The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Queen's College, Oxford, on the 18th day of December, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

THE QUEEN'S COLLEGE, OXFORD.

AMENDMENT TO STATUTE.

Whereas by a Statute made by the University on the 25th May, 1937, the provisions of the University Statute concerning College Contributions for University purposes were amended by altering the basis of contribution in respect of income derived from Trust Funds held for the benefit of a College whether vested in the College or otherwise and in other particulars:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the provisions of the Statute of the College concerning Disposal of Revenue by enabling the College to apply income derived from certain of such Trust Funds in or towards payment of contributions for University purposes imposed on the College in respect of such income:

And whereas the College as trustee or governing body of the trusts specified in the Schedule to this Statute has consented under its corporate seal to the alteration of such trusts by amendment of the Statute of the College concerning disposal of Revenue in manner hereinafter provided:

Now the College in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 and of all other powers enabling it by this Statute passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting hereby enacts subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council as follows:—

Clause 2 of Statute XXIII—Disposal of Revenue of the Statutes of the College shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following clause:—

- "2. (I) Income to which this clause applies may be applied in or towards the payment of any charges for University purposes imposed on the College by any Statute or Statutes made for the University from time to time under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 and the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 to the extent to which any such charges are so imposed in respect of such income.
- (2) This clause applies to income arising from any endowment, benefaction, or trust, and applicable to the maintenance of any fellowship, scholarship, or exhibition within the College, or to any other purpose for the benefit of the College or of the Head or any other member of the College, including any fund for the purchase of advowsons, in every case where the endowment, benefaction, or trust
 - (a) was created by an instrument which came into operation not less than 60 years before the 1st January, 1937, or

(b) is included among the endowments, benefactions, or trusts specified in the this clause, Schedule appended to trustees or governing bodies whereof have consented to the provisions of this clause.

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF ESTATE SURVEYORS, GRADE II, IN H.M. OFFICE OF Works.

N.B.—Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. petitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises on the occurrence The regulations are liable to of vacancies. alteration from time to time.

I. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 on a date to be fixed in respect of the Competition in which they are to take part, but must not have attained 27 years of age on that

Candidates who have served in H.M. Office of Works may deduct from their actual age any time, not exceeding two years, which they have spent in such service after attaining the

Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding

five years during which they have so served. No candidate may deduct more than five years.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

5. H.M. Office of Works will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancies which they desire to fill, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary, H.M. Office of Works, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from the Establishment Officer of that Department, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps of the value of five shillings; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will
