At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 17th day of *April*, 1940.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of April, 1940 (N.6277/40), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas the Regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service provide for the enrolment of Motor Mechanics in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve but no such provision exists for their entry into the Royal Navy:

“And whereas recruitment into the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve ceased on mobilisation and we have found it expedient to enter Motor Mechanics in the Royal Navy on engagements until the end of the period of the present emergency:

“And whereas we consider that such Motor Mechanics who have attained the age of 21 shall receive the same rates of pay as those prescribed by Order in Council of 3rd November, 1927, for corresponding ratings of the

Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve when mobilised or under training and that, while under the age or 21, they shall receive 5s. 7d. a day:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the establishment of the titles and rates of pay set forth in the annexed schedule for ratings who have entered, or may enter, the Royal Navy as Motor Mechanics during the present emergency.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of April, 1940 (N5834/1940), in the words following, viz. :—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council :

“And whereas by Order in Council dated the 8th August, 1917, sanction is given to payment of Climate Allowance at the following rates during the period 1st April to the 30th September of each year to Officers and Men employed in the tropical region of the West Coast of Africa, viz. :—

- 3s. a day to Commissioned Officers,
- 1s. a day to Warrant Officers,
- 6d. a day to the rest of the Ship's Company :

“And whereas since the commencement of hostilities the personnel of Ships based on Freetown have been subject to much discomfort from heat and reduced ventilation due to war conditions :

“And whereas we are of opinion that these conditions of additional discomfort justify payment of Climate Allowance continuously in this locality :

“And whereas the discomforts inseparable from service on shore are similar so far as Ratings are concerned to those experienced on board Your Majesty's Ships employed on the West Coast of Africa :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, with retrospective effect from the 1st January, 1940, and for the duration of the War, payment of Climate Pay as follows:—

“Throughout the year to Commissioned Officers, Warrant Officers and Naval ratings serving in Ships employed on the West Coast of Africa when within 15 degrees North and 15 degrees South of the Equator and when within 50 miles of the Coast.

“Throughout the year to Ratings serving on shore at Sierra Leone.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
