TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd May, 1936, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th May, 1936, to Saturday, the 30th May, 1936, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE APPOINTMENT OF
SECOND CLASS VALUERS IN THE VALUATION
OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

*N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations
are open both to men and women. The Regula-
tions are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will
satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the
Department, by public advertisement in the
Press or otherwise, to make known the exist-
ence of vacancies have been such as to secure
all desirable publicity. The advertisement
will fix the last day on which applications can
be received and the date by which the age
limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the De-
partment on the appropriate form. After the
last day for application has been reached, the
authorities of the Department will scrutinise
all the applications received and recommend
to the Commissioners such candidates as
appear to them to be best qualified for the
duties. They will at the same time forward
to the Civil Service Commissioners the applica-
tion forms of the candidates recommended,

together with the forms of any candidates not
recommended who are employed in a Govern-
ment Department; and the list of candidates
to be interviewed by the Selection Board will
then be settled by agreement between the
Department and the Civil Service Commis-
sioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the
candidates recommended, take such steps in
consultation with the Department as they think
fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Depart-
ment and accepted by the Civil Service Com-
missioners as possessing the requisite quali-
fications will be summoned to an interview
before a Selection Board, who will select for
the vacancies existing those candidates who
appear to them to possess the qualifications
most suited to the posts to be filled. The
Selection Board will usually comprise repre-
sentatives of the Civil Service Commission, the
Department and a nominee of the Surveyors'
Institution.

Other things being equal, preference will be
given to candidates who served in His
Majesty's Forces between 4th August, 1914, and
11th November, 1918.

4. Candidates must have attained the age of
35 and except in the case of persons holding
established situations in the Civil Service must
not have attained the age of 40 on a date to
be fixed in respect of the competition in which
they are to take part. Candidates who have
served or are serving in the Navy, Army, or
Air Force may deduct from their actual age
any time during which they have so served.

5. Candidates must have passed the Final
Examination of the Chartered Surveyors'
Institution, or the corresponding examination
of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' In-
stitute or of the Land Agents' Society or of
the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland, or hold
a University Degree (*e.g.*, B.A. (Estate
Management) Cambridge, or B.Sc. (Estate
Management) London) which gives exemption
from the examinations of any one of these
bodies. They must have had practical experi-
ence in the compulsory acquisition of property
in :—

(a) The Office of a F.S.I., F.A.I., F.L.A.S.,
or member of the Faculty of Surveyors of
Scotland in professional practice, or in
Government or Municipal Service; or

(b) The Office of any other Surveyor,
Estate Agent or Land Agent which in the
opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners
and the Department gives an adequate
experience.

Women candidates must be unmarried or
widows and will normally be required to re-
sign their appointments on marriage; but
exception to the rule requiring resignation on
marriage may, in individual circumstances, be
made where the employment of a married
woman is considered advisable in the light of
her special qualifications, or special experience
in relation to the duties required of her, or of
the special requirements of the Department.

6. Every candidate must be a natural-born
British subject, the child of a person who is
or was at the time of death a British subject;
provided that exception may be made :—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a
civil situation to which they were admitted

with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

7. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department. Appointment will be subject to the condition that the person appointed may be required to serve in any town in Great Britain. ABANDONMENT OF ROTHER NAVIGATION.

- (a) that it is unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation;
- (b) that such public and other notices of the application have been given as the Board of Trade may require;
- (c) that compensation has been made to all persons entitled to compensation by reason of the proposed abandonment of the canal.

And whereas by Section 2, sub-section (i) of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers of the Board of Trade in relation to canal undertakings were transferred to the Minister of Transport.

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament 31 Geo. III. cap. 66 George O'Brien, Earl of Egremont was empowered to make and maintain the River Rother navigable from the Town of Midhurst to a certain meadow called Railed Pieces or Stopham Meadow in the Parish of Stopham and a navigable cut from the said River to the River Arun at or near Stopham Bridge in the County of Sussex, and for other purposes.

And whereas such navigation was constructed accordingly and except all such part thereof as lies between the Town of Midhurst

aforesaid and the highway bridge known as Lodge or Lods Bridge in the Parish of Lods-worth is now vested in the Right Hon. Charles Henry Baron Leconfield, G.C.V.O.

And whereas such excepted part of the said navigation as aforesaid is now vested in the Cowdray Trust Limited and John Lister Walsh, as Trustees of the Cowdray Estate, Sussex.

And whereas on the 5th day of June, 1935, the Right Hon.
