#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 13th January, 1939, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £25,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 16th January, 1939, to Saturday, the 21st January, 1939, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

### COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

#### THE SHROPSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 31 of the Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore, the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section 1 of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 31st day of December, 1938, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

### SCHEDULE.

The Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

I. Clause 51 shall have effect as if for sub-clauses (3) and (4) thereof there were substituted the following sub-clauses, that is to say:—

“(3) The Board shall before the 1st day of January in each year make any revision of the annual supply basic tonnage of each coal mine required on the ground that—

(a) the Owner has persistently failed to supply such quantities of coal as the Selling Committee direct, or has persistently requested the Selling Committee not to direct supply; or

(b) the demand for any class of coal has increased relatively to the demand for other classes; or

(c) the productive capacity of the coal mine is diminishing; or

(d) a scheme of development has been undertaken by the Owner by reason of which an additional tonnage of coal may be expected to be available for supply to the Board:

Provided that in making any revision under paragraph (b) of this sub-clause, the Board shall have regard to the extent to which the demand for the class of coal could have been met from the coal mines of other Owners, and in making any revision under paragraph (d) of this sub-clause the Board shall also have regard to the interests of the other Owners.

(4) The annual supply basic tonnages determined by the Board under the last preceding sub-clause or awarded upon arbitration as hereinafter provided shall come into operation on the 1st day of January in each year and shall, subject to the provisions of the next following Clause, remain in force without revision until the 1st day of January next following.”

*Work No. 2.*—A conduit or line of pipes commencing in the said Work No. 1 proceeding into through and under Byeway Lane aforesaid thence through and under enclosures numbered 551 and 550 into under and along Slayley Lane thence into and under enclosure numbered 549 on the Ordnance Map before referred to and terminating by a junction with an existing water main of the Council at Bonsall Dale, Bonsall aforesaid.
