A PROCLAMATION DIRECTING THAT SILVER COINS OF THE UNITED KINGDOM SHALL CEASE TO BE LEGAL TENDER IN BRITISH GUIANA FOR A PAYMENT OF AN AMOUNT EXCEEDING FORTY SHILLINGS.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by virtue of a Proclamation of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, dated the third day of February, 1898 (hereinafter called "the Proclamation"), certain provisions of the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by Section two of the Coinage Act, 1891, were applied with the modifications specified in the Proclamation to the colonies or possessions therein mentioned (including Our colony of British Guiana):

And whereas it was provided by the Proclamation that silver coins which, under Section four of the Coinage Act, 1870, as set out in the Proclamation, were legal tender should, in any of Our said colonies or possessions in which the like coins were at the date of the promulgation of the Proclamation therein legal tender for a payment of an unlimited amount, continue to be legal tender for a payment of any amount:

And whereas the Proclamation was promulgated in Our colony of British Guiana on the twenty-fifth day of March, 1898, and at that date the like coins were in Our colony of British Guiana legal tender for a payment of an unlimited amount:

And whereas by the Coinage Act, 1920, provision was made for the amendment of the Coinage Act, 1870, in respect of the standard of fineness of silver coins, and it was enacted that where by virtue of a proclamation made

under Section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, the whole or any part of that Act was in force in any British possession at the date of the commencement of the Coinage Act, 1920, the Coinage Act, 1870, should, as from that date, apply in that possession as amended by the Coinage Act, 1920, and that any Order in Council or proclamation directing that any coins which under the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891, were legal tender in the United Kingdom should be current and legal tender in any British possession should extend to coins which were legal tender in the United Kingdom under the Coinage Acts, 1870 and 1891, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1920:

And whereas by virtue of the Coinage Act, 1870, it is lawful for Us with the advice of Our Privy Council by proclamation to revoke or alter any proclamation previously made under that Act:

And whereas it is expedient that the silver coins which under Section four of the Coinage Act, 1870, as set out in the Proclamation and amended by the Coinage Act, 1920, are legal tender should no longer be legal tender in Our colony of British Guiana for a payment of an amount exceeding forty shillings:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said recited provisions and of all other powers enabling Us in this behalf do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

1. As from the first day of August, 1938, the silver coins which under Section four of the Coinage Act, 1870, as set out in the Proclamation and amended by the Coinage Act, 1920, are legal tender shall in Our colony of British Guiana be legal tender for a payment of an amount not exceeding forty shillings, but for no

greater amount, and accordingly so much of the Proclamation as provides that the said silver coins shall be legal tender for a payment of an unlimited amount shall, as from that date, cease to have effect as respects Our colony of British Guiana.

2. This Proclamation may be cited as the British Guiana (Silver Coinage) Proclamation, 1938.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Twenty-third day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and in the second year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Somaliland Orders in Council, 1929 to 1935, in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Somaliland Order in Council, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Somaliland Order in Council, 1929, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order; and the Somaliland Orders in Council, 1929 to 1935, and this Order may be cited together as the Somaliland Orders in Council, 1929 to 1938.

2. Article 3 of the Principal Order shall be amended by deleting paragraph (viii) thereof and substituting therefor the following:—

"(viii) 'Protectorate Court' means the Court constituted in accordance with the provisions of Article 17A."

3. The following Article shall be inserted at the commencement of Part V of the Principal Order, before the heading "(a) *Criminal Matters*":—

"17A. The Protectorate Court shall be held by the Legal Secretary, or, in his absence from the Protectorate or in any case where the Governor shall so direct, by the Governor or the Secretary to the Government."

4. This Order shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 7th December, 1855, directing the discontinuance of burials in, amongst other places, the Churchyard of the Parish Church of St. Helen, Ashby-de-la-Zouch:

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 7th December, 1855, was varied by Orders

in Council of the 25th June, 1903, and the 4th September, 1918:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Orders in Council be further varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council of the 7th December, 1855, the 25th June, 1903, and the 4th September, 1918, it shall be lawful after the death of the Right Honourable Warner Francis John Plantagenet, 15th Earl of Huntingdon, and his wife, and subject to the conditions hereinafter set forth, to bury their bodies in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of St. Helen, Ashby-de-la-Zouch, in a walled grave to be constructed in a grave space in which no interment has taken place within the period of fourteen years prior to the 1st day of June, 1938: provided that the burials hereby authorised shall be subject to compliance with the requirement that each of the coffins buried in such walled grave shall be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of St. John's, Castlerigg and Wythburn Township, in the County of Cumberland, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 6th May, 1938, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 20th day of June next, and such Order has been published in the *London Gazette*, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish of St. John's, Castlerigg and Wythburn Township, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

St. John's, Castlerigg and Wythburn Township.—Forthwith and entirely in the Wythburn Churchyard, in the said Parish.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of July, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Islington, Saint Stephen, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, and Islington, Saint Stephen, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of London embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, is now full the Reverend James Paget Wright being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen now belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the Benefice of Islington:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, belongs to the Trustees of the Church Trust Fund and the said Trustees are willing to surrender such Patronage to the said Incumbent of the said Benefice of Islington, and his successors, to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted shall belong wholly to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Islington:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, with the consents of the said Trustees of the Church Trust Fund namely the Reverend Earle Legh Langston, of The Rectory, Sevenoaks, in the County of Kent, Robert Armitage, Esquire, of Farnley Hall, Leeds, in the County of York, the Reverend Alfred St. John Thorpe, of the Vicarage, Watford, in the County of Hertford, Frederick William Carter, Esquire, of Ashmead, Redhill, in the County of Surrey, Ernest

Phillips Foquett Sutton, Esquire, of Erlegh Park, near Reading, in the County of Berks, Ernest William Dawson, of Angrove House, Crowborough, in the County of Sussex, and the Reverend Talbot Greaves Mohan, of Falcon Court, No. 32 Fleet Street, London E.C.4, and with the consent of the Reverend James Marshall Hewitt, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Islington (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, and the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen with Saint Bartholomew' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, and the then Incumbent of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, shall have been instituted to Islington, Saint Bartholomew, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint

Stephen, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice, and towards the remuneration of such Curate a part of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual sum of £140 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, shall be appropriated and together with the Curate Grant of £60 per annum at present made by us in the case of the same Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, shall be paid by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of such Curate as aforesaid.

" 7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say (1) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter mentioned or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations as hereinafter provided; (2) a sum equal to one fifth of the said net proceeds shall be appropriated to the said Expenses Fund; (3) a sum to be determined by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in consultation with the Bishop of London, shall be applied towards the cost of repairs to the Church, Parsonage House, and Parochial Buildings of the United Benefice and any residue of such net proceeds shall be

held and applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as a fund for and towards the repair of Churches within the Rural Deanery of Islington.

"(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Stephen, Islington, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, as aforesaid.

"(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners under the provisions of this clause, receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"8. That with the consent of the said James Marshall Hewitt (testified as aforesaid) upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice that is to say an annual sum of £143 being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Stephen, shall be severed or diverted from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the augmentation of the Benefice of Highbury Vale, Saint John, in the said Diocese of London.

"9. That with the consents of the Trustees of the Church Trust Fund and of the said James Marshall Hewitt (testified as aforesaid) upon the union taking effect all the interest in the patronage of the United Benefice arising in respect of the patronage of the said Benefice of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, now belonging to the said Trustees of the Church Trust Fund as aforesaid, shall be surrendered to the said James Marshall Hewitt and his successors, Incumbents of the said Benefice of Islington, to the intent that the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Islington for the time being.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Bartholomew, Islington, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas an appeal against the said Scheme has been made to His Majesty in Council by Mr. T. M. Hearn, on behalf of the Parishioners of Islington, Saint Bartholomew, and such appeal was referred to the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council by Order in Council of the 22nd day of October, 1937:

And whereas the Lords of the said Committee having taken the said appeal into consideration, reported to His Majesty in Council their opinion that the appeal ought to be dismissed and the said Scheme be approved:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by Order of the 16th day of May, 1938, to approve the said Report:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said

Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 7th day of April, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Middleton (in Rothwell) and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Andrew, Stourton, both in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell) and the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Stourton, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Middleton (in Rothwell) and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Stourton, which are mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and are delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 13th day of April, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 16th day of the same month the Benefice of Christ Church, Leeds, and the Benefice of Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, Leeds, both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice and it was by the same Order provided amongst other things (1) that out of the aggregate fund comprising the proceeds of the sale of the sites and

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR APPOINTMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION TO THE SITUATION OF SECOND CLASS CLERK IN HIS MAJESTY'S GENERAL REGISTER HOUSE, EDINBURGH.

N.B.—Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of vacancies proposed to be filled from outside the Service. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The Keeper of the Registers and Records will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

2. Applications for appointment must be made to the Keeper of the Registers and Records on the prescribed form by a date to be fixed on each occasion.

3. Candidates must have attained 21 years of age and must not have attained 30 years of age on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

4. Where the vacancy or vacancies to be filled are in the Sasine Office, candidates will be required to have passed the examination qualifying for admission as an apprentice to a Law Agent, or an examination of a standard accepted as equivalent by the Civil Service Commissioners and to have served in the office of a Conveyancer practising in Scotland for a period of at least five years after age 16, with the proviso that this period may be relaxed in

the case of any candidate who has qualified by examination for a university degree in law.

Where the vacancy or vacancies to be filled are in the Record Office, candidates without the above qualifications may be accepted, provided they show that they have received such systematic education, general and/or technical, as in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners fits them for the post; in general, they should possess a university degree in arts or other equivalent qualification, and should have special qualifications for historical research and preferably some experience in such research.

Evidence on these points must be sent in at such times and in such manner as may be appointed.

5. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher, public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

7. The Keeper of the Registers and Records will examine the candidates' credentials, and will submit to the Civil Service Commissioners the names of those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment. The Civil Service Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

The Civil Service Commissioners may submit any or all of the candidates to a qualifying examination as to educational qualifications.

8. Candidates who are recommended by the Keeper of the Registers and Records and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners

as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board in Edinburgh, who will recommend for the vacancy or vacancies the candidate or candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and the decision of the Selection Board will be final. The Selection Board will be constituted by the Keeper of the Registers and Records, who will preside over the Board, in consultation with the Civil Service Commissioners, who will be represented on the Board. The Board will take into consideration the candidates' record of experience and education, any recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidate as shown at this interview; and on their estimation of all the above evidence they will frame their decisions.

9. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department.

10. A candidate selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £5 10s.

11. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with a candidate's work, whether at school, at the university, in industry or business, in the Forces, or otherwise.
