WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 30th day of January, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of an alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said United Benefice ') of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland, in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland is vested alternately in the Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage and in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of the Parish of Stowmarket, in the said County of Suffolk and in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"And whereas the Reverend Frank Tucker Harvey, Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stowmarket, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland should be vested in the said Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage and is therefore willing that the said alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland now vested in him as aforesaid as such Vicar or Incumbent should be transferred to and be vested in the said Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage:

"And whereas the said Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage are willing to accept such transfer and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, is consenting to the transfer of Patronage which is hereinafter recommended and proposed and in token of such consent which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists that is to say in the Parishes of Creeting Saint Peter and Stowupland:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stowmarket acting as such Vicar or Incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland now vested in him the said Frank Tucker Harvey, as such Vicar or Incumbent as aforesaid shall be transferred from him the said Frank Tucker Harvey and from his successors, Vicars or Incumbents market to the said Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage, in such manner that the whole Advowson of the said United Benefice of Creeting Saint Peter with Stowupland shall hereafter belong to the said Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich Diocesan Board of Patronage.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 2nd day of April, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme under the 11th Section of that Measure, for making certain alterations or additions to the provisions of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 4th day of May, 1935, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of the same month (hereinafter called the Original Order) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas at the lastly-mentioned date both of the said two Benefices were full the Reverend Henry Derwent Hinde being then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, and the Reverend Frederick Edward Palmer Langton, being then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, and the said Henry Derwent Hinde and Frederick Edward Palmer Langton are still the respective Incumbents of the said Benefices:

and from his successors, Vicars or Incumbents "And whereas by the terms of the Original of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stow-Order the union of the said two Benefices will

become effective upon the vacation of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, by the said Henry Derwent Hinde, if the said Frederick Edward Palmer Langton with the approval of the Bishop of London shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice:

"And whereas it has been represented to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and it appears to us to be expedient that provision should be made for accelerating the said union and that to that end provision should be made for compensating the said Henry Derwent Hinde in the event of his vacating the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, in order to accelerate the union:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (who has signed this Scheme in token thereof and also in token of his approval of the said Frederick Edward Palmer Langton as the first Incumbent of the United Benefice), and with the consent of the said Frederick Edward Palmer Langton (who has signed this Scheme in token thereof and also in token of his consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the union provided for by the Original Order shall take effect immediately upon the vacation of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, by the said Henry Derwent Hinde, and the said Frederick Edward Palmer Langton if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, The Holy Redeemer, shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"2. That if within the period of three calendar months immediately following the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Henry Derwent Hinde shall by institution to another Benefice vacate the said Benefice of Clerkenwell, Saint Philip, in order that the union provided for in the Original Order may thereupon take effect there shall be paid to him by the Incumbent of the United Benefice out of the revenues thereof so long as he, the said Henry Derwent Hinde, shall continue to hold such other Benefice, an annual sum of £40 if in our opinion the annual income of such other Benefice amounts to not more than £410 but if in our opinion the annual income of such other Benefice exceeds £410 then the annual sum to be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice as aforesaid shall be the amount necessary to raise the annual income of such other Benefice to £450 and for the recovery of the said annual sum the said Henry Derwent Hinde shall have the same remedies and powers as if the same were a pension awarded to him under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Milton, and the New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 8th day of August, 1845, and published in the London Gazette on the 15th day of the same month, part of the Parish of Miltonnext-Gravesend, in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named 'The District of the Holy Trinity, Milton':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 29th day of December, 1856, and published in the London Gazette on the 9th day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church called Christ Church, situate in the said Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Christ Church, Milton': "And whereas the said District of the Holy

"And whereas the said District of the Holy Trinity, Milton, and the said District Chapelry of Christ Church, Milton, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 17th day of May, 1879, and published in the London Gazette on the 27th day of the same month, the place or district known as the Parish of Denton near Gravesend in the said County and Diocese was annexed to the said Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend for ecclesiastical purposes, and such united Parish is known as the Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Milton, and the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Milton, and the said New

Parish of Christ Church, Milton, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Milton; and (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Milton-next-Gravesend Parish Denton.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, and to be annexed to the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Milton, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, which is bounded upon part of the east by the Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton, in the said County and Diocese, upon the north by the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Milton, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint James, Gravesend, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint James, Gravesend, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, at the junction of Windmill Street and Clarence Place and extending thence eastward along the middle of Clarence Place for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Shrubbery Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Shrubbery Road for a distance of 15 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Parrock Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Parrock Road for a distance of 12 yards or thereabouts to its junction with Love Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Love Lane for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, from the said Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton.

Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton, being:-"All that portion of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, which is bounded upon the north, upon the east, and upon the south-east by the said Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, at the point where such boundary diverges north-eastward from following the middle of Parrock Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Parrock Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Love Lane, and extending thence northward along the middle of Love Lane for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Milton, from the said Parish of Milton-next-Gravesend with Denton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by his Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.
