WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 19th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Broadhempston and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Woodland both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Charles, Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Broadhempston and Woodland duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two

Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Broadhempston is now full the Reverend Henry Richard Evans being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Woodland is at present vacant:

"And whereas the share of the patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which upon a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Woodland would in our opinion be negligible:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter, and of the said Henry Richard Evans (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Broadhempston and the said Benefice of Woodland shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Broadhempston and Woodland' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Totnes and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measure provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Broadhempston shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Broadhempston shall (until

revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Henry Richard Evans if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Broadhempston shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Woodland shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Broadhempston shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Woodland and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be appropriated as a fund for the maintenance and repair of the Church at Woodland and such fund shall be held and administered by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners or shall be transferred by us to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the said Diocese of Exeter or other body willing to accept and apply the same as trustees for the purpose aforesaid.

"6. That after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Broadhempston.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of

one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts', and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Coleshill, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Birmingham:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Coleshill has been improved by means of certain sales of portions of the glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which sales were effected under the authority of the said Acts by former Vicars or Incumbents of the said Benefice of Coleshill:

"And whereas the investments of the net proceeds of the said sales made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts include (*inter alia*) a sum of £18,292 6s. 6d. £3 10s. 0d. per centum per annum Conversion Stock which sum of stock is now held by us in trust to pay the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure

with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said sales payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said sales exceeds the annual sum of £600 and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Coleshill is now vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose, first, that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, a sum of £12,857 2s. 10d. £3 10s. 0d. per centum per annum Conversion Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of Stock) or any securities or investments then representing such sum of Stock shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Coleshill and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned, and secondly, that as from the date of the cessation of the yearly payment which became charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board upon the resignation therefrom of the Reverend William Reginald Wyldbore Smith, a further sum of £4,257 2s. 10d. £3 10s. 0d. per centum per annum Conversion Stock (being a further portion of the first mentioned sum of Stock) or any securities or investments then representing such sum of Stock shall likewise cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Coleshill and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendation and proposal relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore

mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patron of the said Benefice of Coleshill, and the said Patron has not made any objection to the said Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Birmingham.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe is a Cure wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it appears to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe which is mentioned and described in the Schedule to this Scheme and is delineated on the map or plan annexed to this Scheme should be constituted a separate District for ecclesiastical purposes in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 1st day of April, 1938, and published in the London Gazette on the 5th day of the same month the Benefice of Earlham with Bowthorpe and the Benefice of Colney both in the said County and Diocese, were united into one Benefice under the style of 'The United Benefice of Colney with Earlham' and it was by the same Order provided

amongst other things (1) that an ecclesiastical district should be formed wholly or partly out of the Parish of Earlham (now by the same Order united with the Parish of Bowthorpe) (2) that a part of the property and endowment of the said United Benefice of Colney with Earlham that is to say (a) certain capital sums and sums of Stock now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty and producing an annual income of not less than £54 and (b) a sum of £170 per annum out of the appropriation made by the said Governors in respect of the extinguishment of tithe rentcharges formerly belonging to the said Benefices of Earlham with Bowthorpe and Colney, should be held and applied by the said Governors for the endowment of such proposed District:

"And whereas the District hereinafter proposed to be constituted is the new District to which the above mentioned Order in Council has reference:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £150 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as the Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £150 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by us, by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes by the name of 'The District of Saint Anne, Earlham'.

"And we further recommend that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or to any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Anne, Earlham, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich, which is bounded upon part of the north-west by the Parish of Costessey, upon the north-east by the Parish of Hellesdon, upon the east partly by the Parish of Heigham and partly by the New Parish of Saint Thomas, Heigham, upon the south by

the Parish of Eaton, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the remaining part of the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Eaton from the said Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe crosses the middle of Bluebell Road near its junction with North Park Avenue, and extending thence northward along the middle of Bluebell Road for a distance of 46 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the house and premises known as The Vicarage, Bluebell Road, and extending thence westward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of four chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the same premises, and extending thence northward along the last mentioned wall or fence and along the wall or fence in continuation thereof for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where such wall or fence reaches the southern side of Earlham Road, and extending thence first northward to and then westward along the middle of Earlham Road for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of Old House Plantation and extending thence first northward to and along such wall or fence and then eastward along the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the said Plantation for a distance in all of $18\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the western side of Earlham Green Lane, and extending thence first eastward to and then north-westward along the middle of Earlham Green Lane for a distance of $57\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary of the County Borough of Norwich, and extending thence north-eastward along such County Borough Boundary for a distance of $21\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Dereham Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe from the said Parish of Costessey."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, and of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Sequestrators of the Cure out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Sequestrators have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Hornchurch is a Parish wherein or in part whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Hornchurch which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the Warden and Scholars of Saint Mary College of Winchester in Oxford commonly called New College in Oxford (hereinafter called 'the said Warden and Scholars') have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the endowment of the said proposed separate District:

"And whereas the said Warden and Scholars as the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000, have nominated themselves, the said

Warden and Scholars, as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed District and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Henry, now Bishop of Chelmsford (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Hornchurch which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named 'the District of Saint Peter, Harold Wood'.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in the said Warden and Scholars, and their successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Peter, Harold Wood, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Hornchurch, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon part of the south-west by the New Parish of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath, upon the north-west by the Parish of Romford, upon the east partly by the Parish of South Weald and partly by the Parish of Upminster, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining part of the south-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Upminster from the said Parish of Hornchurch at the centre of the bridge or culvert which carries Southend Road across the River Ingrebourne and extending thence first westward and then north-westward along the middle of Southend Road for a distance of 1 mile and 31 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hornchurch from the said New Parish of All Saints, Squirrel's Heath."

THE TRADE BOARDS (RUBBER MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1938. SPECIAL ORDER DATED

1938, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, APPLYING THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 (9 EDW. 7, C. 22) AND 1918 (8 AND 9 GEO. 5, C. 32) TO THE RUBBER MANUFACTURING TRADE, AND VARYING THE TRADE BOARDS (TOY MANUFACTURING) ORDER, 1935.

Whereas the Minister of Labour hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") is empowered

under and by virtue of sub-section (2) of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply if of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade, or any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade.

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (i) of Section 2 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that a Special Order may be varied by a subsequent Special Order:

And whereas the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, do not apply to the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order, except as regards such operations as may be covered by the Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing) Order, 1935:

And whereas the Minister as respects the trade specified in the Appendix to this Order is of the aforesaid opinion:

Now, therefore, the Minister by virtue of the powers conferred as aforesaid and of all other powers in that behalf hereby makes the following Special Order:—

1. The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix hereto.

2. The Trade Boards (Toy Manufacturing) Order, 1935, is hereby varied by the exclusion therefrom of operations falling within the trade specified in the Appendix hereto.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Rubber Manufacturing) Order, 1938.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into force on the day of 1938.

APPENDIX.

THE RUBBER MANUFACTURING TRADE.

Subject to the provisions of this Appendix the Rubber Manufacturing Trade consists of the following operations:

1.—(a) The preparation and manufacture of rubber materials and the manufacture and repair of rubber articles in an establishment wholly or mainly so engaged, or in a branch or department of an establishment being a branch or department wholly or mainly engaged as aforesaid;

(b) the rubberising of fabrics;

(c) the regeneration of used or waste rubber;

(d) all work incidental to the operations specified in sub-paragraphs (a) to (c) of this paragraph.

2. Notwithstanding anything in this Appendix the following operations are not operations in the Rubber Manufacturing Trade:—

(a) the preparation or manufacture of rubber materials and the manufacture or re-

pair of rubber articles, including work incidental thereto, in a department of a factory, if the factory as a whole is mainly engaged on operations other than those specified in paragraph 1 hereof and the materials and articles are used in the manufacture or repair of articles made or repaired in the factory, not being rubber articles;

(b) the making up from rubberised fabrics of articles other than vulcanised articles;

(c) work performed by dental mechanics;

(d) the manufacture of articles made from asbestos;

(e) the manufacture of electric cables.

3. For the purpose of this Appendix—

“rubber materials” includes materials wholly or mainly composed of one or more of the following substances or substitutes, that is to say, rubber, gutta percha, balata, rubber compounds and dispersions commonly known in the rubber manufacturing trade as rubber, and substitutes for any of the aforementioned substances if such substitutes are processed on machinery of the kind normally used for processing rubber;

“rubber articles” includes articles commonly known in the said trade as rubber articles, gutta percha articles or balata articles;

“work incidental” includes the work of general factory labourers and storemen.
