SCHEDULE.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEICESTER ROADS (RESTRICTION) ORDER, 1937.

The Council of the City of Leicester in exercise of the powers conferred on them under or by virtue of sub-section (1) of Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933, hereby make the following Order:—

1. Save as hereinafter provided, no person shall drive any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor or heavy motor-car (as respectively defined in Section 2 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, or in any Regulations made or to be made thereunder), any motor-car (as defined as aforesaid) with seats for more than 7 persons exclusive of the driver, or any horse-drawn vehicle on the length of road specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the said road").

2. Nothing in this Order contained shall prevent the driving upon the said road of any vehicle which is being used in connection with the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near to the said road
