TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th July, 1940, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Acts, 1939 and 1940, to the amount of £65,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd July, 1940; to Saturday, the 27th July, 1940, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 12 noon) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the undermentioned awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Pilot Officer Andrew Woodrow DUNN (41685).

Pilot Officer Charles James Drogo MONTAGU (41863).

Pilot Officer Leslie Walter James WATT (76929), R.A.F. Volunteer Reserve.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

568997 Sergeant Joseph Mitchell DAWSON.

581475 Acting Sergeant Bernard Leonard SAVILL.

These officers and airmen were the crew of an aircraft, piloted by Pilot Officer Dunn, and detailed to carry out a bombing attack on the Ruhr one night in June, 1940. After being subjected to heavy anti-aircraft fire for some fifteen minutes, during which their aircraft was repeatedly hit, they were attacked by a Messerschmitt 109. The first attack disabled the inter-communication gear and also wounded the air observer, Sergeant Savill, and the wireless operator, Sergeant Dawson. The rear gunner, Pilot Officer Watt, was unable to warn the captain of the enemy fighter's second attack but, by quick reaction and skill in aiming, he delivered a good burst of fire at short range which destroyed the enemy. During this second attack, however, one engine was disabled. Despite these difficulties the target was successfully bombed before a course was set for home. For three and a half hours the aircraft, flying on one engine, steadily lost height until the North Sea was crossed at only 400 feet. During this time, the navigation was ably carried out by Sergeant Savill, despite the pain from his wound, while Sergeant Dawson, operating his wireless apparatus, secured a number of essential homing bearings, thus materially assisting in assuring the safety of the crew. Pilot Officer Montagu, who was the second pilot, made necessary preparations for abandoning the aircraft and his personal example of coolness and efficiency was of the greatest assistance to his captain. Pilot Officer Dunn displayed resolution, courage and determination in piloting his badly damaged aircraft, but was forced to land in the sea close to the south coast. This crew showed the greatest determination, courage and gallantry throughout the operation.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Frederick Laurence PEARCE, D.S.O. (09078).

Towards the end of June, 1940, Wing Commander Pearce led a formation of aircraft in an attack on a new enemy aerodrome. As a result of his careful planning combined with initiative and leadership, the raid was a complete success and very severe damage was done. Previously, this officer led a formation of aircraft in an attack on enemy warships in Trondheim and, in the face of intense opposition from anti-aircraft fire and enemy fighters, scored three direct hits on two enemy cruisers.

Awarded the Distinguished Flying Medal.

550412 Sergeant George Anthony GAMBLE.

In June, 1940, this airman was air-gunner in a section leader's aircraft engaged in a photographic reconnaissance over France during which heavy anti-aircraft fire was encountered. On the return flight across the Channel the section was attacked by a formation of Heinkel 113's. Sergeant Gamble, although wounded in both legs, returned the enemy's fire and reported the tactics of the attacking Heinkels until the inter-communication gear was shattered. Previously in May,

1940, when attacked by enemy fighters, Sergeant Gamble's accurate reporting, coupled with steady fire, enabled the pilot to take successful evasive action and the enemy fighter eventually broke off the engagement apparently on fire.

580237 Sergeant Frank WILLIAMSON.

This non-commissioned officer was navigator and bomb aimer in the leading aircraft of a formation of nine, which made a successful attack on an enemy aerodrome one night in June, 1940. It was primarily due to Sergeant Williamson's devotion to duty, and his excellent navigation and map reading that the target was located quickly and successfully bombed. He has taken part in fifty-six operational flights over the sea and enemy territory, and was navigator of the squadron commander's aircraft on five successful bombing raids against enemy ships and territory.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934).

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Kettering Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Kettering Company"), whose address is 40, High Street, Kettering, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following (amongst other) purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Kettering Company to purchase the undertaking (hereinafter referred

3. To make provision as to the consideration for such purchase and sale and as to the debts and liabilities of and moneys due or accruing due to the Burton Latimer Company.

4. To provide for the creation of consolidated ordinary stock of the Kettering Company for the purpose of such purchase and sale and the issue of such stock and the payment of a sum of money to the liquidator of the Burton Latimer Company as part of such consideration and to define the rights, privileges and liabilities of the holders of such stock.

5. To provide for the retention by the said liquidator out of the funds of the Burton Latimer Company of a sum representing a dividend on the shares of that Company in respect of the period between the last period for which dividends were paid by the Burton Latimer Company prior to the date of transfer and the date of transfer of the Burton Latimer undertaking.

6. To make provision as to the compensation to be paid by the Kettering Company to the directors and auditors of the Burton Latimer Company.

7. To authorise the Kettering Company to continue, maintain and use any gas mains, pipes and works transferred to or vested in them under the intended Order and to apply to such mains, pipes and works the provisions of the intended Order and of the Acts incorporated therewith and of the Kettering Gas Acts and Orders, 1891 to 1935, and to repeal the proviso to subsection (1) of section 4 of the Kettering Gas Order, 1935 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order of 1935").

8. To make temporary provisions with respect to the price and method of charge for gas supplied by the Kettering Company in the urban district of Burton Latimer and the parish of Isham in the rural district of Wellingborough from the gasworks forming part of the Burton Latimer undertaking and with respect to the exemption of the Kettering Company from liability for a deficiency in the calorific value of the gas so supplied and with respect to the calculation of the authorised rates in respect of the ordinary share capital of the Kettering Company.

9. To empower the Kettering Company to maintain, erect, alter, improve and renew, gasworks with all necessary machinery and apparatus and to make and store gas and to work up and convert residual products upon the land hereinafter described and to purchase and use material required to work up and convert residual products.

The said land is:—

A piece of land situate in the parish of Isham in the rural district of Wellingborough

and county of Northampton containing 4 acres or thereabouts bounded on the east by the River Ise or Ise Brook on the north-west in part by the Station Road leading from Burton Latimer to the Kettering and Isham main road and in other part by the foot of the embankment carrying the said Station Road and on the west by certain strips of land held on yearly tenancies granted by the London Midland and Scottish Railway Company or their predecessors in title and lying between the western side of the said piece of land and the London Midland and Scottish Railway main line.

10. To empower the Kettering Company to let on lease lands for the time being belonging to them and not required for the purposes of their undertaking.

11. To authorise the Kettering Company to raise additional capital by the creation and issue of further amounts of consolidated ordinary stock or preference stock or wholly or partly by one or more of those modes respectively and to raise additional moneys by borrowing on mortgage or by the creation and issue of debenture stock or by either of those means; to define or make provisions as to the rights, privileges and liabilities of the holders of the additional capital and of mortgages and debenture stock of the Kettering Company.

12. To empower the Kettering Company to substitute a card or other index for the shareholders' address book or the portion of the register of shareholders kept in lieu thereof.

13. To amend the provisions contained in Sections 75, 76 and 77 of the Order of 1935 relating to the establishment of superannuation and profit sharing schemes of the Kettering Company so as to permit directors of the Kettering Company in certain cases to become members or participate in the benefits of those schemes or either of them; to make provisions as to the notice to be given by directors of the Kettering Company pursuant to section 55 of the Order of 1935 of their interest in contracts with the Kettering Company; and to amend section 74 of the Order of 1935 so as to permit pensions or other payments to be made under that section to any managing director of the Kettering Company or his widow, family or dependants.

14. To repeal, alter or amend all or some of the provisions of the Kettering Gas Acts and Orders, 1891 to 1935, and any other Act or Order relating to the Kettering Company or their undertaking.

15. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or to amend in their application to the Kettering Company or to render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, the Companies' Clauses Act, 1863, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, and the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871.
