

said proposed separate District and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest or dividends to accrue due on account of the said sums of stock and of any further accumulations thereof to be paid by the said Governors to the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being when he shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the said secondly herein mentioned Act:

"And whereas in consideration of the benefaction consisting of the said sums of Stock, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £61 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed separate District or New Parish when duly licensed as aforesaid and to his successors:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the said Common Fund a further grant of £90 per annum to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed separate District or New Parish when duly licensed such further grant to be in lieu of and in substitution for the grant of £60 per annum at present paid by us out of the same Fund towards the stipend of the Curate in Charge of the area to be comprised within the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said grants of the said yearly sums of £61 and of £90 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by Instruments to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Arthur Cayley, Bishop of Gloucester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Barnwood, of the said District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, and of the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Oswald, Coney Hill'.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Oswald, Coney Hill, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the Parish of Barnwood, in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Gloucester, which is bounded upon the south by the Parish of Upton Saint Leonard, upon the south-west partly by the Parish of Matson and partly by the District of Saint Aldate, Finlay Road, Gloucester, upon the north-west partly by a detached portion of the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Wotton Vill, and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Gloucester, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Gloucester, from the said Parish of Barnwood, at a point in the middle of Wotton Brook at the western end of Blinkhorns Bridge, which carries the Gloucester and Cheltenham Loop Line of the Great Western Railway across such brook, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of Wotton Brook for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 130 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Barnwood published in the year 1923 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 126 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to such fence and then first southward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 130 and the closes numbered 131, 134, 136, 135 and 137 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 126 and the closes numbered 133 and 200 upon the same maps for a distance of 30½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 137 from the said close numbered 200 reaches the western side of Coney Hill Road, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Coney Hill Road, for a distance of 34½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading to the second County Mental Hospital, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 1½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the entrance gates to the said Hospital, and extending thence first south-westward to and then first southward and then in various directions along the fence which divides the close number 211 upon the above mentioned maps from the closes numbered 210 and 208 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 12½ chains or thereabouts to the point where such fence reaches the northern side of the River Twyver, and extending thence first southward to and then south-eastward along the middle of the River Twyver for a distance of 16½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 242 upon the above mentioned maps from the close numbered 213 upon the said maps, and extending thence first south-westward to such fence and then first south-westward and then in various directions along the fences which
