ACQUISITION OF SECURITIES.

TREASURY DIRECTIONS.

The Treasury, in pursuance of paragraph (2) of Regulation 1 of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, have, by the Acquisition of Securities (No. 3) Order, 1941, transferred to themselves certain securities as detailed in that Order.

In pursuance of paragraph (3) of the said Regulation, the Treasury hereby give the following directions to the owners of securities so transferred.

1. The documents of title relating to the securities shall (except as mentioned in paragraph 3 below) be delivered forthwith to the Bank of England, London, or to one of the Receiving Banks mentioned in paragraph 6,

for transmission to the Bank of England and shall be accompanied by:—

(i) Form S.1(B) or S.2 as appropriate, issued by the Bank of England in relation to the securities, and

(ii) the documents prescribed in paragraph 2.

Such delivery should be made through a bank or stockbroker in the United Kingdom, but may be made directly to the Securities Registration Office, the Bank of England, London, or to one of the said Receiving Banks.

2.—(a) Bonds in respect of which interest is represented by coupons, shall be accompanied by all relative coupons maturing on or after the 20th day of April, 1941.

(b) Bonds registered as to principal and interest, or as to principal only, and certificates in respect of registered shares or stock shall be accompanied by a form of transfer or power of attorney (either endorsed on the back of the document of title or in a separate form) duly signed by the registered holder or holders: signatures shall be witnessed and shall also be confirmed by a bank or stockbroker. Transfers and powers of attorney shall not be dated and the names of the transferees and attorneys shall not be inserted therein.

3.—(a) Where the documents of title are held at the United Kingdom Security Deposit, Montreal, delivery shall be effected by the delivery of such documents to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York. Such delivery shall be effected by the owner procuring the bank or stockbroker through whom the documents of title were delivered to the Bank of England for

transmission to the United Kingdom Security Deposit to complete as requisite the prescribed Form P.8.

(b) In other cases where documents of title are held outside the United Kingdom delivery may be effected, together with the required documents, to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, as agents for the Bank of England. Holders desiring to avail themselves of this facility should, before giving the necessary instructions, apply to the Bank of England, London, or to one of the said Receiving Banks, on the appropriate form, for a Deposit Voucher, and lodge with the application the appropriate Form S.1(B) or S.2 referred to in paragraph 1 (i). The Deposit Vouchers should be forwarded to the custodian of the documents of title and should accompany such documents when delivery is made, or alternatively, if the holder transmits instructions to the custodian of the documents of title by telegraph, the identification number shown on the Deposit Voucher must be advised to the custodian, who must make reference to this identification number when the documents of title are delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York.

4. Payment shall be made after delivery of the requisite documents, complete and in order, has been made to the Bank of England, or (where the documents of title are delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York) after advice has been received by the Bank of England from the Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, that the requisite documents of title complete and in order have been delivered to them. Such payment shall be made:—

(a) On the 3rd June, 1941, where on or before the 25th April, 1941, either the documents of title are so delivered to the Bank of England or (if such documents are held by the United Kingdom Security Deposit) Form P.8 is so lodged with the Bank of England.

(b) On the 3rd June, 1941, or seven days after receipt of advice from The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, of due delivery (whichever is the later), where the documents of title are delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, or where such documents are held by the United Kingdom Security Deposit and Form P.8 is lodged with the Bank of England after the 25th April, 1941, with directions to give instructions for delivery by cable.

(c) In any other case, six weeks after delivery of documents of title or lodgment of Form P.8 as the case may be.

5. Payment shall be made by the Bank of England in London:—

(a) In the case of securities delivered to the Bank of England through a bank or stockbroker, to that Bank or Stockbroker.

(b) In the case of securities delivered directly to the Bank of England, to the person by whom the documents were delivered.

(c) In the case of securities delivered to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, to the person through whom the application for a Deposit Voucher was lodged.

(d) In the case of securities the documents of title to which are held by the United Kingdom Security Deposit, Montreal, to the bank or stockbroker through whom instructions for delivery to The Agency, Bank of Montreal, New York, are received.

6. The Bank of Ireland, Belfast, and any branch in the Isle of Man of Barclays Bank Limited, Lloyds Bank Limited, Martins Bank Limited or Westminster Bank Limited, shall be Receiving Banks for the purposes of this Direction.

#### NOTIFICATION REGARDING TERRITORY IN ENEMY OCCUPATION.

His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice, in amplification of his notifications of the 8th September, 1939, 1st January, 12th April, 20th May, 31st May and 10th July, 1940, and 15th February, 5th March and 8th April last, published in the Gazettes of the 12th September, 1939, 2nd January, 16th April, 21st May, 4th June and 12th July, 1940, and the 18th February, 7th March and 11th April last respectively, that the following must be regarded as territory in enemy occupation:—

The Kingdom of Yugoslavia.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by the Workmen's Compensation and Benefit (Byssinosis) Act, 1940, he has made two Schemes, one to provide for the payment of compensation and the other for the payment of disablement benefit in the case of male workmen who have died from, or become totally and permanently incapacitated for work as the result of, the respiratory disease known as byssinosis. The Schemes which may be cited respectively as the Byssinosis (Workmen's Compensation) Scheme, 1941, and the Byssinosis (Benefit) Scheme, 1941, come into force on 1st May, 1941.

SCHEDULE.

The Midland (Amalgamated) District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall have effect as if—

(A) in sub-clause (a) of Clause 11 thereof after the words "Central Scheme" the following words were added:—" (other than under the provisions of clause XVA thereof) ";

(B) the following new sub-clause were inserted in Clause 11 thereof:—

(e) (i) The monies (hereinafter called 'War Emergency Assistance Contributions') required from time to time for paying any contribution payable to the Central Council under the provisions of Clause XVA of the Central Scheme, shall be fixed from time to time by Resolution of the Executive Board.

(ii) All such War Emergency Assistance Contributions shall be subscribed and paid by the coalowners to the Trustees, rateably and in proportion to the disposal of all the coalowners during any month commencing on 1st January, 1941.

(iii) The provisions of sub-clause (c) of this Clause, mutatis mutandis, shall apply to War Emergency Assistance Contributions.

(iv) For the purpose of the payment of War Emergency Assistance Contributions, the disposal of each coalowner during each month, commencing as aforesaid, shall be ascertained and communicated by each coalowner to the Secretary, in the case of the months of January and February, 1941, forthwith, and in the case of each month thereafter not later than the fifth day of the next succeeding month. The Executive Board shall have power from time to time to fix the rate of War Emergency Assistance Contribution per ton, and to apply the same to the disposal of each coalowner during any month. The amounts of the several War Emergency

Assistance Contributions shall be certified in writing by the Executive Board to the Trustees, who shall demand the same from the several coalowners with all possible despatch. All such War Emergency Assistance Contributions shall be paid by the respective coalowners to the Trustees in relation to the months of January and February, 1941, forthwith and in relation to each month thereafter on or before the 15th day of the month in which the demand is made.

(v) In this sub-clause, 'disposal' in relation to a coal mine means the tonnage in saleable coal raised and weighed at the pithead at that coal mine, after deducting all coal to be used for the purpose of working the coal mine and all coal to be supplied free or at reduced rates for the use of persons who are or have been employed in or about the mine, and the dependents of persons who have been so employed."

(C) In Clause 12 thereof:—

(a) After the word "under" in line 1 the following words were added:— "paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (d) of";

(b) after the words "Central Scheme" in (b) the following words were added:— "(not being payable under the provisions of Clause XVA thereof)"; and

(c) the following words were added at the end thereof "The War Emergency Assistance Contributions collected by the Trustees shall be applied only in payment of contributions payable under sub-clause (2) of Clause XVA of the Central Scheme."

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

*Distinguished Service Order.*

Acting Wing Commander Samuel Charles ELWORTHY, D.F.C., A.F.C. (36056). No. 82 Squadron.

In March, 1941, this officer was detailed to carry out an attack on enemy shipping off Le Havre. Sighting two enemy tankers of approximately 3,000 tons, escorted by flak ships, he proceeded to attack one of the tankers from a low altitude and, in spite of heavy and accurate anti-aircraft fire from the flak ships, scored a direct hit which set the tanker on fire. On another occasion whilst returning from a successful attack against an enemy dump near Flushing aerodrome he was attacked by two Messerschmitt 109's, but though his rear gunner was wounded, he managed by skilful flying to throw off the enemy fighters and return safely to base. Bv



his magnificent leadership and complete disregard of danger, Wing Commander Elworthy has brought his squadron to the highest pitch of war efficiency.

*Distinguished Flying Cross.*

Flight Lieutenant Sidney John MONROE (37685), No. 82 Squadron.

In April, 1941, this officer was detailed to carry out an attack on enemy shipping off the Frisian Islands. In spite of bad visibility he succeeded in locating a 3,000 tons ship escorted by flak ships. In spite of accurate fire from the flak ships, he scored direct hits from a low level and the ship was last seen down by the stern. During this attack a shell burst in the cockpit, killing the observer and wounding Flight Lieutenant Monroe in the ankle. In spite of this wound, he brought his aircraft safely back to base. This officer has displayed great gallantry and devotion to duty and has at all times shown determination in pressing home his attacks.

Pilot Officer Gordon Alfred DENBY (80812), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 600 Squadron.

One night in February, 1941, whilst on patrol this officer sighted a Heinkel III flying across his bows and by determined and accurate attacks he shot it down. Previously, he has attacked and probably destroyed two other hostile aircraft at night. Pilot Officer Denby has taken part in numerous operational night flights, often in bad weather, and his zeal and initiative in these duties have been an inspiration to all.

Pilot Officer Ian Radnor STEPHENS (81915), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 38 Squadron.

One night in March, 1941, this officer was detailed to attack a large concentration of enemy aircraft on the aerodrome of El Machina. Owing to ground mist, the location of the aerodrome was very difficult to find and, after searching for two hours, Pilot Officer Stephens had to descend to 500 feet before identifying the target. He pressed home his attacks from a height of 1,000 feet in spite of heavy anti-aircraft and machine-gun fire, and destroyed five enemy aircraft and damaged others. This officer displayed great courage and set a magnificent example of leadership and devotion to duty.

*Distinguished Flying Medal.*

626651 Sergeant Leslie Herbert Cyril GAYFER No. 82 Squadron.

In April, 1941, Sergeant Gayfer was the air gunner of an aircraft engaged in daylight operations in the vicinity of Flushing. Whilst returning from the target area at a height of 2,000 feet, the aircraft was intercepted and attacked by a Messerschmitt 109. The enemy fighter made repeated attacks during which Sergeant Gayfer was wounded, and his aircraft hit several times. In spite of his wounds and damage to his gun turret, he continued to use his gun with such determination and accuracy that the enemy was forced to break off the engagement. This airman, during his 34 operational sorties, has continuously displayed great courage and devotion to duty.

742902 Sergeant Robert Leslie SMITH, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 82 Squadron.

In March, 1941, Sergeant Smith was detailed to search and attack enemy shipping off Le Havre. Having sighted two large tankers he carried out a determined attack from 200 feet, in spite of intense anti-aircraft fire from the escorting flak ships. He succeeded in scoring two direct hits on one of the tankers which set it on fire. Although his starboard engine was badly damaged he successfully brought his aircraft back to base. Sergeant Smith has carried out 37 operational sorties and has displayed great courage and determination under all conditions.

SPECIAL ENACTMENTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1940.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Guildford (hereinafter called the Corporation) on the twenty-seventh day of September, 1938, resolved to construct a main outfall sewer for the Burpham district of the Borough;

And whereas by sub-section 1 of section 50 of the Guildford Corporation Act, 1938 (hereinafter called the local Act) it is provided that certain expenses incurred by the Corporation shall upon the resolution becoming operative be apportioned to frontagers;

And whereas sub-section 2 of section 50 of the local Act sets out the procedure by which the resolution becomes operative, which procedure the Corporation duly carried out;

And whereas by sub-section 9 of section 50 of the local Act it is provided that if the said sewer is not completed within two years from the date upon which the resolution became operative all liabilities of frontagers consequent thereon shall cease to have effect;

And whereas the aforementioned resolution became operative on the first day of July, 1939;

And whereas the Corporation have applied to the Minister of Health for an Order under the Special Enactments (Extension of Time) Act, 1940, to extend to the first day of July, 1942 (or some earlier date), the period limited by sub-section 9 of section 50 of the local Act;

And whereas it is proposed that an Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;
