The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of April, 1936, (P.M. 669/36), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under Clause XV (B) of Section IX (B) of Schedule V and under Clause 3 B (1) (b) of Section II (Part II) of the Schedule to Orders in Council of His late Majesty bearing dates the 22nd day of January, 1920, and the 4th day of May, 1935, respectively, a scale of service retired pay is provided for officers of the rank of Captain in the Royal Marines, if invalided under the age of 40:

"And whereas under Clause 4 of Schedule I and under Clause 3 (IV) of Section I B of the Schedule to Orders in Council of His late Majesty bearing dates the 11th day of October, 1923, and the 4th day of May, 1935, respec-

tively, an alternative scale of service retired pay, with additional retired pay according to the degree of disablement is provided for an officer of the rank of Major in the Royal Marines, who is invalided when under the age of 40 on account of a disability certified by the competent Medical Authority as attributable to the conditions of service, if such alternative scale be more to his advantage than the half pay of his rank:

"And whereas we consider it desirable further to provide that the service retired pay awarded in future to a Captain in the Royal Marines under the age of 40, invalided for any disability, or to a Major in the Royal Marines under the age of 40, invalided for an attributable disability shall not exceed the rate of service retired pay for which he would have qualified had he been 40 years of age at the date of invaliding:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the amendment of the provisions of the aforementioned Orders in Council accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 17th day of May, 1909, and the 17th day of May, 1920, conditions were laid down for the payment of an allowance to the naval rating performing the duties of Acting Schoolmaster in certain of Your Majesty's Ships which do not carry a Naval Schoolmaster:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the educational requirements in certain ships of Your Majesty's Navy justify the provision of instructional staff additional to a Naval Schoolmaster:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction, by Your Order in Council, payment of the authorised allowance to Acting School-masters when employed in ships in which a Naval Schoolmaster is carried, the sanction of the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury being obtained before payment of the allowance is made in ships carrying a Naval Schoolmaster other than Battleships, Battle-Cruisers, Aircraft Carriers of over 17,000 tons and vessels of Destroyer Flotillas.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

"And whereas while these conditions exist men entered since the 4th October, 1925, suffer because of the the lack of vacancies:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 15th day of May, 1930, His late Majesty was pleased to approve of a number of Writers entered under the new system being advanced to the rating of Leading Writer on completing 4½ years' service in the lower rating:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 21st day of December, 1933, His late Majesty was further pleased to approve of a number of Leading Writers entered under the new system being advanced to the rating of Petty Officer Writer on completing 4½ years'

service as Leading Writer:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to provide that, from the 1st day of October, 1936, Petty Officer Writers in any of the three Port Divisions who are recommended and fit for advancement and who reach four years' service in their rating before being advanced may be advanced to the rating of Chief Petty Officer Writer at the rate of one at each Port Division every two months, until it becomes possible to attain normal methods of advancement.
