PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 12th June, 1941, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Heacham, in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas we are satisfied that Septimus Gillatt of Number 70 Crediton Hill, London, N.W.6, Esquire, and the Royal Exchange

Assurance as the executors of the Will of the late Charles Edward Strachan of Heacham Hall, in the said county of Norfolk, Esquire, who died on the 24th day of January, 1929, and whose Will with two Codicils was proved in the Principal Probate Registry on the 5th day of March, 1929, are the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Septimus Gillatt and Royal Exchange Assurance desire to transfer the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Bishop of Norwich for the time being, and are consenting to this Scheme (in testimony whereof they have executed the same):

"And whereas we are satisfied that the transfer will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has executed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Heacham shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Bishop of Norwich for the time being."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Victoria Cross on the undermentioned officer in recognition of most conspicuous bravery:—

Acting Wing Commander Hughie Idwal EDWARDS, D.F.C. (39005), No. 105 Squadron.

Wing Commander Edwards, although handicapped by a physical disability resulting from a flying accident, has repeatedly displayed gallantry of the highest order in pressing home bombing attacks from very low heights against strongly defended objectives.

On 4th July, 1941, he led an important attack on the Port of Bremen, one of the most heavily defended towns in Germany. This attack had to be made in daylight and there were no clouds to afford concealment. During the approach to the German coast several enemy ships were sighted and Wing Commander Edwards knew that his aircraft would be reported and that the defences would be in a state of readiness. Undaunted by this misfortune he brought his formation 50 miles overland to the target, flying at a height of little more than 50 feet, passing under high-tension cables, carrying away telegraph wires and finally passing through a formidable balloon barrage. On reaching Bremen he was met with a hail of fire, all his aircraft being hit and four of them being destroyed. Nevertheless he made a most successful attack, and then with the greatest

skill and coolness withdrew the surviving aircraft without further loss.

Throughout the execution of this operation which he had planned personally with full knowledge of the risks entailed, Wing Commander Edwards displayed the highest possible standard of gallantry and determination.

ROYAL AIR FORCE.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the following awards in recognition of gallantry displayed in flying operations against the enemy:—

Bar to Distinguished Service Order.

Acting Wing Commander Adolph Gysbert MALAN, D.S.O., D.F.C. (37604).

This officer has displayed the greatest courage and disdain of the enemy whilst leading his wing on numerous recent operations over Northern France. His cool judgment, exceptional determination and ability have enabled him to increase his confirmed victories over enemy aircraft from 19 to 28, in addition to a further 20 damaged and probably destroyed. His record and behaviour have earned for him the greatest admiration and devotion of his comrades in the wing. Recently the wing has scored heavily against the enemy with 42 hostile aircraft destroyed, a further 15 probably destroyed and 11 damaged.

Distinguished Service Order.

Wing Commander Geoffrey FRANCIS, D.F.C. (16245), No. 230 Squadron.

During the evacuation from Greece, this officer directed the operations of two flying boat squadrons which evacuated some 700 British personnel and a number of Greek and Yugo-Slav personalities. He personally accomplished some noteworthy flights which, combined with his inspiring leadership, contributed largely to the success achieved. After Crete had been evacuated, Wing Commander Francis undertook a flight in an endeavour to establish contact with some British forces believed to be holding out in a certain locality there. This necessitated flying at night off unfamiliar coast. Nevertheless, Wing Commander Francis skilfully piloted his aircraft to within 5 miles of his objective where he was forced to alight on the water owing to the rough sea. He taxied towards the coast and, while a boat was being launched, the enemy opened fire with machine guns from short range. Wing Commander Francis subsequently took off and flew over the coast, making signals and dropping messages. Throughout this hazardous and difficult operation, he showed great courage, skill and determination.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Squadron Leader Roderick Harvey SPENCER (36058), No. 113 Squadron.

In June, 1941, this officer led his squadron in successive low flying attacks against a force of 100 enemy tanks which threatened our lines of communication. His determined leadership when attacking proved of great value to the ultimate success of the operations. Throughout the numerous missions in

which he has participated both in the Western Desert and in Greece, Squadron Leader Spencer has displayed outstanding skill and determination.

Flight Lieutenant Stanley Thomas MEARES (37683), No. 611 Squadron.

This officer has consistently displayed enthusiasm and skill when leading his flight or his squadron. He has carried out 28 operations over enemy territory during which he has destroyed two Messerschmitt 109F's and damaged two Messerschmitt 109's.

Acting Flight Lieutenant Hubert Raymond ALLEN (42582), No. 66 Squadron.

This officer has displayed great determination in combat and has destroyed at least six hostile aircraft. On a recent occasion, he encountered a formation of three enemy bombers escorted by five fighters. Flight Lieutenant Allen immediately attacked these aircraft; in company with another pilot, and succeeded in destroying one of the fighters.

Pilot Officer Wilfred George Gerald Duncan SMITH (85684), Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 611 Squadron.

This officer has participated in many operational flights over enemy territory and has always displayed the utmost keenness to engage the enemy. During recent operations, Pilot Officer Smith has destroyed at least three hostile aircraft.

Distinguished Flying Cross.

Flying Officer Robert Henry MOORE (40841), No. 11 Squadron.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

564750 Sergeant Thomas Francis MANLY, No. 11 Squadron.

In June, 1941, Flying Officer Moore and Sergeant Manly were pilot and navigator bomb aimer respectively of the leading aircraft of a formation of three detailed to attack enemy shipping in the harbour at Beirut. Owing to dense and low cloud the attack was carried out at an extremely low altitude in the face of intense and accurate anti-aircraft and machine gun fire. Before reaching the objective, the leader's aircraft was hit by a shell which caused considerable damage and injured Sergeant Manly in several places. Despite the handicap, by his skill and devotion to duty, the formation scored a direct hit on a large enemy merchant ship. Although suffering severely, Sergeant Manly displayed great resolution and successfully navigated the formation back to base where Flying Officer Moore skilfully landed his damaged aircraft without accident. Flying Officer Moore has completed 35 and Sergeant Manly 42 operational missions in which they both have shown exceptional keenness and devotion to duty.

Distinguished Flying Medal.

742733 Sergeant William MacMillan GILMOUR, Royal Air Force Volunteer Reserve, No. 611 Squadron.

This airman has displayed excellent qualities as a fighter pilot. During the recent intensive operations over enemy territory Sergeant Gilmour has destroyed three hostile aircraft. He has set an excellent example throughout.

Military Cross.

Flying Officer Arthur George CORK (43119).

In April, 1941, this officer was second in command of the squadron's outparty which embarked at Alexandria for Greece. During the voyage he was in charge of 4 Lewis gun positions manned by personnel of the squadron. On the outward journey the convoy, and his ship in particular, were attacked 3 times from the air before reaching Suda Bay and once again while in the bay. When returning to Alexandria, in convoy, a further 4 attacks were made. Throughout all these attacks, which were made either by dive bombing or torpedoes, Flying Officer Cork controlled and used his guns continuously, manning individual gun positions in turn himself, although in an exposed position on the upper deck. His splendid leadership inspired the gun crew to resist the enemy with vigour and accuracy.

(6) The constitution of the Lower Waveney Third Internal Drainage District and of a Drainage Board therefor.

(7) Certain matters supplemental to the above provisions.
