“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty by Your Order in Council may be graciously pleased to sanction the proposals for the pay and other conditions of service for men, late of the Royal Air Force, who are entered into the Royal Navy, and for the institution of Machinery Allowance for Air Artificer ratings as set out in the accompanying schedule.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in the above proposals.

" Machinery Allowance. Payable to 1s. per Chief and other Air Artificers when diem." employed as the senior Air Artificer rating in a squadron.

CONTROL OF TRADE BY SEA ORDER, 1939.
