BOROUGH OF BERWICK-UPON-TWEED.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1933.

SECTION 25.

WHEREAS a majority of the whole Council of the Borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed did on the 2nd day of August, 1938, agree to petition, and the Council of the said Borough thereupon petitioned His Majesty under and in pursuance of the provisions of section 25 of the Local Government Act, 1933, for an alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said Borough:

And whereas on the 10th day of August, 1938, the Right Honourable Sir Samuel Hoare, Baronet, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Charles Matthew Knowles, Esquire, LL.B., Barrister-at-Law, to be a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme with respect to the afore-mentioned Petition of the Council of the Borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed:

And whereas the said Commissioner did accordingly prepare a Scheme, dated the 16th day of August, 1938:

And whereas the said Scheme was on the 25th day of August, 1938, submitted to His Majesty in Council for approval:

And whereas His Majesty by and with the advice of His Privy Council, did approve the said Scheme of the said Commissioner and did Order that the same would come into operation forthwith:

Now, therefore, under the provisions of subsection (8) of section 25 of the Local Government Act, 1933, the Council of the Borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed do hereby publish notice that the said Scheme has been approved and that a copy thereof is open to inspection at the Town Clerk's Office at Municipal Buildings, Wallace Green, Berwick-upon-Tweed.
