WHEREAS by the Children and Young Persons Act, 1933, it is, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, specify as respects the metropolitan police court area the places (which, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840 (2 & 3 Vict. c. 71 and 3 & 4 Vict. c. 84), may be places other than police courts) in which juvenile courts are to sit, and assign as a division to each such place such portion of that area as may be specified in the Order: and direct the manner in which for the purposes of the constitution of a juvenile court in that area two justices of the peace for the County of London shall be selected from the panel of such justices nominated from time to time by the Secretary of State:

And whereas such an Order in Council may contain such supplemental, incidental and consequential provisions as appear to His Majesty in Council to be necessary for the purposes of the Order and such Orders in Council may by section 105 of the said Act be revoked or varied by a subsequent Order in Council:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the fifth day of October, 1934 (S.R. & O. 1934 (No. 1132)):

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

Order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that—

(1) the Order in Council made on the fifth day of October, 1934, is hereby varied by the substitution in the schedule of the words "Stamford House, Goldhawk Road, Shepherds Bush, W.12" for the words "Lindsey Hall, The Mall, Notting Hill Gate, W.8."

(2) This Order shall come into force on the 15th July, 1935.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52) to 1932 (22 & 23 Geo. V. c. 39), it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 26th day of November, 1880, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty was amended by a Convention signed on the 29th day of June, 1904:

And whereas the said Treaty and Convention was duly ratified. (See Statutory Rules and Orders 1881 and 1905, No. 616.)

And whereas a further Convention was signed on the 19th day of December, 1934, between His Majesty and the Swiss Federal Council, which Convention is in the terms following:—

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the Swiss Federal Council, desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end and for this purpose have appointed as their Plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India: for Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Howard Kennard, His Majesty's Envoy extraordinary and Minister plenipotentiary in Switzerland;

The Swiss Federal Council:

Mr. Giuseppe Motta, Federal Counsellor, Chief of the Federal Political Department,

who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form have agreed as follows:

Article 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Berne on the 26th November, 1880, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:

"Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made."

Article 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

Article 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other members of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic

representative of His Majesty at Berne. From the date that such notice comes into effect the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand, and the territory of the member of the Commonwealth concerned on the other hand.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the member concerned.

Article 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

Article 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880.

In faith whereof the above-named Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

This Order may be cited as the Switzerland (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935.

Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 23rd day of May, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Francis, Petts Wood, situate within the Parish of Orpington, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

“Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Orpington and of the Parish of Chislehurst, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

“And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Orpington and of the said Parish of Chislehurst should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Francis, Petts Wood, situate as aforesaid:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Rectory of the said Parish of Chislehurst (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), and with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Rochester, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Orpington (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Orpington and of the said Parish of Chislehurst which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Francis, Petts Wood, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Francis, Petts Wood’.

“THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Francis, Petts Wood, comprising:—

“I. All that portion of the Parish of Chislehurst, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, which is bounded upon the east and upon the south by the Parish of Orpington, upon the west partly by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity Bromley, and partly by the New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say,

upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint George, Bickley, from the said Parish of Chislehurst crosses the middle of the Swanley and Sevenoaks Branch Line of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 56 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the Parish of Orpington, in the said County and Diocese.

“II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said Parish of Orpington which is bounded upon the east by the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Orpington, upon the north-east partly by the Parish of Saint Mary Cray and partly by the Parish of Saint Paul's Cray, all in the said County and Diocese, upon the north, upon the north-west and upon the west by the said Parish of Chislehurst, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the south and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chislehurst from the said Parish of Orpington crosses the middle of the main line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 31½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Crofton Lane across such line of railway, and extending thence first eastward, then south-eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of Crofton Lane for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Chislehurst Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Chislehurst Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the gateway forming the south-western entrance to Covet Wood, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the western branch of the footpath leading through Covet Wood for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Orpington from the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Orpington.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.

is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 11th day of April, 1935, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, and Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street,

duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, is now full the Reverend Rosslyn Webb Odell being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street, is at present vacant:

"And whereas there is a sum of £1,065 5s. 4d. 2s½ per cent. Consolidated Stock (hereinafter referred to as the said Repair Fund) standing in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England in the name of 'The Official Trustees of Charitable Funds' and held by them in trust as a Repair Fund for the Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster and the Trustees of the said Repair Fund are the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the said Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London

(in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Rosslyn Webb Odell (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, and the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho', and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Rosslyn Webb Odell if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials, and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, if not previously sold, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining lay assistance and a part of the endowment of the United Benefice, that is to say, an annual sum of £200 at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street, shall be appropriated and paid by us, to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the provision of such lay assistance.

"7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measure of a sum of £1,000 together with such further sum as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations and (2) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection and endowment of a new Church and the provision of a Parsonage House for a District to be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which such Church shall be built; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection and endowment of such Church and the provision of a Parsonage House shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London.

"(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, as aforesaid.

"(d) That in the event of the services of any Church officers and servants of the said Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect, such Church officers and servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case, shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper: Provided always that it shall be lawful to us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"8. That upon the union taking effect all of the endowments and property of the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street, other than the annual payment of £200

referred to in Clause 6 of this Scheme, shall be held and accumulated for and towards the endowment of the proposed new Church and District referred to in Clause 7 (b) (2) of this Scheme.

"9. That upon the union taking effect the said Repair Fund shall cease to be applicable for the repair of the said Church of St. Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, and shall become applicable as part of the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London for the repair of the proposed new Church referred to in Clause 7 (b) (2) of this Scheme, and we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners shall apply to the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales for an Order authorising the transfer of the said sum of £1,065 5s. 4d. £2½ per cent. Consolidated Stock or other the investment or investments then representing the said Repair Fund from the name of 'The Official Trustees of Charitable Funds' into the name of us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners.

"10. That after the said union has taken effect (a) the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Anne, Soho, and (b) the patronage of the new Church referred to in Clause 7 (b) (2) of this Scheme shall belong wholly to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Westminster, St. James, Piccadilly, as the Patron of the said Benefice of Westminster, Saint Luke, Berwick Street.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the Church of Saint Luke, Berwick Street, Westminster, and the site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the

Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.
