The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has accepted a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations in respect of the Tanganyika Territory:

And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the nineteenth day of March, 1926, and known as the "Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1926," provision was made for the establishment and constitution of a Legislative Council in and for the Tanganyika Territory:

And whereas by the said Order in Council His Majesty reserved to Himself power from time to time to revoke, alter, add to, or amend the said Order:

And whereas it is expedient to make other provisions than in the said Order in Council are contained in regard to the constitution of the said Legislative Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as the Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1935.

II. Clauses Six and Seven of the Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Order in Council, 1926, are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Clauses are substituted therefor:

"VI. The Official Members of the Council shall consist of the persons for the time being discharging the functions of:—

The Chief Secretary, the Attorney General, the Treasurer, the Director of Medical Services, the Director of Education, the Deputy Chief Secretary, the General Manager of the Railway, the Provincial Commissioner, Eastern Province, the Controller of Customs, the Director of Public Works, the Director of Lands and Mines, the Director of Agriculture, the Postmaster General of the Amalgamated Services of Kenya, Uganda and the Tanganyika Territory."

"VII. The Unofficial Members of the Council shall be such persons not holding office in the Territory as the Governor may from time to time by instrument under the Public Seal appoint, subject to disallowance or confirmation by His Majesty, signified through a Secretary of State.

Every such Member shall vacate his seat at the end of five years from the date of the instrument by which he was appointed or at such earlier date as may be provided by that instrument.

Provided that if any such Member is provisionally appointed as hereinafter provided to fill a vacant seat in the Council and his provisional appointment is immediately followed by his definitive appointment, the aforesaid period of five years shall be reckoned from the date of the instrument provisionally appointing him.

Every such Member shall be eligible to be reappointed by the Governor for a further period or further periods each not exceeding five years, subject to the approval of His Majesty, signified through a Secretary of State."

III. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette and shall be published in the said Gazette, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Territory.

IV. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, add to, or amend this Order.

And the Right Honourable Sir Philip Cunliffe-Lister, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
