At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 8th day of *June*, 1937.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 80 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, power is given to His Majesty by Order in Council to make Regulations with respect to the manner in which Government ships may be registered as British ships for the purpose of the Merchant Shipping Acts:

And whereas by the said Section it is provided that those Acts shall, subject to any exceptions and modifications which may be made by Order in Council, either generally or as respects any special class of Government ships, apply to Government ships registered in accordance with such Regulations as if they were registered in manner provided by those Acts:

And whereas His Majesty in Council was pleased on the 5th November, 1929, to make Regulations as to the registration as British ships of vessels in the service of the Indian Government:

And whereas on the commencement on the 1st April, 1937, of Part III of the Government of India Act, 1935 (26 Geo. 5. c. 2) Burma ceased to be part of India in accordance with sub-section (2) of section forty-six of that Act, and it is expedient to make Regulations as to the registration as British ships of vessels in the service of the Government of Burma:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66) have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following Regulations shall have effect as regards ships belonging to His Majesty which are under the control of the Government of Burma, hereinafter referred to as Burma Government ships:

1. An application for registry of a Burma Government ship shall be made in writing under the hand of a Secretary to the Government of Burma or other officer nominated by that Government. Such application shall contain the following particulars:

(i) A statement of the name and description of the ship:

(ii) A statement of the time when and place where the ship was built, or, if the ship was foreign built and the time and place of building are unknown, a statement to that effect and of her foreign name:

(iii) A statement of the nature of the title to the said ship, whether by original construction by or for that Government, or by purchase, capture, condemnation or otherwise, and a list of the documents of title, if any, in case she was not originally constructed by or for that Government:

(iv) A statement of the name of the Master.

2. The Registrar, on receiving such application in respect of a Burma Government ship shall—

(i) enter the ship in the Register Book as belonging to "His Majesty, represented by the Government of Burma" and shall also enter therein—

(ii) the name of the port to which she belongs:

(iii) the particulars stated in the application for registration:

(iv) the details comprised in the Surveyor's Certificate.

3. On the registry of a Burma Government ship the Registrar shall retain in his possession the Surveyor's Certificate and the application for registry and any documents of title mentioned in such application.

4. Upon the transfer of a registered Burma Government ship by Bill of Sale, the Governor of Burma shall be the transferor, and the Bill of Sale shall be in Form A in the proper form prescribed under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) (hereinafter called the Principal Act), omitting the covenant therein contained. Any such Bill of Sale shall be executed on behalf of the Governor by such person and in such manner as he may direct or authorise.

5. The application for a Certificate of Sale referred to in Sections 39 to 42 and Sections 44 to 46 of the Principal Act, may be made in respect of a Burma Government ship by a Secretary to the Government of Burma or other officer nominated by that Government.

6. The person to whom the management of any Burma Government ship is entrusted by the Government of Burma shall be registered as provided by Section 59 (2) of the Principal Act.

7. Where any provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order in Council is applicable to Burma Government ships imposes any duty or liability or confers any right or power upon or contemplates any act being performed by the owner of a ship such duty, liability, right or power shall, subject always to the other provisions of this Order in Council, be carried out, borne, or exercised by the Government of Burma on behalf of His Majesty.

8. The term "seaman" in Section 113 of the Principal Act shall not be deemed to mean or include any seaman in His Majesty's Navy or the Royal Indian Navy.

9. In this Order in Council the term Merchant Shipping Acts shall mean and include any of the Merchant Shipping Acts, any provision of which is by virtue of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, and this Order applicable to Burma Government ships.

10. The following sections and provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts shall not apply to Burma Government ships registered in pursuance of this Order namely:—

(i) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, Sections 1, 2, 3, 8 to 12, 427 to 431.

The provisions of Part II of the Act relating to the requirement of officers to hold certificates of competency and the production of those Certificates.

(ii) The Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 & 62 Vict. c. 44), Sections 3 and 5.

(iii) The Merchant Shipping Act, 1906, Sections 25 and 27.

Provided always that no provision of the Merchant Shipping Acts which, according to a reasonable construction, would not apply in the case of Burma Government ships shall be deemed to apply to such ships by reason only that its application is not hereby expressly excluded.

11. Save as otherwise provided by this Order or by the Government of Burma Act, 1935 (26 Geo. 5. c. 3) anything required or authorised by this Order in Council to be done by the Government of Burma may be done by a Secretary to that Government or other officer nominated by that Government.

12. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Registration of Burma Government Ships) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894 (57 & 58 Vict. c. 60) (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), it is (amongst other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council declare, with respect to any British possession named in the Order, not being the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man, the description of persons who are to be registrars of British ships in that possession:

And whereas there is in force an Order in Council namely the Merchant Shipping (Registrars of British Ships in India) Order, 1931 (S.R. & O. 1931, No. 672), whereby the description of persons who are to be registrars of British ships in British India are declared:

And whereas on the commencement, on the 1st April, 1937, of Part III of the Government of India Act, 1935 (26 Geo. 5. c. 2), Burma ceased to be part of India in accordance with the provision of sub-section (2) of section forty-six of that Act, and it is expedient to declare the description of persons who are to be registrars of British ships in British Burma:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66), have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare as follows:—

1. At any port of registry in British Burma, the Principal Officer, Mercantile Marine Department, or where there is no such officer, the Port Officer, shall be the registrar of British ships.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Registrars of British Ships in Burma) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of March, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bristol, Saint Jude, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of The Weir (Saint Matthias) both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report *inter alia*, upon the union of the said two Benefices of Bristol, Saint Jude, and The Weir (Saint Matthias) duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bristol and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Bristol signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Bristol embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Bristol, Saint Jude, and The Weir (Saint Matthias) are now full the Reverend Robert Burton Coleridge Carson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Bristol, Saint Jude, and the Reverend Kenneth Percy Banister being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of The Weir (Saint Matthias):

"And whereas under the provisions of the 21st Section of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, the right of patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Bristol, Saint Jude, and The Weir (Saint Matthias) is at present exercised alternately by Your Majesty and Your Successors and by the Bishop of Bristol for the time being:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total endowments of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and it is desirable that a part of such endowments should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the augmentation of certain Benefices having no competent provision belonging thereto situate in the said Diocese of Bristol, namely the Benefices of

Brislington, Saint Cuthbert; Bristol, Saint Simon; Fishponds, Saint Bede; Horfield, Saint Gregory; Knowle, Saint Barnabas and Two Mile Hill:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Bristol, Saint Jude, and the said Benefice of The Weir (Saint Matthias) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Bristol, Saint Jude with Saint Matthias' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Bristol, Saint Jude, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Bristol, Saint Jude, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect that one of the Parsonage Houses at present belonging to the said Benefices of Bristol, Saint Jude, and The Weir (Saint Matthias) which shall be selected by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners with the approval in writing of the Bishop of Bristol shall become and be the

house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the other Parsonage House and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be transferred to and form part of the aggregate fund herein-after referred to.

" 6. That the consent of the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty and Your Successors as alternate Patron of the said Benefice of The Weir (Saint Matthias) (testified by his signing this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, as the other alternate Patron of the same Benefice of The Weir (Saint Matthias) (testified as aforesaid) upon the union taking effect a part of the endowment and property of the United Benefice namely an annual payment of £232 being part of a larger annual payment now made by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of The Weir (Saint Matthias) shall be excepted out of the union and shall become and be payable by us as to £40 per annum to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Brislington, Saint Cuthbert; as to £40 per annum to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Bristol, Saint Simon; as to £40 per annum to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Fishponds, Saint Bede; as to £37 per annum to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Horfield, Saint Gregory; as to £30 per annum to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Knowle, Saint Barnabas; and as to the remaining £45 per annum to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Two Mile Hill.

" 7. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised alternately by Your Majesty and Your Successors and by the Bishop of Bristol for the time being the right of presentation upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation being exercisable by Your Majesty and Your Successors and the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter being exercisable by the Bishop of Bristol for the time being.

" 8.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said

Union of Benefices Measure, 1923. (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bristol under the said Measure of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall together with the net proceeds of the sale as aforesaid of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Bristol, Saint Jude, or of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of The Weir, Saint Matthias (as the case may be) form one aggregate fund and such aggregate fund shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (2) a capital sum sufficient in our opinion to produce an income of £100 per annum shall be paid over to the Bristol Diocesan Board of Finance as a fund for and towards the upkeep of the fabric of and the maintenance of Services in the Church of the United Benefice; and (3) the residue of such aggregate fund shall be held and applied by us according to the direction of the Bishop of Bristol for and towards the augmentation or otherwise for the benefit of Benefices situate in the City of Bristol. (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Jude, Bristol being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Bristol and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, or such of them as the Bishop of Bristol shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice and any of such articles not so removed shall be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Bristol which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, as aforesaid. (d) That in the event of the services of any of the Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Bristol equitable and proper: Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, shall not take effect until the consents and approval

which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Matthias, The Weir, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, after giving full consideration to such objections, have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Bristol has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of June, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Horne, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark:—

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Horne is vested in Gerald Eustace Howell Palmer of Prior's Court Chieveley in the County of Berks a Member of Your Majesty's Commons House of Parliament Charles Eric Palmer of Shinfield Grange near Reading in the said County of Berks Esquire and the Honourable Ernest Cecil Nottage Palmer of Fernhurst Pinkney's Green Maidenhead Thicket in the said County of Berks, as executors of the will dated the 2nd day of January, 1930, and of a Codicil thereto dated the 28th day of July, 1931, of the late Alfred Palmer of Wokefield Park Mortimer in the said County of Berks and of West Park Newchapel near Lingfield in the County of Surrey Esquire and the beneficiaries under the said will and codicil are the said Gerald Eustace Howell Palmer, Elizabeth Mary Palmer of Prior's Court Chieveley aforesaid, Spinster, and Rodney Howell Palmer of Fittleton Manor Netheravon in the County of Wilts Esquire (hereinafter called 'the Beneficiaries'):

"And whereas the said Gerald Eustace Howell Palmer, Charles Eric Palmer and Ernest Cecil Nottage Palmer at the request of the Beneficiaries are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Horne now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Southwark for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, now Bishop of Southwark, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned

Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Horne which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Horne:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Gerald Eustace Howell Palmer, Charles Eric Palmer, Ernest Cecil Nottage Palmer, Elizabeth Mary Palmer and Rodney Howell Palmer (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Horne, now vested as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Roxeth, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 12th day of February, 1931, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month the Benefice of Saint George the Martyr, Queen Square, Holborn, and the Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice; and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things (1) that an ecclesiastical district should be selected by the Bishop of London as the District for which a Church should be built out of the aggregate fund comprising the proceeds of the sale of the site and materials of the Church of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, and of the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, (2) that the patronage of such Church and District should be vested in the Patron of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, and (3) that a part of the property and endowment of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, that is to say (a) a part, namely £295 per annum, of the stipend of £375 per annum formerly paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice (b) a capital sum of £9 13s. 11d. formerly held by us on behalf of the same Benefice and (c) a sum of £43 10s. 5d. £4 per centum per annum Funding Stock formerly held by us on behalf of the same Benefice, should be held and applied by us together with the accumulations of such income for the endowment of such Church and District:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted has been selected by

the Bishop of London as the District for which a Church shall be built and an endowment secured as provided by the above mentioned Order in Council:

"And whereas at the date of the said Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council the patronage of the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Grays Inn Road, was vested in the Reverend Edwin Curtis Bedford as the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Saint Andrew, Holborn, in the said County and Diocese:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London (in testimony whereof he has set his hand and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Paul, South Harrow'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall, as provided by the said Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1931, be vested in and exercised by the said Edwin Curtis Bedford and by his successors, Rectors or Incumbents of the said Rectory of the Parish of Saint Andrew, Holborn, for ever.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Paul, South Harrow, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (some-time District Chapelry) of Christ Church, Roxeth, in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London, which is bounded upon the north by the Parish of Pinner, upon the west by the District of Saint Paul, Ruislip Manor, upon the south and upon the south east by the Parish of Northolt, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Northolt from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, crosses the middle of the Harrow and Uxbridge Line of the Metropolitan District Railway, and extending thence north westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 73 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, from the said Parish of Pinner."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the New Parish of Christ Church, Roxeth, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Broome and Thwaite Saint Mary are now full being held together in plurality by the Reverend Edward Jones Alcock under the authority of a Dispensation:

" And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Broome and Thwaite Saint Mary now, belongs to one and the same Patron:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and of the said Edward Jones Alcock (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Broome and the said Benefice of Thwaite Saint Mary shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Broome with Thwaite Saint Mary' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Edward Jones Alcock if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Broome and Thwaite Saint Mary shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Broome and Thwaite Saint Mary shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Broome shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop

of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.
