ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Bar to Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Squadron Leader John ELLIS, D.F.C. (37850), No. 610 Squadron.

This officer has commanded the squadron since July, 1940, and his personal example and tremendous energy have been mainly responsible for the high state of operational efficiency. The squadron has destroyed at least 89 hostile aircraft, 11 of which have been shot down by Squadron Leader Ellis.

Pilot Officer Richard Playne STEVENS, D.F.C. (87639), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 151 Squadron.

This officer has done particularly outstanding work with his squadron on night operations and has on three occasions shot down two enemy aircraft in one night. Pilot Officer Stevens shows a great determination to attack the enemy and is prepared to fly under the most difficult weather conditions. His courage, determination, thoroughness and skill have set an excellent example to his unit.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Wallace Hart KYLE (26141), No. 139 Squadron.

In April, 1941, this officer led an attack against Ijmuiden Iron and Steel Works. In spite of intense anti-aircraft fire and interference from a patrol of Messerschmitt 109's, he dropped his bombs on the target from a height of 50 feet. The enemy fighters followed Wing Commander Kyle out to sea, but, by his skilful flying, he forced them to break off the attack. The operation was an outstanding success. He has now completed a number of successful operational missions and his resolute determination and leadership have been largely responsible for the high standard of efficiency in his squadron.

Acting Flying Officer William Davenport BROWN (N.Z.40732), Royal New Zealand Air Force, No. 75 (New Zealand) Squadron.

One night in March, 1941, this officer as rear gunner of an aircraft which was returning from a bombing mission, sighted a Messerschmitt 110 below his aircraft. In spite of the bad visibility he was able to keep the enemy aircraft in sight. After a few minutes he climbed to the attack but by excellent judgment and marksmanship, Flying Officer Brown fired three short bursts and the enemy fighter was seen to dive straight into the sea. On a previous occasion when he identified an approaching aircraft as hostile, his instructions to the captain enabled him to manœuvre his aircraft so as to avoid the enemy. Flying Officer Brown then used his fire to drive off the enemy aircraft which left in a damaged condition.

Pilot Officer William Michael DIXON (86390), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 99 Squadron.

One night in April, 1941, this officer took part in a raid on enemy warships at Brest. Locating his target by the light of his own

flare, he put his aircraft into a steep dive and at 1,000 feet released his bombs which were seen to straddle one of the warships. Pilot Officer Dixon continued his dive to 50 feet and as he flattened out across the harbour, he suddenly encountered intense fire from the multiple guns of another warship lying across his course. He successfully machine-gunned this ship. This officer has shown the most praiseworthy courage and determination and is an exceptional pilot and captain of aircraft.

Pilot Officer George Eric FOWLER (86427), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 75 (New Zealand) Squadron.

Pilot Officer Oliver Rayner MATHESON (84010), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 75 (New Zealand) Squadron.

One night in April, 1941, Pilot Officers Matheson and Fowler were captain and navigator respectively of an aircraft detailed to attack a target in Berlin. On the first run anti-aircraft fire inflicted severe damage on the aircraft causing it to lose height. Nevertheless, Pilot Officer Matheson regained height and, guided by Pilot Officer Fowler made a second run over the target, which was successfully bombed. Previously both officers had been concerned in a successful attack on Kiel. Pilot Officer Matheson and Pilot Officer Fowler have completed numerous operational missions and both have displayed persistent devotion to duty, great courage and outstanding skill.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

620298 Sergeant Bertram Ernest DYE, No. 219 Squadron.

This airman has performed excellent work throughout the numerous day and night operational flights in which he has participated. He has assisted in the destruction of at least three enemy aircraft, and has displayed great keenness and enthusiasm.

1365020 Sergeant Stanley James FAIRWEATHER, No. 151 Squadron.

One night in April, 1941, this airman was the air gunner of an aircraft which attacked an enemy raider over this country. By his skilful use of the turret and his accurate shooting, he damaged the enemy aircraft and finally shot it down in flames. The following night he destroyed another hostile aircraft. He has displayed great keenness and determination.

742055 Sergeant Thomas MCPHEE, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 139 Squadron.

In April, 1941, this pilot was detailed to participate in an attack on a target at Ijmuiden. In spite of intense anti-aircraft opposition which forced his leader to take violent evasive action, Sergeant McPhee kept close company with his leader so that both were successful in bombing the target from a height of only 50 feet. On leaving the target area, Sergeant McPhee was attacked by enemy fighters who followed him for a considerable distance across the North Sea. Although his aircraft was damaged, he succeeded in flying back to his base and landing safely. Sergeant McPhee has carried out numerous operational missions and has displayed great courage and determination throughout.
