TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 3rd February, 1939, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £20,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th February, 1939, to Saturday, the 11th February, 1939, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

COUNTY OF WILTS.

THE CORONERS (AMENDMENTS) ACT, 1926.

Order for the alteration of the division of the County into Coroners' Districts.

Whereas it is provided by section 12 of the Coroners' (Amendment) Act, 1926, that a County Council may submit at any time after complying with such requirements as to notice and consideration of objections as may be prescribed, to the Secretary of State, a draft Order providing for such alteration of any existing division of the County into Coroners' Districts as appears to them to be suitable, and that the Secretary of State after taking into consideration any objections to the draft made in the prescribed manner and within the prescribed time, may make the Order, either in the form of the draft submitted to him, or with such modifications as he thinks fit:

And whereas the County of Wilts is at present divided into two Coroners' Districts, namely, the North and South Coroner's Districts and the Devizes Coroner's District:

And whereas the County Council consider it suitable that the County should no longer be divided into Coroners' Districts and have in pursuance of section 12 of the said recited Act submitted a draft Order to the Secretary of State:

And whereas the requirements of the Coroners (Orders as to Districts) Rules, 1927, made under section 12 of the said recited Act have been complied with:

Now therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the said recited Act, I hereby order that the North and South Coroner's District and the Devizes Coroner's District of the said County shall cease to exist and that the County shall no longer be divided into Coroners' Districts.

This Order shall come into operation on the first day of February, 1939.

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, the Metropolitan Police Office, and the Electricity Commission, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as Established Typists for the purpose of this Clause although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. There will be no age limits in the case of candidates who are serving on the first day of the examination as Established Typists or Established Clerk-Typists; but candidates who have only temporary service or service in the Trinity House, Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, the Metropolitan Police Office, or the Electricity Commission, or service of two or more of these kinds, must not have attained the age of 40 on the first day of the examination.

- (1) Shorthand.
- (2) English.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Shorthand and in the aggregate of the two subjects.

To empower the Company to purchase and take by agreement from the respective gas undertakings of the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the Corporation of Stoke-on-Trent in the County of Stafford and of the Stone Gas Light and Coke Company Limited whose registered office is at the Gas Works, Stone, in the County of Stafford, a supply of gas in bulk and for such purpose to lay mains and break up streets within and without the limits of supply.

8. To define the share capital and borrowing powers of the Company and to make provision for the application of capital money.

15. To empower the Company in certain circumstances to apply additional profits for the benefit of the holders of share capital of the Company or in appropriation to a reserve fund, and for the benefit of all or some of the employees of the Company, and to make provision for determining from time to time the amount (if any) of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

16. To make provision in regard to the formation by the Company of a reserve fund, a special purposes fund and a renewal fund, and to make provision for the appropriation of the existing General Reserve of the Company.

17. To make provision in regard to the reading of meter indices and to limit the charges which the Company may make for the hire of prepayment meters and fittings to be used therewith.

18. To authorise the Company on the lands hereinafter described to maintain, erect, alter, improve and renew gas works with all necessary machinery and apparatus and to do all such acts as may be proper for making and storing gas and for supplying gas within the

limits of supply, and to work up and convert the residual products of gas. The lands above referred to are:—

23. To empower the Company to require consumers to carry out repairs to any piping, appliance or fitting which is in a dangerous condition, to discontinue the supply of gas in default of such repairs and to enable the Company to make charges for special readings of meters.

24. To make provision as to the authentication and service of notices by the Company and the form and service of notices to the Company for the discontinuance of a supply of gas.

25. To provide that the Company shall pay interest on sums deposited as security.

26. To make provision as to the recovery summarily of sums due for fittings and as to the recovery of penalties, and of other sums due to the Company and to provide for the inclusion of several sums in one summons.

27. To make provision as to arbitrations and for the costs and expenses of the intended Order and for a copy thereof to be registered.

To transfer to and vest in the Council the undertaking of the Ferndale Gas Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as "the Company") upon such terms as may be specified in the Order and to confirm and sanction an agreement entered into between the Company and the Council relating to such transfer and to make such further provision incidental to and consequent on such transfer and vesting as may be contained in the Order.

3.
