The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of the George Medal to:—

205448 Sergeant Geoffrey Henry Ellis, Royal Australian Air Force.

This airman was the observer in a Wirraway aircraft which crashed and burst into flames when the pilot failed to make a successful forced landing necessitated by engine failure. The flames enveloped the whole of the fuselage. Sergeant Ellis escaped with a dislocated shoulder, abrasions to his face and arms and slight burns, but the pilot was trapped. In spite of his injuries, Sergeant Ellis re-entered the flaming aircraft, released the pilot and assisted him to escape. This most courageous act did not unfortunately save the pilot's life and the additional severe burns which Sergeant Ellis sustained almost proved fatal.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Bar to the Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Wing Commander Douglas Robert Stewart BADER, D.S.O., D.F.C. (26151).

This officer has led his wing on a series of consistently successful sorties over enemy territory during the past three months. His high qualities of leadership and courage have been an inspiration to all. Wing Commander Bader has destroyed 15 hostile aircraft.

Bar to the Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flight Lieutenant Gordon Learmonth RAPHAEL, D.F.C. (37508), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 85 Squadron.

This officer has proved himself to be a relentless and skilful night fighter pilot. Since May, 1941, he has destroyed three and probably another of the enemy's aircraft.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Allan Richard WRIGHT, D.F.C. (33499), No. 92 Squadron.

This officer has been continually engaged in operational flying since May, 1940. He has led his flight and sometimes his squadron with great skill and determination. Flight Lieutenant Wright has destroyed at least nine enemy aircraft. On one occasion he flew his damaged aircraft back from France making a successful landing despite extreme difficulties. His keenness and devotion to duty have been outstanding.

Flying Officer Anthony Philip DOTTRIDGE, D.F.C. (41909), No. 219 Squadron.

This officer has proved himself to be an outstanding night fighter pilot as well as an efficient and courageous flight commander. He has destroyed at least two enemy aircraft at night.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Wing Commander Frederick Snowden STAPLETON (36059), No. 54 Squadron.

This officer has led his squadron on almost every operational flight during its recent activities over enemy territory, in which the squadron has destroyed at least twelve enemy aircraft. Two of these were destroyed by Wing Commander Stapleton himself. He has always displayed the utmost enthusiasm to seek out and destroy the enemy and has undoubtedly contributed materially to the successes obtained.

Acting Squadron Leader Kenneth HOLDEN (90705), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 610 Squadron.

This officer has consistently led his flight with skill and courage in action against the enemy. He has destroyed three and damaged a further four hostile aircraft.

Flight Lieutenant Lewis George BURNAND (37847), Reserve of Air Force Officers, No. 208 Squadron.

This officer has carried out numerous tactical and artillery reconnaissances in

Egypt, Libya and Greece. Since December, 1940, he has flown alone on 62 of these missions over or well behind the enemy's lines, often subjected to intense fire from the ground defences. During the operations in Greece, his work was carried out under extremely difficult conditions. Flight Lieutenant Burnand has displayed great skill and keenness which, combined with his untiring efforts have contributed materially to the high standard of morale and efficiency of his flight.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Robert Davidson GRASSICK (41579), No. 242 Squadron.

This officer has been a member of the squadron since its formation. He has displayed an indomitable spirit and has proved himself to be a first-class section leader. Flight Lieutenant Grassick has destroyed at least six enemy aircraft.

Flying Officer Everard Francis John CHARLES (36198), No. 54 Squadron.

This officer has displayed exceptional zeal and immense enthusiasm during the many offensive sweeps carried out by his unit. He has destroyed at least three enemy aircraft.

Flying Officer Thomas Draper WILLIAMS (90658), Auxiliary Air Force, No. 611 Squadron.

This officer has participated in numerous operational flights over the English Channel and over France during which he has destroyed at least three enemy aircraft and damaged others. In June, 1941, he shot down a Messerschmitt 109 when it was attempting to attack one of our bombers which had been damaged by anti-aircraft fire. He then escorted the bomber, flying at sea level, until the English Coast was reached. Flying Officer Williams has displayed great keenness and courage and has set an excellent example.

Acting Flying Officer Graham Baptie BLACKLOCK, D.F.M. (44874), No. 7 Squadron.

In June, 1941, this officer was the captain of an aircraft which participated in a daylight operation over Bremen. In the vicinity of the target area, nine enemy fighters attacked one of our aircraft. In the ensuing engagement, Flying Officer Blacklock skillfully manoeuvred his aircraft and enabled his gunners to ward off many attacks during which they destroyed one and probably a further two of the attacking aircraft. Later, when one of our aircraft which had been severely damaged was forced to alight on the water, Flying Officer Blacklock, despite the absence of cloud cover, refused to leave the vicinity until it was evident that he could be of no further assistance. This officer has recently taken part in three daylight operations over enemy country. He has displayed excellent leadership, great courage and devotion to duty.

Pilot Officer Arthur ASHWORTH (43699) No. 75 (New Zealand) Squadron.

One night in June, 1941, this officer was the pilot of an aircraft which carried out an attack on the Scharnhorst at Brest. Although the target was obscured, Pilot Officer

Ashworth flew over the area for a considerable time finally dropping flares immediately north and south of the target, which enabled him to see and attack his objective. He also aimed one bomb at an unidentified vessel of 10,000 tons which was observed to be entering the docks. This operation necessitated Pilot Officer Ashworth remaining over the area for one and a quarter hours, making eight surveying runs, at times at an extremely low altitude and in the face of intense anti-aircraft fire. Since February, 1941, this officer has participated in twenty operational missions. He has displayed outstanding skill, courage and infinite care in his efforts to bomb his objectives accurately.

Pilot Officer Trevor Sidney WADE (78984), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 92 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great skill and determination in his numerous engagements against the enemy and has destroyed at least six of their aircraft. His efforts have contributed materially to the successes achieved by the squadron.

Pilot Officer Frank Geoffrey WOOLLEY, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 244 Squadron.

In May, 1941, one of our aircraft crashed during an attack on an armoured train in enemy territory. In spite of difficult ground, Pilot Officer Woolley landed his aircraft beside the wreckage and picked up the injured pilot and airman. Enemy forces, who had detrained, came towards his aircraft but Pilot Officer Woolley took off over the bad ground with the injured crew and flew safely back to his base. By his prompt and gallant action, Pilot Officer Woolley undoubtedly prevented these airmen from falling into the hands of the enemy and enabled the pilot to receive the medical attention he so urgently needed.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Acting Flying Officer James Whiteford MURRAY, D.F.M. (84977), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 35 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

1377718 Sergeant Luther MARTIN, No. 35 Squadron.

One night in June, 1941, Flying Officer Murray and Sergeant Martin were the captain and rear gunner respectively of an aircraft detailed to carry out a bombing mission over Hanover. On the outward journey, the aircraft was suddenly engaged by an enemy fighter, which opened fire with cannon and machine guns causing severe damage to the aircraft and the rear gun turret. Nevertheless Sergeant Martin, who was wounded in the head and arm, continued to engage the enemy finally causing him to break off the attack. The aircraft was last observed diving steeply away. With great skill, Flying Officer Murray flew his severely damaged aircraft back to this country, after dropping his bombs on an enemy objective, making a successful landing at an aerodrome without injury to the crew. Flying Officer Murray displayed great airmanship, while Sergeant Martin showed great fortitude in very difficult circumstances.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

566025 Flight Sergeant Alexander GORDON,
No. 84 Squadron. (Since reported missing.)
816134 Sergeant George FURNEY, Auxiliary Air
Force, No. 84 Squadron. (Since reported
missing.)

Flight Sergeant Gordon and Sergeant
Furney have flown together as pilot and
wireless operator air gunner respectively on
numerous operational flights. In October,
when carrying out an attack at Tobruk, their
aircraft was attacked by enemy fighters. The
engine was disabled but the attackers were
beaten off and Gordon successfully force
landed in the desert. On another occasion
Gordon and Furney participated in an attack
on Kucove oil wells. Harassed by enemy
fighters, Furney fought back fiercely until he
received a severe head wound. Despite
damage to the aircraft Gordon skilfully flew
it some 200 miles back to his base. In
March, 1941, Gordon, accompanied by
Furney, carried out an attack on the Italian
Fleet off Cape Matapan. In spite of intense
anti-aircraft fire Gordon descended to 4,000
feet and scored two direct hits on a cruiser
causing it to slow down, and compelling other
vessels to stand by. By their success in this
operation, Gordon and Furney helped to bring
the Italian Fleet to action. Both these air-
men have displayed great skill and deter-
mination in accomplishing their allotted tasks.

This airman has displayed excellent skill

Provided always that the amounts payable to the Incumbents in

respect of the sums specified in the second column of the said Schedule shall be taken and received by the several Incumbents to whom the same are hereby made respectively payable in substitution for and not as additional to any grants which instruments heretofore sealed by us have purported to charge permanently on the capitular revenues of Manchester other than by way of relief to our Common Fund under the 13th Section of the Act firstly hereinbefore recited. Provided also that every sum specified in the fifth column of the said Schedule shall be payable only upon the production to us on or after the 1st day of August, the 1st day of November, the 1st day of February, and the 1st day of May now next ensuing, of a certificate under the hand of the Bishop of Manchester that with his licence or permission an Assistant Curate has been employed within the Parish during the quarter of the year then ended and that such Assistant Curate is in receipt of a stipend after a rate of not less than £120 per annum.
