WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of September, 1937 (C.W. 6299/37), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 5 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that Your Majesty may, from time to time, by Your Order in Council, appoint such pensions as seem fit to Officers of the Royal Navy and Marines and others for the time being entitled to the benefits of Greenwich Hospital:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 16th day of January, 1924, sanction was given for the re-allocation of Greenwich Hospital Pensions to Naval and Marine Officers on the Retired Lists of Your Majesty's Fleet as laid down in the Schedule annexed thereto:

“And whereas under the aforesaid Order in Council provision was made, *inter alia*, for the establishment of 19 pensions of £40 each for Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders, Royal Navy, and Officers of equivalent rank promoted from Warrant rank:

“And whereas Officers promoted from Warrant rank may attain the rank or equivalent rank of Commander in Your Majesty's Fleet:

“And whereas we consider that such Officers should also be eligible for the award of a Greenwich Hospital Pension:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the extension of the establishment of 19 pensions of £40 each for Lieutenants and Lieutenant-Commanders and Officers of equivalent rank promoted from Warrant rank to include officers of Commander's rank similarly promoted.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 14th day of September, 1937, (N. 5849/37), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having

been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the regulations for Your Majesty's Navy provide that an allowance shall be payable to the person, other than a Cook rating, performing the duty of cook in certain vessels not carrying a Cook rating:

"And whereas owing to the expansion of Your Majesty's Fleet there are insufficient Cook ratings to meet requirements, and it is therefore necessary in the Fleet generally to employ ratings of the Seaman and Stoker branches of the Royal Navy, and men of the Royal Marines, on the duties of a Cook rating:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment of an allowance of 6d. a day, at our discretion, whenever the duties of a Cook are carried out by a Seaman, Stoker or a Royal Marine.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased to approve a change in the Constitution of the Army Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council. All business other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself is to be transacted in the following principal subdivisions:—

(a) The Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting War Department Lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(b) The First Military Member of the Army Council (the Chief of the Imperial General Staff), the Second Military Member of the Army Council (the Adjutant-General to the Forces), the Third Military Member of the Army Council (the Quarter-Master-General to the Forces), and the Fourth Military Member of the Army Council (the Master-General of the Ordnance) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of

so much of the business relating to the organisation, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army, as may be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Finance Member of the Army Council (Financial Secretary of the War Office) shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the finance of the Army and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Director-General of Munitions Production shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the production of munitions and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(e) The Director-General of the Territorial Army shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the Territorial Army Associations, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(f) The Permanent Under-Secretary of State shall be a Member, and Secretary, of the Army Council and responsible to the Secretary of State for the preparation of all official communications of the Council and for the interior economy of the War Office: he shall also be responsible, on his appointment as Accounting Officer of Army Votes, Funds and Accounts, for the control of expenditure, and for advising the Secretary of State and the Administrative Officers at the War Office and in Commands on all questions of Army expenditure.

He shall further be charged with such other duties as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

2. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated 26th September, 1936.

And whereas by Section 1 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898, it is (among other things) provided that references in Part XI of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, to the Mercantile Marine Fund shall be construed as references to the General Lighthouse Fund by the now reciting Act constituted:

And whereas by Order in Council made on the 3rd day of July, 1936, the establishment to be maintained by the Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioners) being one of the General Lighthouse Authorities referred to in the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the amount of the salaries to be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund in respect of that establishment were duly fixed:

And whereas it is expedient that the establishment of the Commissioners should be varied in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Northern Lighthouse Board (Variation of Establishment) Order, 1937.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.

3. The Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 3rd day of July, 1936.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the salary of Mr. R. Johnston at present the holder of the post of Accountant shall rise by annual increments of £25 to a maximum of £847 is. per annum.

5. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

WHEREAS by the Dockyard Ports Regulation Act, 1865, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, to define the limits of a Dockyard Port for the purposes of that Act, and to make regulations in relation to any Dockyard Port for all or any of the purposes in the said Act particularly mentioned, and for such other purposes as from

time to time seem necessary, with a view to the proper protection of His Majesty's vessels, dockyards, or property, or to the requirements of His Majesty's Naval Service:

And whereas by the same Act it is also enacted that in relation to any Dockyard Port, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, by Order in Council, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, to make rules concerning the Lights or Signals to be carried or used, and the steps for avoiding collision to be taken by His Majesty's vessels, and other vessels, navigating the waters of the Port and of the approaches thereto:

And whereas in pursuance of the said Act certain regulations and rules were made by Orders in Council dated the 29th day of June, 1931, and the 17th day of March, 1932, with reference to the two Dockyard Ports of Plymouth and Devonport:

And whereas it appears expedient to amend such rules as hereinafter provided:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, on the joint recommendation of the Admiralty and the Board of Trade, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall take effect from one calendar month from the date hereof.

2. Clause 6 of the Second Schedule to the said Order in Council dated the 29th day of June, 1931, is hereby repealed.

3. The following rule shall have effect in relation to the Dockyard Ports of Plymouth and Devonport and shall be read and construed as though inserted in the Second Schedule of the said Order in Council, dated the 29th day of June, 1931, in the position indicated by the number prefixed thereto:—

“6. When one of His Majesty's vessels or other vessel in charge of His Majesty's Officers or a vessel of over 2,500 tons gross register hoists 'M' Flag (International Code—Alphabetical) over the Pilot Jack by day, or a red light by night at the foremast head, denoting that she is under way for the purpose of passing between the Dockyard Port of Devonport and Plymouth Sound, all other vessels under way in the Dockyard Port of Devonport or in the narrow waters of Plymouth Sound shall keep out of the way of the said vessel, and by day only, traffic shall cease between Rubble Bank and a line joining the Mallard and Melampus Light Buoys in the reverse direction of that being taken by the vessel flying the 'M' Flag over the Pilot Jack; provided always that the said vessel shall be navigated with due care and at a moderate speed. When any vessel is showing either of the aforementioned signals denoting that she is under way for the purpose of passing between the Dockyard Port of Devonport and Plymouth Sound all other of His Majesty's ships present in the Port and the Signal Station Flagstaff at Mount Wise shall as a general warning hoist the Pilot Jack by day or by night show position lights (two white lights vertical, 8 feet apart, hoisted at the peak, or if no gaff, hoisted abreast the maintop in the middle line of the ship or on the ensign staff). And by day only as a warning to vessels proceeding in the reverse direction to the said vessel flying 'M' flag over the Pilot Jack, there shall be hoisted at the Flagstaffs at Longroom and the North Dockyard Signal Station a Ball over Red Burgee when the vessel flying 'M' Flag over the Pilot Jack is proceeding from Sound to Hamoaze or when the said vessel is proceeding from Hamoaze to Sound a Red Burgee over Ball. All traffic outwards between Rubble Bank and a line joining the Mallard and Melampus Light Buoys is to cease when the Ball over Red Burgee is hoisted, and all

traffic inwards between a line joining the aforesaid Light Buoys and Rubble Bank is to cease when the Red Burgee over Ball is hoisted.”

And whereas it is expedient that the said establishments of the Corporation should be re-organized and increased in the manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such increase:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication in the London Gazette.

2. This Order may be cited as the Trinity House (Establishment) Order, 1937.

3. The Orders in Council, the dates whereof are set out in the First Schedule hereto, are hereby revoked save and in so far as the Order

in Council dated 14th day of May, 1934, revokes the following Orders in Council:—

4. Subject to the provisions of this Order the clerical and engineering establishments of the Corporation shall consist of the posts enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto at the salaries of which the minimum, the annual increase, and the maximum are respectively mentioned in the same Schedule, but the annual increase of such salaries shall (except in the case of the Secretary and Engineer-in-Chief) be granted only on a Certificate by the Corporation that the preceding period of the officer's service has been distinguished by zeal, industry and regularity.

5. The staff at present employed by the Corporation shall, subject to individual fitness, be absorbed so far as possible into the re-organized clerical and engineering establishments under such terms as may be agreed upon by the Corporation and the Board of Trade, but in no case shall such terms be better than those given to Civil Servants under similar conditions.

6. Notwithstanding anything in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto, the salary of Mr. J. M. Nicolle, at present Secretary, shall be £1,161 2s. od. per annum with effect from the first day of October, 1935, rising by annual increments of £50 to a maximum of £1,450 per annum.

7. Notwithstanding anything in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto, the salary of Mr. R. H. G. Thomson at present Deputy Secretary shall be £983 13s. od. per annum, with effect from the first day of October, 1935, rising by

annual increments of £30 to a maximum of £1,100 per annum.

8. Notwithstanding anything in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto the salary of Mr. J. E. A. Hunter, at present Principal of the Lights Department, shall be £856 5s. od. per annum with effect from the twenty-third day of June, 1936, rising by annual increments of £30 to a maximum of £1,000 per annum.

9. Notwithstanding anything in Part I of the Second Schedule hereto, the salary of Mr. A. E. Wyatt, at present holding the post of Super Clerical Officer (Chief Engineering Clerk) shall be £623 7s. od. per annum, with effect from the first day of October, 1935, rising by annual increments of £25 to a maximum of £738 12s. od. per annum.

10. Notwithstanding anything in Part II of the Second Schedule hereto, the salary of Mr. J. P. Bowen, at present the holder of the post of Engineer-in-Chief, shall be £1,410 per annum, with effect from the first day of September, 1935, rising by annual increments of £50 to a maximum of £1,650 per annum.

11. Notwithstanding anything in Part II of the Second Schedule hereto, the salaries of Mr. T. Clark and Mr. S. Haddock, at present graded as "Inspectors of Shipping" and hereafter to be graded as "Engineering Assistants Grade III" shall rise by annual increments of £12 to a maximum of £337 7s. od. per annum.

12. Any of the Clerical Officers or Clerks Special Class at present serving on the clerical establishment of the Corporation who are not immediately absorbed into the re-organized clerical establishment shall retain their present title and scale of pay until they are absorbed into the re-organized establishment.

13. The number of Clerical Officers, Clerks Special Class, and Clerical Assistants at present serving on the clerical establishment of the Corporation together with the number of officers appointed to the post of Clerical Assistant shall not in the aggregate exceed the total number of posts of Clerical Officer and Clerical Assistant provided for in the establishment.

14. All persons appointed in future to the Executive, Clerical, Clerk-Shorthand-Typist, Clerk-Typist or Clerical Assistant grade on the establishment of the Corporation shall, subject to the provisions of Article 15 hereof, previously to their appointment pass an examination which shall be held under conditions similar to those for candidates sitting for examinations for similar posts in the Civil Service.

15. All officers appointed to posts on the re-organized establishments fixed by this Order and all established officers remaining unabsorbed as contemplated in this Order shall be governed by conditions of service including promotion and superannuation benefits similar to those governing Civil Servants of the corresponding or analogous grades, provided that the service, if any, as Extra Clerk of any such officer, may, with the consent of the Board of Trade, be reckoned for the purposes of his superannuation benefits.

16. Any officer who may be appointed to a post of a technical character or superior to a higher grade executive post on the re-organized establishments of the Corporation as fixed by this Order may in exceptional cases and with the approval of the Board of Trade be granted

a commencing salary exceeding the minimum, but in no case exceeding the maximum salary of such post as fixed by this Order.

17. The salaries payable under the provisions of this Order shall be paid out of the General Lighthouse Fund.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Amendment of Article 9.

1. Article 9 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In paragraph (2) thereof the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted for sub-paragraph (b):—

"(b) fly over or in the immediate vicinity of any place where a large concourse of the public is assembled in the open air in connection with any event of public interest except with the consent in writing of the Secretary of State and of the organizers if any of the event: provided that this prohibition shall not apply to an aircraft which is being used for police purposes or to an aircraft passing from

place to place in the ordinary course of navigation and flying at a reasonable height."

(b) In paragraph (8) thereof after the words "In every flying machine" there shall be inserted the words "registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and".

Amendment of Article 10.

2. The following Article shall be substituted for Article 10 of the principal Order:—

"10.—(1) Where it appears to an authorised person that any aircraft is intended or likely to be flown in such circumstances that the flight would be in contravention of any of the provisions of sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) of paragraph (1) of Article 3, or sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph (1) of Article 4, or Article 18 of this Order or of paragraph 11 of Schedule VIII to this Order, or in such circumstances as to infringe any other provision of this Order and to be a cause of danger to any person or property on land or water or in the air, such authorised person may give such directions and take such steps by way of detention of the aircraft or otherwise in relation thereto as appear to him to be necessary in order to prevent the flight, and, without prejudice to any of the provisions of this Order with respect to the obstruction of authorised persons, any person acting in contravention of any directions given under this Article shall be deemed to have acted in contravention of this Order.

(2) For the purposes of this Article the expression "authorised person" means a person authorised in writing by the Secretary of State for those purposes and in relation to paragraph 11 of Schedule VIII to this Order includes any officer of Customs and Excise and any police officer."

Amendment of Article 20.

3. In paragraph (1) of Article 20 of the principal Order the following two sub-paragraphs shall be substituted for sub-paragraphs (a), (b) and (c):—

"(a) which, being in the neighbourhood of an aerodrome, is liable by reason of its glare to endanger aircraft arriving at or departing from the aerodrome; or

(b) which, by reason of its liability to be mistaken for a light proceeding from an aerial lighthouse or for a light or part of a system of lights prescribed for display at or near an aerodrome or for marking an obstruction to air navigation, is liable to endanger aircraft;”

Amendment of Article 31.

4. In the third sub-paragraph of paragraph (2) of Article 31 of the principal Order after the word “reward” there shall be inserted the words “do not include references to any person when being carried within Great Britain and Northern Ireland in an aircraft owned by a member of any of His Majesty’s Forces or Civil Service where no payment is made to the owner in respect of such carriage otherwise than by way of an allowance payable under Regulations applicable to him as such member; but”.

Amendment of paragraph 10 of Schedule II.

5. In paragraph 10 of Schedule II to the principal Order the following sub-paragraph shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (2):—

“(3) As from the time when any such copy certificate or load sheet becomes retainable by or transmissible to the owner it shall not be carried in the aircraft to which it relates.”

Citation and commencement.

6.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 5) Order, 1937.

(2) The amendment lettered (b) in Article 1 of this Order shall come into operation on the First day of November, 1937, and the other provisions of this Order shall come into operation forthwith.

I. This Order may be cited as the Tanganyika (Legislative Council) Amendment Order in Council, 1937, and shall be construed as one with the principal Order.

II. Clause Six of the principal Order amended as aforesaid is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and the following Clause is substituted therefor:

“ VI. The Official Members of the Council shall consist of the persons for the time being lawfully discharging the functions of:—

“ The Chief Secretary, the Attorney General, the Financial Secretary, the Director of Medical Services, the Director of Education, the Administrative Secretary, the General Manager of the Railway, the Provincial Commissioner, Eastern Province, the Controller of Customs, the Director of Public Works, the Director of Lands and Mines, the Director of Agriculture, the Postmaster General of the Amalgamated Services of Kenya, Uganda and the Tanganyika Territory.”

III. This Order shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette and shall be published in the Gazette, and the Governor shall give directions for the publication of this Order at such places and in such manner and for such time or times as he thinks proper for giving due publicity thereto within the Territory.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the re-endowment of the Bishopric of Blackburn:

“ Whereas the investments which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written are now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as the Endowment Fund of the said Bishopric of Blackburn:

“ And whereas no part of the said investments is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal residence for the Diocese of Blackburn:

“ And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

“ And whereas the Right Honourable Neville Chamberlain, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to

the said Bishopric of Blackburn of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure:

"And whereas the Blackburn Diocesan Board of Finance, the Cathedral Commissioners for England and the Cathedral Council of the Cathedral Church of Saint Mary the Virgin, Blackburn, have respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the investments described in the said Schedule shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, freed and discharged from all or any trusts previously affecting the same to be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund and that in exchange for such transfer we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund a fixed annual sum of £3,000 to the said Percy Mark, Bishop of Blackburn, and to his successors in the same Bishopric as a re-endowment of the said Bishopric, subject however to the provisions mentioned in Clause 14 of the Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 3rd day of November 1927 relating to the constitution of the said Bishopric, such annual sum to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the day of such publication as aforesaid and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of such publication to the said quarterly day of payment: Provided always that as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, all trusts and provisions for the foundation of a Dean and Chapter previously attaching to the investments described in the said Schedule shall cease and determine not only as regards the said investments but also as regards the said annual sum of £3,000 and all or any the property or income which may hereafter become part of the endowment or income of the said Bishopric of Blackburn.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

" And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

" And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

" And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be ex-

pedient) the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a new Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Liverpool as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish should be assigned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, now Bishop of Liverpool (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Childwall which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint David, Childwall'.

" And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Albert Augustus, Bishop of Liverpool, and his successors, Bishops of Liverpool, for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" The District of Saint David, Childwall, being:—

" All that part of the Parish of Childwall, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Liverpool, which is bounded upon the north partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash, and partly by the New Parish of All Saints, Stoneycroft, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Mary, Wavertree, upon part of the south by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Wavertree, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish

of the Holy Trinity, Wavertree, from the said Parish of Childwall, at the junction of Childwall Road with Moss Pits Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Childwall Road for a distance of 26 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Queen's Drive and Childwall Valley Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Childwall Valley Road for a distance of 56 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Manchester and Southport Line of the Cheshire Lines Railway across Childwall Valley Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Childwall from the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John the Evangelist, Knotty Ash."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Childwall out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Liverpool.

The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Gonville and Caius College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 7th day of October, 1937, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Gonville and Caius College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statutes having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the seventh day of October 1937 (notice of the proposed amending Statutes having been given to the University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

WE, the Master and Fellows of Gonville and Caius College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the seventh Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College by making the following Amending Statutes.

STATUTE 7.

Election of the Master.

By repealing Statute 7 and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute 7.

7. Election and Pre-election of the Master.

(1) On any vacancy in the Mastership in anticipation of which no pre-election has been made the President or if he shall not be in residence or shall neglect or decline the duty then the next senior Fellow in residence and in the event of default by him the next senior Fellow in residence and so on shall forthwith after such vacancy shall have become known to him fix some time which shall be not less than twelve nor more than thirty days after the vacancy shall have so become known and convene accordingly for that time a meeting in College of all the Fellows to elect a Master and shall give not less than ten days' notice of such meeting to each of the Fellows.

(2) The President if present shall be Chairman of the meeting; but if he decline to preside the next senior Fellow shall be Chairman and so on. No person shall be elected Master unless he obtains the votes of a majority of all the Fellows for the time being and the voting in the election shall be by ballot and if any person shall obtain the requisite majority of votes that person shall thereupon become Master elect.

(3) If at the first meeting there shall be no election then the meeting shall stand adjourned to some other time to be fixed by the meeting and so from time to time and if at the end of sixty days from the occurrence of the vacancy no person be elected the power of the Fellows to elect shall cease and the Chancellor of the

University may by writing under his hand appoint a Master but if the Chancellor shall not appoint within ninety days from the occurrence of the vacancy the right of making such appointment shall devolve on the Visitor.

(4) It shall be competent to the Fellows to pre-elect a Master at any time within six calendar months preceding a date on which a vacancy will occur in the Mastership under the provisions of Statute 8 or Statute 9 (2). For the purpose of pre-election of a Master the President or if he shall not be in residence the next senior Fellow in residence may or if he receives a request in writing signed by not less than eight Fellows shall within fourteen days of receiving such request convene a meeting in College of all the Fellows and shall give not less than ten days' notice of such meeting to each of the Fellows. If the President or if he shall not be in residence the next senior Fellow in residence having been so requested shall decline or neglect the duty then any eight Fellows shall have power themselves to convene the meeting.

(5) The conduct of this meeting and of the pre-election shall be governed by the provisions of Section (2) of this Statute.

(6) If at the first meeting there shall be no pre-election then the meeting shall stand adjourned till some other time to be fixed by the meeting and so from time to time until there shall be a vacancy in the Mastership.

(7) Every person elected or appointed to the Mastership so soon as conveniently may be after his election or appointment and every person pre-elected to the Mastership so soon as conveniently may be after the occurrence of the next vacancy shall make in the College Chapel immediately after Divine service in the presence of the Registrary of the College and of at least two members of the College Council the following declaration: "I A.B. do accept the office of Master of Gonville and Caius College and do solemnly promise that I will discharge the duties thereof to the best of my judgment and ability and will uphold the interests of the College as a place of education religion learning and research." On making this declaration he shall become Master of the College and shall thereby vacate any other College offices which he may hold and shall cease to be entitled to any pension held from the College (other than any pension or superannuation allowance accruing or accrued under the Federated Superannuation System for Universities). If he wilfully neglect to make it and persist in such neglect for a period of thirty days his election pre-election or appointment shall thereupon become void.

(8) No election or pre-election of a Master shall be invalid by reason only of the meeting at which such election or pre-election shall be made not having been convened by the right person or of any other inadvertent irregularity in the convening of the meeting.

STATUTE 13.—*Unofficial Fellows.*

By repealing Sections (1) and (2) of Statute 13 and substituting therefor the following sections to form amended Sections (1) and (2) of the same Statute.

(1) In the election of Unofficial Fellows the College Council shall choose those persons being otherwise duly qualified 'according to these Statutes whom they shall think to be of

the greatest merit and most fit to be Fellows of the College as a place of education religion learning and research from among graduate members of the College or if at any time it be thought fit from among other graduates of the University of Cambridge or from among graduates of any other University who have distinguished themselves in the studies of their Universities or in some other department of science learning or art Provided that for elections made under this Section it shall be competent to the General Meeting to fix from time to time rules of superannuation.

(2) Every Fellow elected under the preceding Section shall vacate his Fellowship at the expiration of four years from the date of his election but so that the period of years shall where any Fellow was elected on a vacancy created by effluxion of time be counted from the date of the occurrence of the vacancy if that date is subsequent to that of the election. Provided that the College Council may by a special vote passed within nine calendar months before the expiration of the first tenure of his Fellowship by an Unofficial Fellow permit him to retain his Fellowship for a further period not exceeding two years, and if the College Council exercise this power the Fellow shall except as hereinafter provided by these Statutes vacate his Fellowship at the end of this further period. Provided also that the tenure of his Fellowship by an Unofficial Fellow elected before the date of the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council shall be governed by the provisions of Statute 13 in force at the time of his election.

E.—20. OF THE SCHOLARS, EXHIBITIONERS AND RESEARCH STUDENTS.

By repealing Sections (3) and (4) of Statute 20 and substituting therefor the following Sections to form amended Sections (3) and (4) of the same Statute.

STATUTE 20.—*Scholars Exhibitioners and Research Students.*

(3) The attainments of candidates for Entrance Scholarships and Exhibitions shall be tested by open examination conducted by the College acting either singly or as a member of a group of Colleges.

Entrance Scholarships shall be awarded only to candidates who have not attained before the first day of the month in which the examination begins the age of nineteen years or such lesser age as the College Council may from time to time determine except that at one such election in each year one Entrance Scholarship may be awarded without restriction of age. Entrance Exhibitions may be awarded without restriction of age.

(4) The titular emolument of a Scholarship shall be such sum not exceeding one hundred pounds and not less than sixty pounds as the College Council may from time to time determine. The actual emolument of a Scholarship shall consist of:

(a) rooms allowance, namely, either an allowance of thirty pounds per annum or free rooms (the value of which shall for this purpose be reckoned at thirty pounds per annum) as the College Council may from time to time determine unless at any time after election to his Scholarship a Scholar shall waive this allowance;

(b) such supplementary payment, if any, not exceeding with his rooms allowance the amount of his titular emolument as the College Council may from time to time determine (having regard to the principles governing the receipt of emoluments to be laid down from time to time in pursuance of the Statutes of the University) as justified from time to time by the pecuniary circumstances of the Scholar and his family Provided that in the event of a Scholar coming into residence during the Long Vacation the College Council shall have power to make in addition an allowance from the Scholarship Fund for the rent rates and taxes of his rooms during such period of residence Provided also that the total payments to him from the Scholarship Fund shall not exceed in any year the total amount of his titular emolument.

STATUTE 33.—Residence in College of Officers and Fellows.

By repealing Statute 33 and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute 33.

33. Residence in College of Officers and Fellows.

(1) The College Council shall have the power of requiring any College Officer to reside in College during term and during that part of the Long Vacation in which members of the College *in statu pupillari* are allowed to be in residence.

(2) No College Officer or Fellow shall use rooms in College as a residence for his wife or family unless such rooms shall have been previously approved by the College Council for the purpose.

Thence in a south-easterly direction along the road to Plungar, in the County of Leicester, and in a south-westerly direction to Stathern Bridge on the Grantham Canal. Thence in a south-easterly direction along the road to the London and North Eastern and London, Midland and Scottish Joint Railway and in a south-westerly direction past Harby to the road junction about 500 feet east of the Church at Hose.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a general north-westerly direction along the road skirting the north of Hose to the point where it crosses the Grantham Canal. Thence following the canal in a general westerly direction past Hose Gorse and Kinoulton Grange, in the County of Nottingham, to the point where it is crossed by the road from Hickling to Kinoulton. An Area of approximately 188 sq. miles situated in the Counties of York and Durham.

Commencing at a point on the coast at low water mark situated approximately east-north-east of Seaton Carew, in the County of Durham, and about 1,750 feet south of Little

Scar, thence in a south-easterly direction following the coast at low water mark for about 25 miles, crossing the mouth of the River Tees to a point situated approximately east of the coast-guard station at Sandsend in the County of York.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a westerly direction past Lythe, over Ellerby Moor, Wapley Moor and Girrick Moor, and past White Cross to Comondale. running in a south-westerly direction through Tadcaster and in a southerly direction past Limekiln Wood, through Towton, past Barks-ton Ash and through Sherburn in Elmet to the point where it is crossed by the London and North Eastern Railway (Leeds and Selby Branch) about 500 feet east of South Milford Railway Station.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the said railway in a westerly direction to the point in Leeds where it crosses Briggate about 500 feet east of New Station.

Western Boundary.

Thence through Leeds by way of Briggate, The Headrow, Woodhouse Lane, Headingley Lane and Otley Road to West Park. Thence along the road running in a general northerly direction past Bramhope, Pool Bank and Pool to the cross-roads at Street Close, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 164 sq. miles situated in the County of York.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the junction of Fishergate and Tower Street in the City of York, thence in a westerly direction through the city by way of Skeldergate Bridge, Bishopgate Street, Price's Lane, Nunnery Lane, Blossom Street and Holgate Road. Thence in a north-westerly direction along the main road past Acomb Park, over Foss Bridge, past Gowlands and Green Hammerton to the cross-roads at Providence Green.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a southerly direction along the road past Cattal Railway Station, through Cattal and past Wharton Lodge to the cross-roads about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of Walton Lodge. Thence along the road in an easterly direction to the road junction near Brook Hall. Thence along the main road running in a south-westerly direction through Tadcaster and in a southerly direction past Limekiln Wood, through Towton past Barkston Ash and through Sherburn in Elmet to the point where it is crossed by the London and North Eastern Railway about 500 feet east of South Milford Railway Station.

Thence along the said railway in an easterly direction past Selby, Hemingbrough and Wressell Stations to the point where it crosses the road at Rowland Hall.

West Cottingwith and past Home Farm. Thence in a south-westerly direction through Wheldrake to the road junction about 500 feet west of Wheldrake Railway Station. Thence in a north-westerly direction along the main road past Gothic House, Crockey Hill, Lingcroft Lodge, through Fulford to the junction of Fishergate and Tower Street in the City of York, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 140 sq. miles situated in the County of York.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at Park Street Bridge in the town of Selby and thence in a general westerly direction for about 20 miles along the London and North Eastern Railway (Leeds and Selby Branch) to the point in Leeds where it crosses Briggate about 500 feet east of New Station.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the main road running in a south-easterly direction through Leeds and in a southerly direction past Carr Lane, Robin Hood and Outwood to Wakefield, passing through the town by way of Leeds Road, Northgate, Springs and Kirkgate to the bridge over the River Calder.

Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road past Charlston Common and Purston Jaglin to the cross-roads in Pontefract about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of the Barracks. Thence in an easterly direction along the road through Holbrook to the point where it is crossed by the railway connecting Beighton and Clowne about 1,500 feet south-west of the Sewage Works at Killamarsh. Thence in a general south-south-easterly direction along the said railway to the point where it crosses the railway from Clowne to Staveley. Thence for a short distance in a south-westerly direction along the latter railway to the point where it is crossed by the road from Barborough Common to Clowne, thence along the said road in a south-easterly direction for about 1,050 feet to the road junction, thence in a south-westerly direction along the road past Clowne Common and Shuttlewood Common to the point where it crosses the London Midland and Scottish Railway (Doe Lea Branch) about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south-west of Nether Woodhouse. Thence along the said railway in a southerly direction past Palterton and Sutton Station to the point south of Griff Wood where it is crossed by the road running east from Ault Hucknall, thence along the road running in a southerly direction for about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile to the fork-roads, thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to the point where it crosses the London Midland and Scottish Railway (Doe Lea Branch) about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north of Rowthorn and Hardwick Railway Station, thence along the said railway in a south-easterly and easterly direction to its junction with the London Midland and Scottish Railway (Tibshelf and Pleasley Branch), about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile south-west of Pleasley Railway Station. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction past Baxterhill and Moorhaigh Wood Farm

WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, chapter III, section 5. do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, make out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the Benefices whereof the names and the names of the counties and dioceses wherein the same are respectively situate are stated in the first three columns of the Schedule hereto, and to his successors Incumbents of the same Benefice, a grant of a sum to be calculated at the yearly rate stated in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of the Benefice, for the period commencing as from the date stated in the fifth column of the said Schedule and terminating on the 1st day of May, 1938 (unless at any time before the expiration of the said period the grant of such sum shall have been cancelled or withdrawn by a resolution of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners), and to be payable so long as the same shall continue in quarterly instalments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August, and the 1st day of November: Provided always that the sum so granted or any

quarterly portion thereof shall be payable only upon the production to us on or after each of the said quarterly days of payment of a certificate (in such form as may be required by us) under the hand of the Bishop of the Diocese in which the Benefice is situate certifying that, during the quarter then ended, there has been employed within the Parish of the Benefice and duly licensed by such Bishop such Assistant Curate as is indicated in the sixth column of the said Schedule, and that such Assistant Curate has been in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than £150 per annum: Provided also that such sum is granted upon and is payable only subject to the satisfaction of the further conditions (if any) stated with reference thereto at the foot of the said Schedule: Provided lastly that this Instrument which is intended to be executed in several parts (one part for each Diocese concerned) shall operate only as a single grant in favour of each of the Benefices mentioned in the said Schedule.

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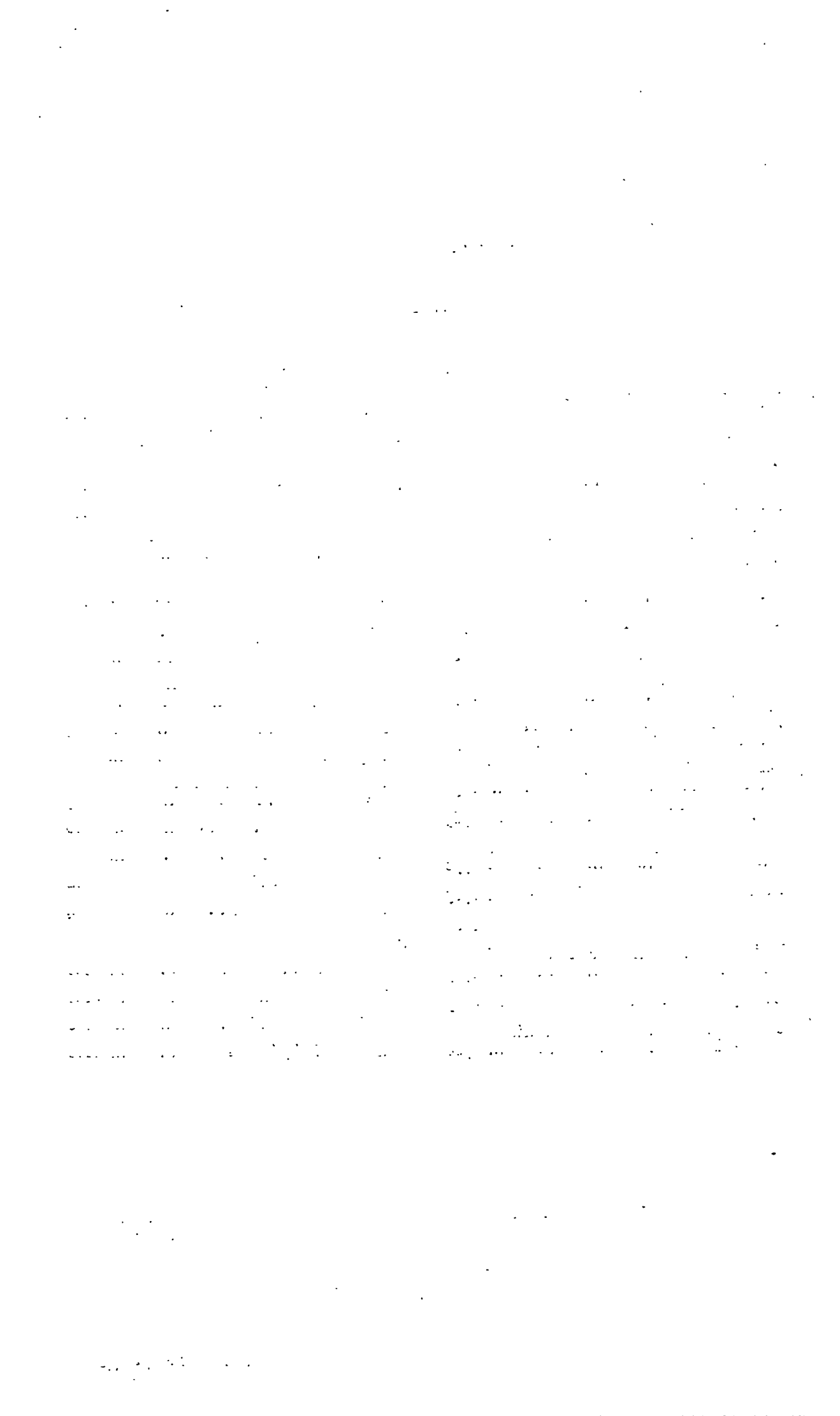
