The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect consolidating the Statutes of the Royal Victorian Order:

EDWARD THE EIGHTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland, and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these Presents shall come,

Greeting!

Whereas Our Royal Progenitor and Predecessor Her Majesty Queen Victoria by certain Letters-Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, in the Fifty-ninth year of Her Reign, did institute, erect, constitute and create an Order of Knighthood, to be called and known for ever thereafter by the name, style and designation of "The Royal Victorian Order," whereof Her said late Majesty, Her heirs and successors, for ever, should be Sovereigns:

And whereas by further Letters-Patent under the Great Seal of the said United Kingdom, bearing date at Westminster the Twentieth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, in the Sixty-second year of Her Reign, Her said late Majesty did ordain, direct and appoint that certain changes should be made in the precedence to be observed with regard to the several Classes of the said Order:

And whereas by further Letters-Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm bearing date at Westminster the Twenty-eighth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, in the First year of Our Reign, We did ordain, direct and appoint that certain changes should be made in the several Classes into which the said Order is divided, and that the precedence to be observed with regard to the several Classes of the said Order shall be such as shall from time to time be determined by Us, Our heirs and successors, Sovereigns of the said Order, and that an additional Officer shall be appointed for the service of the said Order:

And whereas Statutes and Ordinances governing the said Order were enacted and issued on the Thirteenth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, and at divers subsequent dates, by Our Royal Predecessors:

And whereas We deem it now expedient to assemble the said Statutes and to make such alterations as appear to Us necessary for the proper government of the Order:

Now Know Ye that, in pursuance and exercise of the power vested in Us by the said Letters-Patent We have abrogated and annulled, and do hereby abrogate and repeal, all and every the said Statutes and Ordinances so far as they are repugnant to, or inconsistent with, the following Statutes; and in substitution therefor We have made, ordained and established, and by these Presents, sealed with the Seal of the Order, do make, ordain and establish, the following Statutes and Ordinances, which shall from henceforth be inviolably observed and kept within the same, namely:—

I. It is ordained and enjoined that this Order shall be styled and designated in all Acts, Proceedings and Pleadings "The Royal Victorian Order," as directed in the Letters-Patent of the Fifty-ninth year of the Reign of Our Royal Predecessor Queen Victoria, and by no other designation.

II. It is ordained that this Order shall consist of the Sovereign and five several Classes, namely:—I. Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross, II. Knights Commanders and Dames Commanders, III. Commanders, IV. Members of the Fourth Class, V. Members of the Fifth Class.

III. It is ordained that We, Our heirs and successors, Kings or Queens regnant of these Our Realms, are, and for ever shall be, Sovereigns of this Order.

IV. It is ordained that the persons to be admitted as Ordinary Members of the several

Classes of this Order shall be such persons, being male or female subjects of Our Crown, as may have rendered, or shall hereafter render, extraordinary or important or personal services to Us, Our heirs and successors; or who have merited, or may hereafter merit, Our Royal favour.

V. It is ordained that the Honorary Members of the several Classes of this Order shall consist of foreign Princes or Princesses and foreign persons, male or female, upon whom We may think fit to confer the honour of being received into the Order.

VI. It is ordained that when We, Our heirs and successors, shall be pleased to nominate and appoint any person to this Order, such appointment shall be made by Warrant under Our Royal Sign Manual, sealed with the Seal of the Order.

VII. It is ordained that this Order shall rank next to and immediately after Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, and before Our Most Excellent Order of the British Empire; that in all solemn ceremonies, places and assemblies the Knights Grand Cross of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately after the Knights Grand Commanders of the said Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, and the Dames Grand Cross of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately before the Dames Grand Cross of the said Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, and may on all occasions have, use and enjoy the appellation and style of Dame before their Christian or first names; that the Knights Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately after the Knights Commanders of the said Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, and that the Dames Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately before the Dames Commanders of the said Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, and may on all occasions have, use and enjoy the appellation and style of Dame before their Christian or first names; that the men who are Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately after the Companions of the said Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, and that the women who are Commanders of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately before the women who are Commanders of the said Most Excellent Order of the British Empire; that the men who are Members of the Fourth Class of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately after the Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, and that the women who are Members of the Fourth Class of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately before the women who are Officers of the said Most Excellent Order of the British Empire; that the men who are Members of the Fifth Class of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately after the eldest sons of Knights Bachelors of these Our Realms, and that the women who are Members of the Fifth Class of this Order shall have place and precedence next to and immediately before the women who are Members of the said Most Excellent Order of the British Empire. And it is further ordained that men and women admitted to this Order shall take rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations in the Classes of the Order to which they severally belong.

VIII. It is ordained that the Insignia and Robes of the Sovereign of this Order shall be of the same material and fashion as are hereinafter appointed for the Knights Grand Cross, save only with those alterations which distinguish Our Royal Dignity.

IX. It is ordained that the Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross of this Order shall upon all great and solemn occasions wear the Badge of the Order, which shall consist of a white enamelled Maltese Cross of eight points, on an oval centre of crimson enamel the Royal and Imperial Monogram of Our Royal Predecessor Queen Victoria, in gold, within a blue enamelled border inscribed with the motto of the Order, "Victoria," in letters of gold, ensigned with the Imperial Crown enamelled in proper colours; the Badge to be suspended from a dark blue Riband with a narrow edge of three stripes, red, white, and red, on each side, the Riband being of the breadth of three inches and three-quarters in the case of Knights Grand Cross, and of the breadth of two inches and one-quarter in the case of Dames Grand Cross, passing from the right shoulder to the left side; and also that they shall wear on the left side of their coats or outer-garments a silver chipped Star of eight points, in the centre whereof shall be a representation of the Badge of the First Class of the Order, as above described.

X. It is ordained that the Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross shall, upon all great and solemn occasions to be appointed, wear Mantles of dark blue satin, edged with red satin two inches in width, the edging of the collar being half an inch in width, lined with white silk, and fastened by a cordon of dark blue silk and gold, with two dark blue silk and gold tassels attached thereto; and that on the left side of the Mantles shall be embroidered a representation of the Star of a Knight, or Dame, Grand Cross of the Order. And We do command that the Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross shall wear, on all days usually termed "Collar Days," a Collar of gold, composed of octagonal pieces and oblong perforated and ornamental frames alternately, linked together with gold; the said pieces being edged and ornamented with gold, and each containing upon a blue enamelled ground a gold rose jewelled with a carbuncle, and the said frame being of gold, and each containing a portion of the inscription "Victoria . . . Britt. Reg. . . . Def. Fid. . . . Ind. Imp." in letters of white enamel; in the centre of the said Collar shall be, within a perforated and ornamental frame of gold, an octagonal piece, enamelled blue, edged with red, and charged with a white saltire, thereon a gold medallion of the effigy of Our Royal Predecessor Queen Victoria, from which shall hang the Badge of the Order.

XI. It is ordained that the second part of the foregoing Statute shall not apply to any Knight Grand Cross who shall have restored the Collar of this Order upon receiving a Collar of an Order of higher rank and precedence, nor to any Honorary Knight Grand Cross or Honorary Dame Grand Cross who shall not have received a Collar of this Order.

XII. It is ordained that all Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross who have received, or shall receive, Collars of this Order shall make arrangements for their return to the Chancery of the Order in the event of the said Knights or Dames receiving Collars of an Order of higher rank and precedence, or of their decease. And it is ordained that a Foreign Ambassador, or Foreign Minister, to the Court of Saint James's, on whom has been, or shall be, conferred the dignity of an Honorary Knight Grand Cross of this Order, and who has received, or shall receive, the Collar of the Order, shall return the said Collar to the Chancery of the Order on his recall to his own country. And We are pleased to declare that every person who receives a. Collar of this Order shall, upon receiving it, give a written undertaking and promise to fulfil the provisions of this Statute.

XIII. It is ordained that the Knights Commanders of this Order shall wear around their necks a Riband of the same colours and pattern as that of the Knights Grand Cross, of the breadth of one inch and three-quarters, and pendent therefrom the Badge of the Knights Commanders of the Order, which shall be of similar form and pattern to that appointed for the Knights Grand Cross, but of a smaller size; and also that they shall wear, on the left side of their coats or outer-garments, a silver Star, composed of a Maltese Cross with smaller rays issuing from the centre between the angles of the Cross, and in the centre the Badge of the Order, as before described, except that the Cross shall be of frosted silver instead of white enamel; and it is ordained that the Dames Commanders of this Order shall wear a Badge of similar form and pattern to that appointed for Knights Commanders, attached to a similar Riband tied in a bow and worn on the left shoulder, and that they shall wear a like Star.

XIV. It is ordained that the Commanders of this Order shall wear a Riband and Badge of similar form and pattern to those appointed for the Knights Commanders and Dames Commanders of the Order, and in the same manner as is prescribed in the preceding Statute for Knights Commanders and Dames Commanders respectively; but that they shall not be entitled to wear or use the Star.

XV. It is ordained that the Members of the Fourth Class of this Order shall wear a Badge of similar form and pattern to that appointed for the Commanders of the Order, but of a smaller size, pendent from a Riband of the same colours and pattern, of the breadth of one inch and a quarter, attached to the left side of their coats or outer-garments by men, and tied in a bow and worn on the left shoulder by women.

XVI. It is ordained that the Members of the Fifth Class of this Order shall wear, in like manner, a Riband and Badge similar to those appointed for the Fourth Class, except that the Cross shall be of frosted silver instead of white enamel.

XVII. It is ordained that upon the nomination of any person to be a Knight Grand Cross, Dame Grand Cross, Knight Commander, or Dame Commander of this Order, he, or she, shall be invested with the Insignia of his, or her, dignity in the Order by Us, Our heirs and successors, and that on the day of the Investiture the person to be invested shall be introduced into the presence of the Sovereign by the Officer of the Order in attendance, bearing the proper Insignia of the Order, when the Sovereign, having in the case of Knights Grand Cross and Knights Commanders, conferred the honour of Knighthood upon the person so nominated, if he shall not previously have received the said honour, will then proceed to invest him, or her, with the Insignia of the Order in the following manner: The Sovereign will invest the new Knight Grand Cross, Dame Grand Cross, Knight Commander, or Dame Commander with the Riband and Badge, and will deliver to him, or her, or place on his, or her, left side, the Star of the Order appertaining to his, or her, dignity. The Commanders will be invested in like manner with the Riband and Badge only.

XVIII. It is further ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and successors, by a Warrant or Warrants under Our Sign Manual, and sealed with the Seal of the Order, to authorize some distinguished Officer in Our Service, or other person, to perform, in Our name, and on Our behalf, the ceremony of investing Knights Grand Cross, Dames Grand Cross, Knights Commanders, Dames Commanders, or Commanders with the Insignia of their respective dignities, or to permit the ceremony of Investiture to be dispensed with. And We reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, by Our or their Warrant or Warrants, as aforesaid, full power and authority to permit and authorize such persons to wear the Insignia and enjoy the privileges appertaining to their respective dignities, in as full and ample a manner as if they had been invested by Us, Our heirs and successors.

XIX. It is ordained that on the promotion of a person from a lower to a higher Class of this Order, the Insignia of the Class theretofore worn by him or by her shall be returned to the Secretary of the Order for the service of the Order; and that on the resignation or decease of an Officer of this Order, his Chain and Badge of Office shall be restored for the service of the Order.

XX. It is ordained that, for the greater honour and dignity of this Order, it shall and may be lawful for the Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross upon all occasions to bear Supporters to their Arms; and We do by these presents direct and command Our Garter Principal King of Arms for the time being to grant Supporters to such Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross of this Order as shall not otherwise be entitled thereto. And it shall also be lawful for the Knights Grand Cross and Dames Grand Cross of this Order to surround their armorial bearings with the circle and motto of the Order, and to suspend therefrom a representation of their Riband and Badge; and for the Knights Commanders, Dames Commanders and Commanders of this Order to surround their armorial bearings with the circle and motto of the Order, and to suspend therefrom a representation of their Riband and Badge; and for the Members of the Fourth and Fifth Classes of this Order to suspend a representation of their Riband and

respective Badges from the bottom of the escutcheon containing their armorial bearings.

XXI. It is ordained that the Seal of this Order shall consist of the Arms: Azure, a representation of the Badge of the First Class of the Order proper, impaled with Our Royal Arms, with the following circumscription: "The Seal of the Royal Victorian Order"; and that the Statutes of the Order shall be sealed by and with the same.

XXII. It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and successors, by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and sealed with the Seal of the Order (and on the recommendation to that effect by the Chancellor of the Order) to cancel and annul the appointment of any person to this Order, and that thereupon his, or her, name in the Register shall be erased. But that it shall be competent for the Sovereign to restore to the Order any person whose appointment may have been so cancelled and annulled when such recommendation has been withdrawn.

XXIII. It is ordained that the Medal of this Order instituted and created by Our Royal Predecessor Queen Victoria shall continue to be designated and styled "The Royal Victorian Medal," and shall be awarded to such persons, male or female, as may have rendered, or shall hereafter render, extraordinary or important or personal services to Us, Our heirs and successors; or who have merited, or may hereafter merit, Our Royal favour.

XXIV. It is ordained that the said Royal Victorian Medal, for men and for women, shall be a circular Medal of silver-gilt, silver, or bronze, having on the obverse the effigy of the Sovereign of the Order, and on the reverse the Royal and Imperial Cypher upon an ornamental shield within a wreath of laurel, and in base a scroll, thereon the words "Royal Victorian Medal."

XXV. It is ordained that the Medal shall be worn, by men, on the left side of the coat or outer-garment, pendent from a Riband of the breadth of one inch and a quarter of the same colour and pattern as that appointed for the Members of this Order, and, by women, from a similar Riband tied in a bow and worn on the left shoulder.

XXVI. It is ordained that a member of any of the Classes of this Order, upon whom the Royal Victorian Medal has been, or may be, conferred, shall be entitled to wear the said Medal in the manner provided as aforesaid in addition to the Insignia of the Order.

XXVII. It is ordained that any person upon whom a silver-gilt Royal Victorian Medal has been, or may be, conferred, and who has previously received a silver, or bronze, Royal Victorian Medal, or both, shall be entitled to wear both Medals, or the three Medals, as the case may be; and that any person upon whom a silver Royal Victorian Medal has been, or may be, conferred, and who has previously received a bronze Medal, shall be entitled to wear both Medals.

XXVIII. It is ordained that any service which is deemed worthy of recognition by the award of the silver-gilt, silver, or bronze Royal Victorian Medal, but is rendered by a person upon whom the particular decoration has already been conferred, may be recorded by a Clasp, attached, for men, to the Riband, and

for women, to the centre of the bow, from which the Medal is suspended; and that such Clasp shall consist of a bar inscribed with the year in which it is awarded, and surmounted by the Royal and Imperial Cypher.

XXIX. It is ordained that it shall be competent for Us, Our heirs and successors, by an Ordinance signed by the Sovereign and sealed with the Seal of the Order (and on the recommendation to that effect by the Chancellor of the Order) to cancel and annul the award of the Royal Victorian Medal in any case, and that thereupon the name of the person concerned shall be erased from the Register of those upon whom the said Medal has been conferred.

XXX. It is ordained that the Twentieth day of June every year, being the day of the accession to the Throne of these Our Realms of Our Royal Predecessor Queen Victoria, shall be taken and deemed to be the Anniversary of the institution of this Order.

XXXI. It is ordained that the following Officers shall be appointed to this Order, that is to say, a Chancellor, a Secretary and a Registrar.

XXXII. It is ordained that the Lord Chamberlain of Our Household for the time being shall be Chancellor of this Order, and that in all ceremonies of the Order and upon all great and solemn occasions to be appointed he shall be habited in a Mantle of white satin lined with dark blue silk edged with red silk two inches in width, fastened by a cordon of dark blue silk and gold, with two dark blue silk and gold tassels attached thereto, and having on the right shoulder thereof an escutcheon Azure, charged with a representation of the Badge of the First Class of the Order; and that he shall wear around his neck, pendent from a chain of gold, a Badge consisting of a representation of the Badge of the First Class of the Order within a blue enamelled border inscribed "Royal Victorian Order" in letters of gold, the whole ensigned with the Imperial Crown enamelled in proper colours. To his custody shall be confided the Seal of the Order, which he shall affix, or cause to be affixed, to all Statutes and other documents and instruments of the Order which require to be passed under the said Seal. He shall countersign all instruments appertaining to the Order, and shall perform such further duties in connection therewith as may be directed by these Statutes, or by the Sovereign.

XXXIII. It is ordained that Our Private Secretary for the time being shall be the Secretary of this Order, and that in all ceremonies of the Order and upon all great and solemn occasions to be appointed he shall be habited in a Mantle like unto that assigned to the Chancellor of this Order; and that he shall wear around his neck, pendent from a chain of gold, a Badge consisting of a representation of the Badge of the First Class of the Order with two gold pens saltirewise between the angles of the Cross, the whole within a blue enamelled border inscribed "Royal Victorian Order" in letters of gold. He shall record all appointments in the Register of the Order, and keep full lists of those who are admitted to it. He shall be responsible for conducting all correspondence connected with the service of the Order, and for making such record of it as

is necessary, and shall take such steps as may be required to ensure the safe custody of all documents relating to the Order. It shall also be his duty to recover the Badges of those who are promoted in the Order.

XXXIV. It is ordained that the Registrar of this Order shall be nominated by Us, Our heirs and successors, and that in all ceremonies of the Order and upon all great and solemn occasions to be appointed he shall be habited in a Mantle like unto that assigned to the Chancellor of this Order; and that he shall wear around his neck, pendent from a chain of gold, a Badge consisting of a representation of the Badge of the First Class of the Order with a gold book between each angle of the Cross, the whole within a blue enamelled border inscribed "Royal Victorian Order" in letters of gold. He shall assist the Secretary in his duty to keep full lists of those who are admitted to the Order, shall prepare and engross all warrants and instruments which require to be passed under the Seal of the Order; and shall deliver, or cause to be delivered, a copy of the Statutes to every Knight Grand Cross, Dame Grand Cross, Knight Commander and Dame Commander at, or immediately after, his, or her, Investiture, and to every Commander and Member immediately after his, or her, nomination. He shall also keep full lists of those persons to whom the Royal Victorian Medal has been granted, and shall prepare certificates to be sealed with the Seal of the Order for delivery to those persons.

XXXV. It is ordained that the Chancery of this Order, wherein a record of all proceedings connected therewith shall be deposited and preserved, shall be in the Office of Our Lord Chamberlain for the time being, or in the Office of such other Officer of Our Royal Household as it shall please Us, Our heirs and successors, to command.

XXXVI. It is ordained that the Miniature Badges to be worn by Knights Grand Cross, or Dames Grand Cross, by Knights Commanders, or Dames Commanders, by Commanders, or by Members of the Fourth Class of this Order, shall be replicas in enamel of the Badges of the respective Classes, the size to be half that of the Badge of the Members of the Fourth Class of the Order.

XXXVII. It is ordained that the Miniature Badge to be worn by the Members of the Fifth Class of this Order, shall be a replica of the Badge of the Members of that Class, but half the size of that Badge.

XXXVIII. It is also ordained that Sealed Patterns of the said Miniature Badges shail be deposited and kept in the Chancery of the Order.

XXXIX. It is ordained that the three foregoing Statutes shall not be held to apply to those Miniature Badges which were in use before the Seventeenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-three.

XL. We do hereby command and enjoin that these Statutes shall be of such and the same force, virtue and effect in every respect as if they had been duly made, and the said acts, deeds, matters and things had been duly done, on the Twenty-first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

XLI. Lastly, We reserve to Ourselves, Our heirs and successors, full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with these Statutes and Regulations, or any part thereof, by a Notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order.

GIVEN at Our Court at St. James's the Twenty-ninth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-six, in the First year of Our Reign.
