, we the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent

on such alteration in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithes rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested, and we do hereby submit the same together with the Consents in writing of the said Patrons and Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to His Majesty in Council".

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"It is proposed to separate from the said Parish of Ilsington and annex to the said Parish of Bickington all that part of the Parish of Ilsington the boundaries of which are delineated on the Ordnance Map annexed hereto and edged with green.

"That the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bickington shall have sole and exclusive cure of souls within such portion so to be

separated from Ilsington aforesaid.

"That any inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of Bickington but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Ilsington.

"That any inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same rights to have marriages baptisms churchings and burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of Bickington as they might have had in the Parish Church of Ilsington.

"That all fees ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments which may arise from the said portion so to be separated from Ilsington shall belong to the Incumbent of Bickington.

"That the tithe rent charge arising from the lands proposed to be separated from Ilsington

and annexed to Bickington shall remain the property of the Incumbent of Ilsington.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefices or either of them.

"We the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. Peter in Exeter the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Bickington (in case the same were now vacant), the Reverend Arthur Robert Hutchison Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bickington, the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of St. Peter in Exeter the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Ashburton (in case the same were now vacant), the Reverend Edward Foley Ball, Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ashburton, the Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of St. George within His Castle of Windsor the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the Benefice of Ilsington (in case the same were now vacant), and the Reverend George Herbert Newton, Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ilsington hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several Consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Regulation 6 of the Raw Opium Regulations, 1921, as extended by the Coca Leaves and Indian Hemp Regulations, 1928, and by Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928, I hereby give notice that I withdraw, as from to-day's date, from the said Herbert Cecil Duckworth, the authority granted by the said Regulations to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves, Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, applies:

And I also direct, as from the same date, that it shall not be lawful for the said Herbert Cecil Duckworth to give prescriptions for the purposes of the Dangerous Drugs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1928.
