WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of February, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the re-endowment of the Bishopric of Southwell:

"Whereas the investments and property which are particularly described in the

Schedule hereunder written are now held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the Endowment Fund of the said Bishopric of Southwell:

"And whereas no part of the said investments and property is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal residence for the Diocese of Southwell:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments and property should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Neville Chamberlain, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Southwell, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to the said Bishopric of Southwell of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure:

"And whereas the Southwell Diocesan Board of Finance, the Right Reverend Nugent, Bishop of Lincoln, and the Right Reverend Edward Sydney, Bishop of Lichfield, each being the bishop for the time being of a contributory bishopric, the Cathedral Commissioners for England and the Cathedral Council of the Cathedral Church of Saint Mary the Virgin at Southwell have respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the investments and property described in the said Schedule shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, freed and discharged from all or any trusts previously affecting the same to be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund and that in exchange for such transfer we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year a fixed annual sum of £3,184 to the said Henry, Bishop of Southwell, and to his successors in the same Bishopric, as a re-endowment of the said Bishopric, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the day of such publication as aforesaid and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of such publication to the said quarterly day of payment:

" Provided always that, as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, none of the trusts and provisions from which the said investments and property are hereby freed and discharged shall attach to the said annual sum of £3,184 save and except the primary trust for the endowment or benefit of the said Bishopric.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

" 2. A perpetual annual payment of £500 charged upon the Common Fund of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners and formerly part of the endowment of the Bishopric of Lincoln.

" 3. A perpetual annual payment of £300 charged upon the Common Fund of the

Ecclesiastical Commissioners and formerly part of the endowment of the Bishopric of Lichfield."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwell.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of December, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Clifton, Holy Trinity, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said three Benefices of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less; Clifton, Holy Trinity; and Clifton Wood, Saint Peter; duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Bristol and therein recommended the union of the said three Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, including an alteration of boundaries affecting the Parish of the Benefice of Clifton, Saint Andrew, in the said County and Diocese and the said Bishop of Bristol signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Bristol embodies certain modifications thereof:

" And whereas the said Benefices of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, and Clifton, Holy Trinity, are now full, the Reverend Canon Sydney Field Alford being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of

Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, and the Reverend John Southwood Jackson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, and the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, is at present vacant:

" And whereas the patronage of each of the said Benefices of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less; Clifton, Holy Trinity; and Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, now belongs to one and the same body of Patrons:

" And whereas there is at present no Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less but there is in the hands of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a fund applicable for and towards the provision of a Parsonage House for such Benefice:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and with the consent of the said John Southwood Jackson (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, and the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, Saint Andrew the Less and Saint Peter' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme both of the said Benefices of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, and Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, shall be vacant the union of the three Benefices referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall take effect forthwith, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, only shall be vacant, then the union of all three of the said Benefices shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, and pending such union the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, and the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, shall upon the day aforesaid be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity and Saint Peter'.

" 3. That the Church of the Parish of Clifton, Holy Trinity, shall be the Parish Church of any United Parish constituted under the provisions of Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Clifton, Holy Trinity, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for such United Parish.

" 4. That upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint

Andrew the Less, Dowry Square, Clifton, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the said Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 6. That upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, a Curate shall be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that the stipend to be assigned to the Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £200 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Subsection (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 7. That upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 8. That upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, the Parsonage House Fund at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of the said Benefice of Clifton, Dowry Square, Saint Andrew the Less, shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the said Measures.

" 9. That so soon as conveniently may be after the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the said Expenses Fund.

" 10.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, the Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold or disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to

us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Bristol under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say (1) a sum shall be appropriated sufficient to meet the cost of the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or of the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations, (2) a capital sum sufficient in our opinion to produce an annual income not exceeding £50 shall be set aside as a fund for the maintenance of the fabrics of and the Services in the Churches of the United Benefice and such fund shall be transferred to the Diocesan Board of Finance or other body of trustees willing to receive the same and (3) any residue of the said net proceeds shall be applied for and towards the cost of the provision of a site for and the erection of a Church for a new District (the patronage whereof shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, and by the Bishop alternately, the first turn of presentation being exercisable by the Bishop of Bristol) and to be formed partly or wholly out of the Parish of Saint Christopher, Brislington, in the said Diocese of Bristol.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of the Holy Trinity, Clifton, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Bristol and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, or such of them as the Bishop of Bristol shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Bristol for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Bristol which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, being dispensed with by reason of any union recommended by this Scheme taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of office and other circumstances shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Bristol equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful

for us if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 11. That with the consents of the Reverend Prebendary Francis Edward Murphy of Bladud, Entry Hill, Bath; the Reverend Canon Charles Edward Wilson, of The Vicarage, Gipsy Hill, S.E.19; the Reverend Canon Arthur James Tait, of Minster Precincts, Peterborough; the Reverend Christopher Maude Chavasse of Saint Peter's Hall, Oxford; and the Very Reverend William Edward Reginald Morrow, Provost of the Cathedral Church of Saint Mary the Virgin at Chelmsford, being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Clifton, Saint Andrew (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), and with the consent also of the Reverend Henry Louis Bothamley, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clifton, Saint Andrew (testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, (a) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Clifton, Saint Andrew, all that part of the area now comprising the Parish of the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, which lies to the north of an imaginary line following the northern boundary of the Public Baths in Jacob's Wells Road and a straight line in continuation south-westwards thereof to the middle of Bellevue Cottages, the middle of Bellevue Cottages to its junction with Bellevue Crescent, thence south-eastwards to the middle of Worldsend Lane, the middle of Worldsend Lane to the eastern end of Southernhay, thence south-westwards along the middle of Southernhay to its junction with Cliftonwood Road and thence the middle of the passage or lane running at the backs of the houses on the northern side of Cliftonwood Crescent, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereto annexed and is thereon coloured red, and (b) there shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the United Benefice all that part (other than the area occupied by St. Andrew's Schools and the grounds thereof) of the Parish of the said Benefice of Clifton, Saint Andrew, which lies to the south of an imaginary line following the backs of the houses numbered respectively 1 to 5 Ambra Terrace and 13 to 69 on the northern side of Ambra Vale East and the backs of the houses numbered respectively 1 to 14 Ellenborough Buildings, the backs of the houses numbered respectively 31 to 35 on the western side of Church Lane, and the northern boundary of the house numbered 35 in Church Lane, all which part is more particularly delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan and is thereon coloured blue.

" 12. That with the consents (testified as aforesaid) of the said Francis Edward Murphy; Charles Edward Wilson; Arthur James Tait; Christopher Maude Chavasse; and William Edward Reginald Morrow; being the Patrons of the said Benefices of Clifton, Holy Trinity, and Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, upon the taking effect of any union recommended by this Scheme including the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter, a portion of the endowments and property of the United Benefice shall

be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall be transferred and annexed as follows, that is to say, (a) an annual sum of £100 (being part of a stipend at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Clifton Wood, Saint Peter) shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Clifton, Saint Andrew, and (b) a capital sum of £4,620 now held by us in respect of which a payment at the rate of £160 per annum is made to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity, together with an annual sum of £12 (increasing to £60 upon the union recommended in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect, being part of a stipend at present payable by us to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Clifton, Holy Trinity) shall be held and accumulated by us for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District contemplated by Clause 10 (b) (3) of this Scheme.

" Provided always that pending the formation of such new District and if the Bishop of Bristol shall so direct the income in respect of the endowments including any accumulations thereof so held by us in favour of such new District shall be paid subject to such conditions as we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall deem expedient, towards the stipend of a Curate serving the area or a part of the area proposed to be comprised within such new District.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Peter, Clifton Wood, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any further recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop

of Bristol has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 16th day of December, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cures (hereinafter called 'the said Benefices') of Lockington and Sandhutton (near York) both in the County of York and in the Diocese of York:

" Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Lockington and Sandhutton

is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Sir James Heron Walker formerly of Sandhutton and now of Ringdale Manor, Faringdon, Berks, Baronet:

"And whereas the said James Heron Walker is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Lockington and Sandhutton now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Archbishop of York for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, now Archbishop of York, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said William, Archbishop of York, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices of Lockington and Sandhutton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the rights of Patronage or Advowsons so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arise or exist, that is to say, in the Parishes of Lockington and Sandhutton:
