Suspension of Withdrawal of Authorisations.

John Park Mathie.

The Home Secretary gives notice that he has suspended until further Order the operation of the Notice, dated 23rd August, 1930, and published in the London Gazette and Edinburgh Gazette on the 29th August, 1930, withdrawing from John Park Mathie, L.R.C.P., L.R.C.S., Edin., L.R.F.P.S., Glasgow, now residing at Branksome, Goldthorn Hill, Wolverhampton, the authority granted by the Regulations made under the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, to duly qualified medical practitioners to be in possession of and to supply raw opium, coca leaves and Indian hemp, and the drugs and preparations to which Part III of the Act applies; and has also suspended the direction, given at the same time, that it should not be lawful for Mr. Mathie to give prescriptions for the purposes of the aforesaid Regulations.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ASSISTANT TECHNICAL OFFICERS FOR FURNITURE IN H.M. OFFICE OF WORKS.

N.B.—Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence of vacancies. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 35 years of age on that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force may deduct from their actual age for this purpose any time during which they have so served, but not exceeding five years.

2 Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.
