PERAMBULATOR AND INVALID CARRIAGE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

Proposal to vary Minimum Rates of Wages for certain Classes of Female Workers.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose to vary general minimum time rates, piece work basis time rates and overtime rates for female workers under seventeen years of age.

Particulars of the proposed variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.
